### RESOLUTION LEVYING COUNTY TAX FOR YEAR 2025 No. 2025 - 08

Upon motion duly made and unanimously passed, it is hereby ordered by the Board of Commissioners of Fayette County, Georgia, duly convened this 23rd day of October 2025, that upon \$3,929,626,269 the value of all property taxable for County purposes in Fayette County, Georgia, as appears upon the digest thereof, and upon all other taxable property in unincorporated Fayette County, Georgia, there be levied and collected for County general maintenance and operations purposes as set forth in the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, Section 48-5-220, and as hereinafter amended and as otherwise authorized by law, a tax, ad valorem, for the year 2025, for all such purposes of \$3.763 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting a tax levy for County general maintenance and operations purposes of 3.763 mills.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously passed, it is hereby 23rd day of October 2025, that upon \$6,578,723,643 the value of all property taxable for County purposes in Fayette County, Georgia, as appears upon the digest thereof, and upon all other taxable property in incorporated Fayette County, Georgia, there be levied and collected for County general maintenance and operation purposes, as set forth in the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, Section 48-5-220, as hereinafter amended and as otherwise authorized by law, ad valorem, for the year 2025, at the aggregated rate for all such purposes to be levied as follows:

- 1. All property located within the City of Fayetteville will be assessed at \$3.763 per \$1000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting an ad valorem tax levy for County general maintenance and operations purposes in Fayetteville of 3.763 mills;
- 2. All property located within the City of Peachtree City will be assessed at \$3.763 per \$1000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting an ad valorem tax levy for County general maintenance and operations purposes in Peachtree City of 3.763 mills;
- 3. All property located within the Town of Tyrone will be assessed at \$3.763 per \$1000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting an ad valorem tax levy for County general maintenance and operations purposes in Tyrone of 3.763 mills;
- 4. All property located within the Town of Brooks will be assessed at \$3.763 per \$1000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting an ad valorem tax levy for County general maintenance and operations purposes in Brooks of 3.763 mills;
- 5. All property located within the Town of Woolsey will be assessed at \$3.763 per \$1000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting an ad valorem tax levy for County general maintenance and operations purposes in Woolsey of 3.763 mills.

In accordance with provisions within the Constitution of the State of Georgia and the Official Code or Georgia, Fayette County has created a special tax district for the purpose of providing Fire Protection Services to its citizens, said special tax district encompassing all of Fayette County with the exception of that portion of Fayette County which constitutes the City of Peachtree City and the City of Fayetteville. Upon \$4,683,929,117 the value of all property taxable within the Special Fire District, as appears on the digest thereof, there shall be levied and collected a tax of \$2.82 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting a total tax levy for the Special Fire Tax District of 2.82 mills.

In accordance with provisions within Constitution of the State of Georgia and the Official Code of Georgia, Fayette County has created a special tax district for the purpose of providing Emergency Medical Services to its citizens, said special tax district encompassing all of Fayette County with exception of that portion of Fayette County which constitutes the City of Peachtree City. Upon \$6,476,820,090 the value of all property taxable within the Special EMS Tax District, as appears upon the digest thereof, there shall be levied and collected a tax of \$1.000 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting a total tax levy for the Special EMS Tax District of 1.000 mills.

In accordance with provisions within the Constitution of the State of Georgia and the Official Code of Georgia, Fayette County has created a special tax district for the purpose of providing 911 Communication Services to its citizens, said tax district encompassing all of Fayette County. Upon \$10,508,349,912 the value of all property within the Special 911 Tax District, as appears upon the digest thereof, there shall be levied and collected a tax of \$0.210 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting a total tax levy of the Special 911 Tax District of 0.210 mills.

Upon recommendation of the Fayette County Board of Education, it is ordered that upon \$7,546,445,547 the value of all property taxable for educational purposes in Fayette County as appears upon the digest thereof, and upon all other property in Fayette County, both real and personal, there be levied a tax, ad valorem, for the year 2025, for educational purposes in the amount of \$19.60 per \$1,000.00 of the assessed valuation on the digest as aforesaid, constituting a total tax levy for educational purposes of 19.600 mills.

