

TYRONE ROAD – PALMETTO ROAD

Summary of Comments

The public meeting open house for the Tyrone Road – Palmetto Road corridor study was held on March 18, 2019 from 4 pm to 7 pm at the Fayette County Public Library. The presentation of information was in conjunction with the other three corridors also being studied by Fayette County. Approximately a total of 200 people attended. Citizens were afforded different opportunities to share their input. Close to 350 individual comments were received.

From the compilation of the citizen feedback, the five most identified concern categories are:

1. Congestion
2. Roadway Improvements
3. Roundabouts
4. Traffic Calming
5. Speeding & 18 - Wheelers

Some of the comments are listed below:

1. Replace 4 way stop with roundabout at Tyrone Road and Flat Creek Road
2. Higher speed limit needed
3. Underground telephone line rather than poles on Tyrone Road
4. Connected pathways

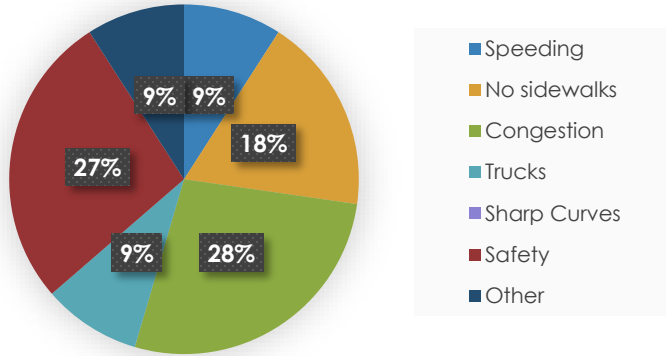

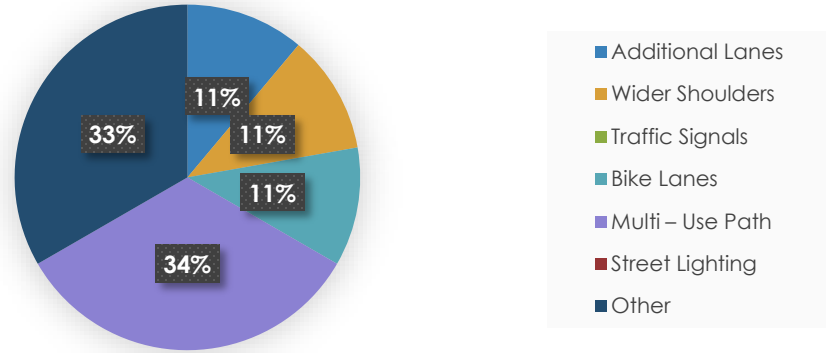
