Chief Hill,

Chief Pollard asked that I provide a value for the Medic truck that was taken out of service to be sold in auction. I've looked at a couple different internet sites and prices for comparable units are all over the spectrum. Depending on condition and location they are selling anywhere from the low \$6,000's up to \$10,000.

The following link is a unit similar to ours that sold mid-year 2021 for \$10,000 in Missouri.

The last units we sold in auction brought \$5,670 and \$6,470. That was in October of 2020. Supply and demand has changed a little since then so I would expect to get a little more with the current market, but that prediction could result in just the opposite... Obviously auction and private party values vary, but If I were going to put a for sale sign on the subject unit I would probably list it for \$10,000 and see where it went.

Fayette County Fire and EMS has solicited proposals for EMS billing services. After reviewing submitted proposals from 14 companies, the department has selected EMS Management and Consultants Inc. as the new EMS billing contractor. The new contract will see an immediate decrease of charges from 3.5% of net EMS revenue to 3.25% of net. The new contractor also has a stronger and broader reporting system and an easier user interface for operations. The Contractor also has significant experience in billing for Fire-Based and Government-Owned agencies.

Subject: Contract 2054-P: EMS Billing Services

The County has traditionally used the services of a third-party provider to process payments from citizens who use emergency medical services. The current provider is Ambulance Medical Billing Service/Medical Accounts Receivable Systems (AMB/MARS) of Credit Bureau Systems. The current payment rate to AMB/MARS for this service is 3.5% of net collections.

The Purchasing Department issued Request for Proposals (RFP) #2054-P to secure a third-party provider for EMS Billing Services. Notice of the opportunity was emailed to 51 companies. Another 712 were contacted through the web-based Georgia Procurement Registry, who had registered under commodity code #94610 (Accounting and Billing Services, including 3rd Party Reimbursement for Medicare, Medicaid, Private Insurance, etc.) and 94611 (Accounting Services). The offer was also advertised through Georgia Local Government Access Marketplace, Channel 23, the County website, and the Fayette County News.

14 Companies submitted proposals. An evaluation team, composed of staff from Fire & EMS and Finance, evaluated and scored the Technical Merit of the proposals using criteria specified in the RFP. The criteria included (1) Background, (2) EMS Billing Services, (3) Ability to meet schedule, (4) References, and (5) Unique features. Prices were then scored and added to the Technical Merit scores (Attachment 1).

As a result of the evaluation process, the evaluation committee recommends award of the contract to EMS Management & Consultants, Inc. A Contractor Performance Evaluation is not available since this is the first contract with EMS Management & Consultants. Fire & EMS checked their references and received unanimously favorable responses.

Upon execution of the proposed contract, EMS Management & Consultants will complete an analysis of Fayette County demographics, call typing and billing methodology to collect more per call. EMS Management & Consultants has existing connections into insurance company databases, as well as hospital record databases. It is expected that these connections combined with the analysis results will provide a stronger reporting and graphical analysis capability will have a positive impact on the public's perception of EMS Billing since the County will be able to adjudicate calls more quickly and increase the speed of payment to the County.

Looking at the most recent year full calendar year of available data (calendar year 2021), the proposed contract can be expected to result in immediate cost savings, as follows:

Call to Order

Chairman Lee Hearn called the March 10, 2022 Board of Commissioners meeting to order at 5:04 p.m. A quorum of the Board was present.

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance by Commissioner Eric Maxwell

Commissioner Eric Maxwell offered the Invocation and led the Board and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Acceptance of Agenda

Commissioner Oddo moved to accept the agenda as written. Vice Chairman Gibbons seconded. The motion passed 5-0.