It is further ordered that upon \$9,016,452,223 the value of all taxable property in said County as appears upon the digest thereof, computed by deducting only the special homestead exemption for certain persons 65 years of age and over, and upon all other taxable property in said County, both real and personal, there be levied and collected a tax, ad valorem, for the year 2025, for the purpose of providing a sinking fund for retiring bonded indebtedness and discharging interest thereof, of the Fayette County School District, in the amount of \$0.000 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, constituting a total tax levy of 0.000 mills.

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It is hereby ordered by the Board of Commissioners of Fayette County, Georgia, this 23rd day of October 2025, that all taxes, as described and as levied by the adoption of this Resolution, shall be due and collected by the Tax Commissioner of Fayette County, by the close of the business day on January 15, 2026.

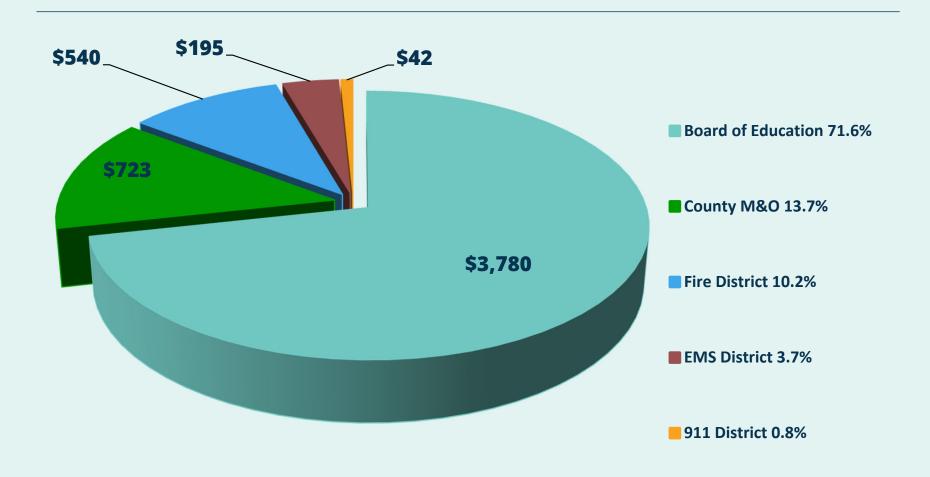

## Property Tax Rates – General Fund, Fire, EMS, and 911 2016-2025

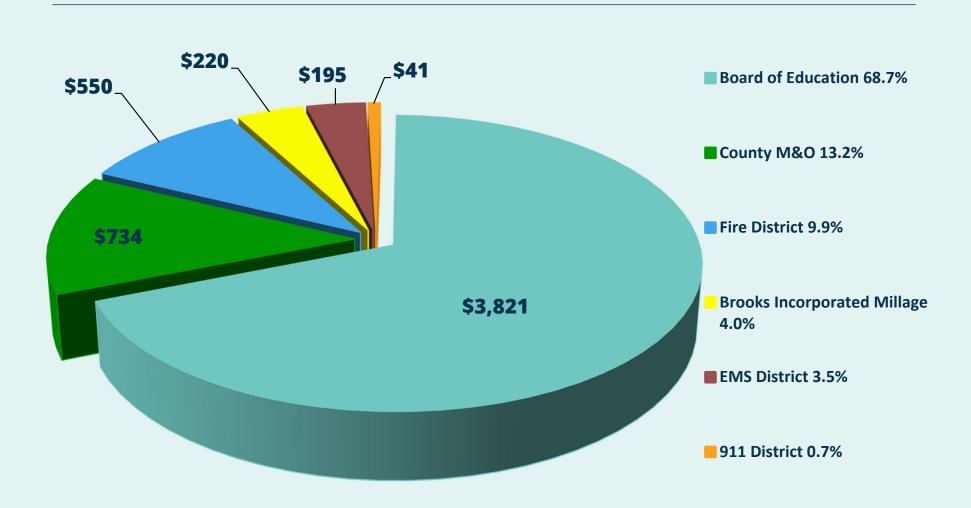


## 2025 Unincorporated Residential 24 of 370 Property Tax Paid \$500,000 home value / \$5,280 tax bill

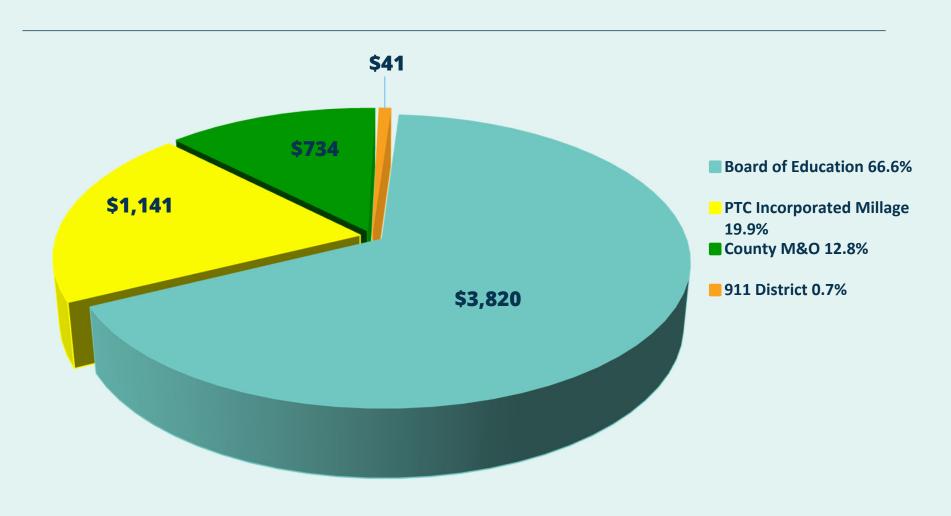

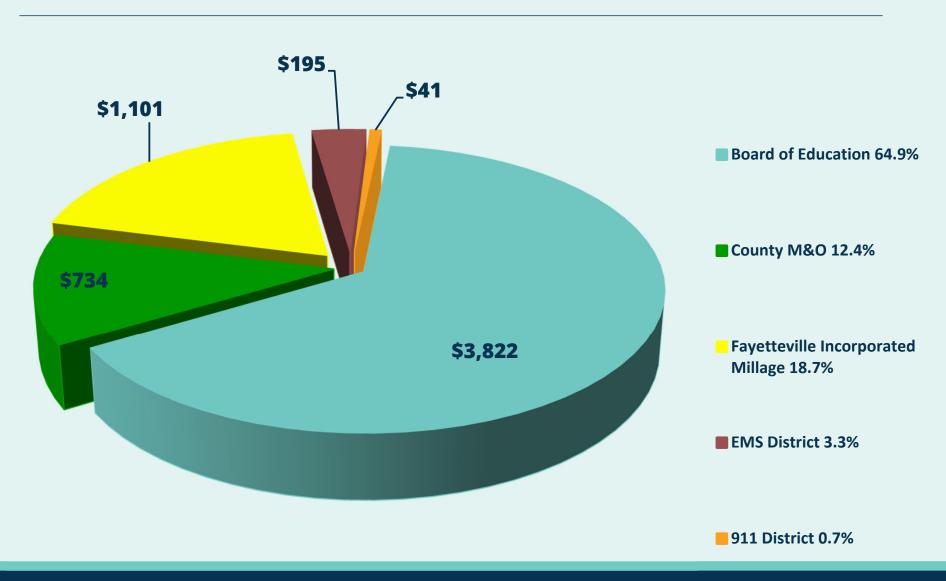
## 2025 Town of Brooks Residential 25 of 370 Property Tax Paid \$500,000 home value / \$5,561 tax bill



