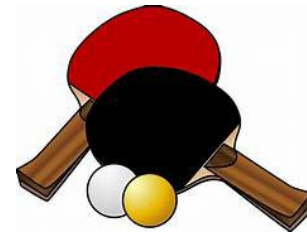

RALLY OBEDIENCE