PROCLAMATION/RECOGNITION:**1. Recognition of Addison Lester for eleven (11) years of service on the Fayette County Board of Elections.**

Elections Board Chairman Darryl Hicks recognized Addison Lester for eleven (11) years of service on the Fayette County Board of Elections. Chairman Hicks stated that, on behalf, of the Board of Elections, as well as a personal note, it was truly an honor to serve with Mr. Lester. Mr. Hicks continued that it was a blessing to have Mr. Lester as a friend and he was truly one of the most honorable people he had ever met in his life. Chairman Hicks stated that Mr. Lester was very straightforward and served the citizens of Fayette County to the best of his ability and with all objectivity. Board of Elections member Aaron Wright stated that he had served on the Board of Elections with Mr. Lester for the past six years and when he first started serving, they had to handle some controversial issues which Mr. Lester helped him through. Mr. Wright stated that over the year he had grown in his respect for Mr. Lester. He added that it was an honor to have had the opportunity to work with him and witness how he worked with staff and the public. Mr. Wright stated that he would always be grateful to Mr. Lester for the leadership showed and the example he set and was also proud to consider him a friend.

Chairman Hearn stated that years ago when he asked Mr. Lester about serving on the Board of Elections, Mr. Lester responded by asking what was involved. Chairman Hearn stated that at the time he honestly did not know what exact was involved, but knew the County needed "good" people serving. He continued that all he asked of Mr. Lester was to do a "good" job for the citizens of Fayette County. He added that because he knew Mr. Lester's character, he knew he would, despite being related to him. Chairman Hearn thanked Mr. Lester for weathering a few storms and serving the people of Fayette County.

Mr. Lester stated that over the 11 years he had served on the Board of Elections there were a few issues or storms he had to weather through. However, he felt they always handled each situation professionally and added that they came out of each

situation better than they were to begin with. Mr. Lester acknowledged that the Elections Board members did not always agree, nor did they always agree with some of the Commissioners, but they did always maintain a good working relationship and remained friends. Mr. Lester stated that he enjoyed his time serving but felt it was time to give someone else the opportunity to step up and serve.

- 5. Consideration of staff's request to add the ability for employees in the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan to invest in a Roth 'feature', in addition to existing pre-tax options.**

Fayette County Human Resources Director Lewis Patterson stated that this item was seeking Board approval to allow employees to invest in Roth funds within the defined contribution retirement plan. Mr. Patterson introduced Alice Davis with One Digital, the County's Defined Contribution Retirement Plan Broker.

Alice Davis stated that currently the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan only allowed employees to invest contributions into various funds on a pre-tax basis. She added that this new feature would allow County employees the access and flexibility to also invest in a Roth money type, which can provide additional tax savings. Ms. Davis stated that the County's match funds would remain pre-tax dollars. She added that there were no additional administrative costs to add this feature.

Chairman Hearn asked if an employee inherited some money, would they be able to invest those funds.

Ms. Davis stated that this feature was a contribution that could only be invested via a payroll deduction.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve the request to add the ability for employees in the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan to invest in a Roth 'feature', in addition to existing pre-tax options. Commissioner Oddo seconded.

Commissioner Maxwell asked how County employees would be notified about this new feature. He stated that it was a "no-brainer" and a good deal.

Mr. Patterson stated that an email blast would be sent out, Department Heads would also disseminate information regarding the change, and Empower would also conduct an email campaign.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve the request to add the ability for employees in the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan to invest in a Roth 'feature', in addition to existing pre-tax options. Commissioner Oddo seconded. The motion passed 5-0.

6. Consideration of staff's request to approve an amendment to the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, to allow distributions to participants who are ineligible employees and currently receive only supplemental compensation from the County.

Mr. Patterson stated that this item was a housekeeping issue to address a scenario that could not have been foreseen when the plan was established in 2009. He stated that currently there was an employee who was 100% on Fayette County payroll but had transitioned into a state funded position and was on state payroll, but was still receiving a supplement from the County as the agent of the Griffin Judicial Circuit. Mr. Patterson stated that although this employee could no longer contribute to the plan and even though the County was not contributing, because they were still receiving a W-2 from the County they were considered a County employee by the IRS and under the current defined contribution plan document they were ineligible to make a withdrawal from their account, leaving the employee in limbo. He stated that this plan amendment would allow in-service distributions for an additional class of employee who have had funds in the plan for at least two years and were currently ineligible to participate but received only supplemental compensation from the County. Mr. Patterson stated that this plan amendment could also be beneficial in the future as the current scenario could conceivably occur again with other employees, as long as Fayette County served as the payroll and administrative agent for the Griffin Judicial Circuit. He added that there was no additional cost to do this, only a minimum fee to process the amendment which would be processed with the previous item approved by the Board.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve request to approve an amendment to the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, to allow distributions to participants who are ineligible employees and currently receive only supplemental compensation from the County. Commissioner Oddo seconded.