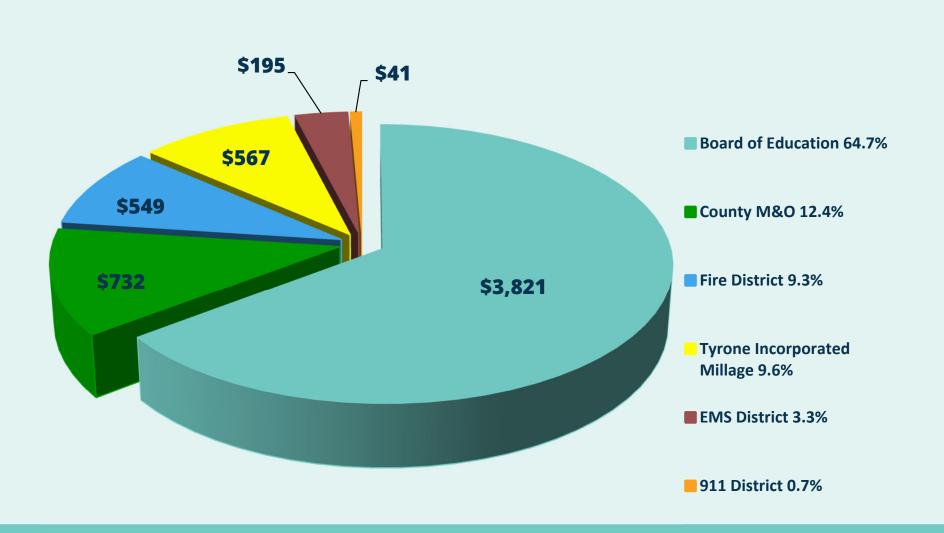

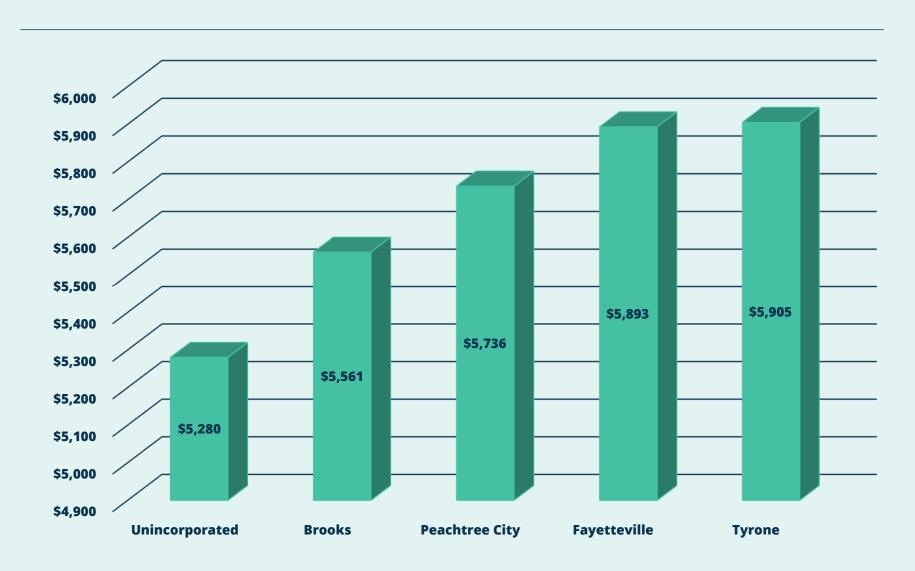

### **APPLICANT'S INTENT**

Applicant proposes to rezone 4.19 acres from A-R (Agricultural-Residential) to O-I (Office-Institutional) for the purposes of future office development.

### **PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION**

On October , 2025, the Planning Commission voted 5-0 to recommend **APPROVAL** of Petition #1367-25, requesting to rezone from A-R to O-I.

### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

As defined in the Fayette County Comprehensive Plan, Office-Institutional Use is designated for this area, so the request for O-I zoning is appropriate. Based on the Investigation and Staff Analysis, Planning & Zoning Staff recommends **APPROVAL** of the request for a zoning of O-I, Office-Institutional District.

#### **INVESTIGATION**

- **A. GENERAL PROPERTY INFORMATION**: The property is a legal lot of record based on the ordinance criteria. This property is located in the SR 54 West Overlay Zone, Sec. 110-173(2).
- **B. REZONING HISTORY:** There is no record of a prior rezoning.
- **C. CURRENT DEVELOPMENT HISTORY:** The property is currently vacant land.
- **B. SURROUNDING ZONING AND USES**: The subject property is bounded by the following adjacent zoning districts and uses:

