- #10 Voter Assistant (if any)
- #11 Family member requesting a ballot for a physically disable or temporarily residing out of the county information (if any)
- #12 Mark the appropriate box if you are **ELDERLY OR DISABLED** - you will receive ALL ballots as allowed by law for the remaining of the current calendar year. If you don't select ELDERLY OR DISABLED: **YOU WOULD NEED TO RE-APPLY FOR THE NOVEMBER 2026 ELECTION.**