Commissioner Rousseau asked how many people this affected.

Mr. Patterson stated currently only one, but it could occur again with other employees, as long as Fayette County serves as the payroll and administrative agent for the Griffin Judicial Circuit.

Commissioner Rousseau asked if the County should consider discontinuing acting as the payroll and administrative agent for the Griffin Judicial Circuit if this issue grows exponentially.

Mr. Patterson stated that he didn't feel it would grow exponentially.

Mr. Rapson added that this issue and these supplements were associated with the constitutional and elected officers of the court, primarily. So, this was only a finite group of individuals that could potentially be affected.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve request to approve an amendment to the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, to allow distributions to participants who are ineligible employees and currently receive only supplemental compensation from the County. Commissioner Oddo seconded. The motion passed 5-0.

7. Consideration of staff's recommendation to approve Contract #1229-P: Radio Communications Consultant Change Order #2: Expanded Scope Support.

911 Director Katye Vogt stated that Mission Critical Partners, Inc. served as subject matter experts in acquisition of the upgraded radio system. She stated that the implementation and project support portion of the contract was calculated based on the unusual complexity and uncertainty of this type of project. She added that as implementation moved forward it was determined that additional effort would be required to address issues that were discovered during this critical phase of the project. Since initial funding allocated for this portion of the project was depleted, change order #2 was needed to cover these expanded costs.

Mr. Rapson stated that when the change order was approved in 2019 it was estimated that the project was 12-14 months away from completion. He added that since then they had experienced issues with cell towers. Mr. Rapson continued stating that recently equipment installation was halted at the Mud Bridge Road cell tower location because an osprey nest was discovered. As a protected species no work could be completed until after nesting season ended in August. He stated that the reason the

project was taking longer to complete had nothing to do with Mission Critical Partners, Inc. but because unforeseen technical issues outside of their control, but still required their expertise. He reiterated that there were two items before the Board; one for the \$75K that would true-up the cost through the completion of the project, as of today and the second was for \$50K to be used after the project was completed serving as a retainer for Mission Critical Partners, Inc. to assist with any technical issues.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve Contract #1229-P: Radio Communications Consultant Change Order #2: Expanded Scope Support. Commissioner Oddo seconded. The motion passed 5-0.

8. Consideration of staff's recommendation to approve Contract #1229-P: Radio Communications Consultant Change Order #3: General Consulting and Long-Term System Support.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve Contract #1229-P: Radio Communications Consultant Change Order #3: General Consulting and Long-Term System Support. Commissioner Oddo seconded. The motion passed 5-0.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORTS:

Mr. Rapson advised that an updated "Hot Projects" list was sent out via email to the Board with the status of various projects throughout the county.

ATTORNEY'S REPORTS: None.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS:

Commissioner Rousseau

Commissioner Rousseau acknowledged Fayette County's Communications Training Officer Kourtney Rose for her professionalism and valor in the efficiency of a recent emergency call with a citizen in need. He stated her response not only spoke to her ability but also to her training and the leadership of 911. He commended 911 Director Vogt for a job well done.

Commissioner Rousseau also extended his condolence to a family in Fayette County who lost their 16-year-old son over the weekend due to a senseless act of violence, while visiting the Atlanta Fair.

Vice Chairman Gibbons

Vice Chairman Gibbons also extended his condolences to the local family of the victim of the recent tragedy in Atlanta.

