

## Volunteers Needed for Water Guardians Lake Horton Clean-Up Project

**Fayette County, Georgia, April 12, 2018** – The efforts continue! The Fayette County government is calling for local residents with kayaks and canoes to assist with cleaning our water reservoirs.

The Water Guardians, led by Commissioner Steve Brown, lake clean-up project will take place on **Saturday, April 28, 2018 from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. at Lake Horton at 1275 Antioch Road, Fayetteville, Georgia 30215.**

The county government will supply bottled water, trash bags and trash grabbers for picking up trash. Each

Water Guardians participants who have not previously received a 2018 group t-shirt can receive one for free at the Lake Horton event if **they sign-up by April 23, 2018.** For those who have already received the new orange 2018 t-shirt, please bring it to the clean-up event.

Lunch will be provided at the end of the event.

In accordance with lake rules, no one under age 14 is allowed to operate a kayak or canoe solo. All participants must have a life vest and everyone will be asked to sign a liability waiver in order to participate.

There is also a need for people without kayaks and canoes to pick-up trash on the banks and park grounds.