Vice Chairman Gibbon announced that he qualified earlier that afternoon to run for re-election as County Commissioner of District 3. He thanked the residents of District 3 who voted for him and those throughout the county that supported him during his time in office. He added that if he was graced with the opportunity to serve another four years on the citizens behalf, he would be grateful, at which time he would step down and find a successor. He concluded by thanking and his fellow Board members as well as his former colleague Randy Ogino who he previously served with. He added that he looked forward to working with them all should he be re-elected.

Commissioner Oddo

Commissioner Oddo expressed his condolences to the local family who tragically lost their son.

He congratulated Vice Chairman Hearn on qualifying.

Commissioner Oddo also recognized Fayette County Clerk Tameca Smith on her recent news article in the Fayette County News. He stated that he was very proud to know her and appreciated the article helping him get to know her a little better.

Chairman Hearn

Chairman Hearn stated that on March 9th he attended the Transportation and Air Quality Committee Meeting in Atlanta as well as the Atlanta Regional Committee Board Meeting. He stated that he had the opportunity to speak with the new City of Atlanta Mayor. He added that at the Atlanta Regional Committee Board Meeting they introduced the new Executive Director of the Board

and he had the opportunity to say goodbye to Doug Hooker who had served as Executive Director for 11 years and did an outstanding job. He stated that the two main items discussed that may interest Fayette County was that the ARC was conducting a regional safety study on the roads. And they also discussed a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) amendment.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: None.

ADJOURNMENT:

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to adjourn the March 10, 2022 Board of Commissioners meeting. Commissioner Oddo seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.

Background/History/Details:

In 2017, Fayette County submitted a grant application to the Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) to evaluate SR 279 and the possible alignment of SR 279 with Corinth Road along SR 85. The study was funded and completed in 2019. It recommended the realignment project and the findings were used to submit a second grant application for full design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction of the project. The application was partially funded, with \$256,029 awarded for development of a Concept Report.

Per Federal Requirements, Fayette County went through a qualifications-based procurement process. The evaluation committee recommended award to Practical Design Partners (PDP), LLC. County staff and PDP then developed the first Task Order (TO) for the project and negotiated fees, following the GDOT Plan Development Process.

The schedule for completion of TO #1 is 12 months. Deliverables include establishment of roadway design criteria, collection and assessment of traffic and crash data, environmental screening, and development of three concepts with cost estimates. Results of TO #1 will be used to finalize the Concept Report and, subsequently, complete all stages of design. The total cost for design is approximately \$1,000,000. Fayette County submitted a third grant application (for full funding of design) in the fall of 2021.

Capital Improvement Project #17TAD provides funds for realignment of State Route 279 at Corinth Road. SPLOST funds were budgeted to provide local match for federal Surface Transportation Block Grant funds that are available through the State of Georgia.

The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) requires counties to use a multi-step solicitation process to select an engineering firm:

- Phase I: The county issues a Request for Qualifications (RFQ). All interested parties are invited to submit a Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) if they are pre-qualified through GDOT. The Evaluation Team reviews and scores responding firms' qualifications.
- Phase II: The top scoring firms from Phase I are short-listed and invited to submit a proposal. The Evaluation Team scores the proposals. Phase I and II scores are added together, and the short-listed firms are ranked.
- This contract is defined as a "multi-phase project specific" type of contract. There is no overall contract maximum price; rather, task orders will be issued, each with its own not-to-exceed or other price, as appropriate. The first task order must be awarded and issued with the contract.
- It is anticipated that additional task orders will be issued. They will have to go through the same scoping meetings, fee negotiations, and award process as the first task order.

The Purchasing Department issued RFQ #1981-Q to seek a pre-qualified firm to provide engineering services for the project. The Department contacted 2,246 vendors through the Internet-based Georgia Procurement Registry. In compliance with Federal requirements for use of grant funds, 25 firms were contacted who had registered on the U.S. Small Business Administration's database.

Invitations were extended via the Fayette News, the county website, Georgia Local Government Access Marketplace (www.glga.org), Greater Georgia Black Chamber of Commerce, and Channel 23.

Nine companies submitted SOQ's (attached).

The Evaluation Committee, composed of members from Public Works and Environmental Management Departments, scored the SOQ's. Five firms were short-listed, and invited to submit proposals. All five responded; however, the courier dropped off Heath & Lineback Engineers' proposal at the City of Atlanta instead of Fayette County, causing it to miss the deadline and be disqualified.

The Evaluation Committee scored the remaining four short-listed firms' proposals. Phase I and Phase II scores were combined, with Practical Design Partners, LLC achieving the top score.

This is Practical Design Partners' first contract with the county, so a Contractor Performance Evaluation is not available. References were contacted, and all gave high recommendations.

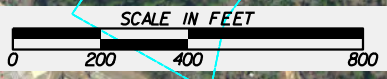

CONTRACT ITEM AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this _____, by and between the Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of Georgia, hereinafter called the DEPARTMENT, first party, and Fayette County, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, hereinafter called the LOCAL AGENCY, second party;

WITNESS that:

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT proposes under the above numbered project to reconstruct State Route 85 from State Route 279 in Fayette County to County Road 820/Roberts Drive in Clayton County, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, due to the construction of this project, it will become necessary to make certain adjustments or additional installation of utility facilities of the LOCAL AGENCY, the cost of which shall be determined in accordance with Articles 8, 9, & 10 below; and

WHEREAS, the LOCAL AGENCY has requested that the DEPARTMENT include the adjustment or installation of water facilities in its highway construction contract as shown on the attached plans; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement being for the sole purpose of providing a contractor for work performed on the LOCAL AGENCY'S water facilities, the LOCAL AGENCY shall bear the cost of said work to be determined as hereinafter set forth;

WHEREAS, the preliminary engineering, including preparation of detailed plans and contract estimate for adjustment of the utilities described above have been accomplished by the LOCAL AGENCY;

WHEREAS, the plans for the utility work have been approved by both the DEPARTMENT and the LOCAL AGENCY prior to commencing work;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants of the parties hereinafter set forth, it is agreed:

1. All construction engineering and contract supervision shall be the responsibility of the DEPARTMENT and the DEPARTMENT shall be responsible to assure that all utility work is accomplished in accordance with plans and specifications and to consult with the LOCAL AGENCY or LOCAL AGENCY'S Consultant before authorizing any changes or deviations which affect the LOCAL AGENCY'S facility.

CONTRACT ITEM AGREEMENT

2. The LOCAL AGENCY or the LOCAL AGENCY'S Consultant shall have the right to visit and inspect the work at any time and advise the DEPARTMENT'S Engineer of any observed discrepancies or potential problems. The DEPARTMENT agrees to notify the LOCAL AGENCY when all utility work is completed and ready for final inspection by the LOCAL AGENCY.

3. It is specifically understood that the project number shown above is for the DEPARTMENT'S identification purposes only and may be subject to change by the DEPARTMENT. In the event it becomes necessary for the DEPARTMENT to assign a different project number, the DEPARTMENT shall notify the LOCAL AGENCY of the new project designation. Such change in project designation shall have no effect whatsoever on any of the other terms of this Agreement.

4. The DEPARTMENT shall include in its contract for this project all work necessary to accomplish the adjustment of the LOCAL AGENCY'S facilities as shown on the highway plans along with the necessary specifications to assure that the work conforms to sound construction practices.

5. In the event it becomes necessary to add pay items that are not provided for in the contract, the DEPARTMENT shall negotiate prices with the contractor and enter into a supplemental agreement with the contractor for completion of the additional items. Upon notification, the LOCAL AGENCY shall furnish a check for the additional cost as determined in Article 8 below.

6. The DEPARTMENT shall furnish on the project the construction engineering inspection and testing by its own forces required to assure that the work is done in accordance with the plans, specifications and Special Provisions.

7. Upon completion of the work and upon certification by the DEPARTMENT'S engineers that the work has been completed in accordance with the aforesaid plans and specifications, the LOCAL AGENCY shall accept the adjusted and additional facilities and shall thereafter operate and maintain the adjusted and additional facilities without further cost to the DEPARTMENT or its contractor. Such maintenance and all operations and activities shall be subject to the DEPARTMENT'S rules, policies and procedures as contained in its Utility Accommodation Policy and Standards, current edition.

8. The DEPARTMENT shall include in its highway contract those items shown as "materials" for permanent installation on the aforesaid plans. The price bid for the appropriate items shall include all labor, materials and incidentals necessary to complete the work. The cost of the requested work shall be determined from unit quantities and unit prices as shown in the DEPARTMENT'S tabulation of bids. The approximate non-binding pre-let estimate, including betterment, is **\$125,906.42** based on the LOCAL AGENCY'S estimate attached hereto of which the Department shall bear **\$0.00 or 0% and the LOCAL AGENCY shall bear \$125,906.42 or 100% out of which \$67,442.59 are In-kind costs and \$58,463.83 are Betterment costs.**

CONTRACT ITEM AGREEMENT

9. It is mutually agreed that as soon as practicable after the opening of bids and acceptance of a bid by the DEPARTMENT, the DEPARTMENT shall notify the LOCAL AGENCY in writing of the amount due the DEPARTMENT. The LOCAL AGENCY shall pay to the DEPARTMENT the amount due within sixty (60) days.

10. It is further mutually agreed that the final cost of the work performed on behalf of the LOCAL AGENCY shall be determined by measurement of the actual quantities of installed materials, including added items under Article 5, multiplied by the actual bid prices. Accordingly, after the project has been completed, the DEPARTMENT shall determine the final cost to be borne by the LOCAL AGENCY and, as the case may be, shall refund to the LOCAL AGENCY or shall request of the LOCAL AGENCY an additional payment in the amount of the difference between the final cost to be borne by the LOCAL AGENCY and the amount which the LOCAL AGENCY has previously paid to the DEPARTMENT. In the event additional payment is due to the DEPARTMENT, the LOCAL AGENCY agrees to pay same within sixty (60) days after the statement is received from the DEPARTMENT. In the event a refund is due the LOCAL AGENCY, the DEPARTMENT agrees to pay the LOCAL AGENCY within sixty (60) after the refund amount is determined or final acceptance is made by the DEPARTMENT.

11. The covenants herein contained shall, except as otherwise provided, accrue to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

12. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Sec. 50-5-85, LOCAL AGENCY hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in, and agrees that for the duration of this contract, it will not engage in a boycott of Israel.

13. It is mutually agreed between the parties hereto that this document shall be deemed to have been executed in the Fulton County, Georgia, and that all questions of interpretation and construction shall be governed by the laws of the State of Georgia.

14. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same Agreement. The parties shall be entitled to sign and transmit an electronic signature of this Agreement (whether by facsimile, PDF or other email transmission), which signature shall be binding on the party whose name is contained therein. Any party providing an electronic signature agrees to promptly execute and deliver to the other parties an original signed Agreement upon request.

Background/History/Details:

The Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) law, O.C.G.A. 48-8-89, requires counties and qualified cities receiving general-purpose LOST revenue to renegotiate distribution agreements within two (2) years of each decennial census and submit the new distribution certificate to be received by the Department of Revenue (DOR), no later than December 30, 2022. As such, qualified cities and counties must begin renegotiation of the distribution agreements on or before July 1, 2022.

It is the responsibility of the county governing authority to initiate the renegotiation process on behalf of all eligible parties. Letters initiating the renegotiation process were sent to qualified cities in Fayette County - Peachtree City, City of Fayetteville, Town of Brooks, and the Town of Tyrone on February 11, 2022. The renegotiation meeting took place on February 24, 2022 at 4:00 pm in the Commission Chambers.

The revised Certificate of Distributions were sent to the qualified cities for their consideration and approval. Those revised and approved Certificate of Distributions will be submitted to the State Revenue Commissioner to complete this process.