## C. COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

**Future Land Use Plan:** The subject property lies within an area designated for Low Density Residential and, by virtue of its location on the SR 54 West Corridor, it is also eligible for Office-Institutional uses. The Land Use Element of the Fayette County Comprehensive Plan specifies that the SR 54 West Overlay District may be considered for Office-Institutional and Residential Zoning Districts:

**Nonresidential Recommendations:** The nonresidential intent of the SR 54 West Overlay District is to allow office and low intensity business uses. Outside of the commercial designation at Tyrone Road consideration for the Office-Institutional Zoning District may be given. It is recommended that a Special Development District be created for SR 54 West to allow and regulate expanded uses in the Office-Institutional zoning district only on SR 54 West. Conditions should be placed on property at the time of rezoning to address unique situations.

This request **DOES CONFORM** to the Fayette County Comprehensive Plan.

## D. ZONING/REGULATORY REVIEW

**Access & Right-of Way**: The property has existing access on SR 54 W; access will be under the jurisdiction of Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT).

**Site Plan:** The applicant submitted a survey and a concept plan for the property.

## Sec. 110-300. - Standards for map amendment (rezoning) evaluation.

All proposed map amendments shall be evaluated with special emphasis being placed on the relationship of the proposal to the land use plan and related development policies of the county The following factors shall be considered by the planning and zoning department, the planning commission and the board of commissioners when reviewing a request for rezoning:

- (1) Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the land use plan and policies contained therein;
- (2) Whether the zoning proposal will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property;
- (3) Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing or planned streets, utilities, or schools;
- (4) Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use and development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal.

#### **STAFF ANALYSIS**

- 1. The subject property lies within an area designated for Office-Institutional Uses. This request does conform to the Fayette County Comprehensive Plan in terms of the use.
- The area around the subject property is an area that already has various office and
  residential zoning and uses. There are some residential uses to the south and east, but staff
  does not anticipate that an office use within this area will have an adverse impact on the
  adjacent parcels.
- 3. It is staff's opinion that the zoning proposal will not have an excessive or burdensome impact on streets, utilities, or schools.
- 4. The proposal is consistent in character and use with the surrounding uses as Office-Institutional.

#### **ZONING DISTRICT STANDARDS**

## Sec. 110-142. O-I, Office-Institutional District.

- (a) *Description of district*. This district is composed of certain lands and structures having office and institutional uses which are compatible with or provide a transition into low-intensity land uses.
- (b) *Permitted principal uses and structures.* The following permitted uses shall be allowed in the O-I zoning district:
  - (1) Office;
  - (2) Art gallery;
  - (3) Bank and/or financial institution;
  - (4) Banquet hall/event facility;
  - (5) College and/or university, including classrooms and/or administration only;
  - (6) Educational/instructional/tutorial facilities, including, but not limited to: academic, art, computer, dance, driving and/or DUI, martial arts, music, professional/business/trade, and similar facilities;
  - (7) Health club and/or fitness center;
  - (8) Hotel;
  - (9) Insurance carrier, agent, and/or broker;
  - (10) Laboratory, medical, and/or dental;
  - (11) Legal services;
  - (12) Massage therapy (see chapter 8);
  - (13) Medical/dental office (human treatment);
  - (14) Military recruiting office;
  - (15) Museum;
  - (16) Performing arts theater;
  - (17) Private school, including classrooms and/or administration only;
  - (18) Professional services, including, but not limited to: accounting; advertising and marketing research services; architectural firms; bookkeeping, tax preparation; brokerage firms; computer system software design; consulting services; engineering firms; internet and web hosting firms; payroll services; photographic services; research services; specialized design services; telemarketing; and translation and interpretation services; and
  - (19) Real estate agent and/or broker.
- (c) Permitted principal uses and structures for office parks with at least 100,000 square feet of floor area. In an office park having at least 100,000 square feet of floor area, the following retail and service uses shall be permitted as long as collectively such uses comprise no more than ten percent of the total floor area, are located in a building in which office uses comprise at least 50 percent of the floor area and have no exterior advertising display:
  - (1) Beauty shop and/or barbershop;
  - (2) Blueprinting;
  - (3) Cafeteria;
  - (4) Commercial art and/or drafting service;
  - (5) Day care facility;
  - (6) Delivery and/or messenger service;
  - (7) Drug store;

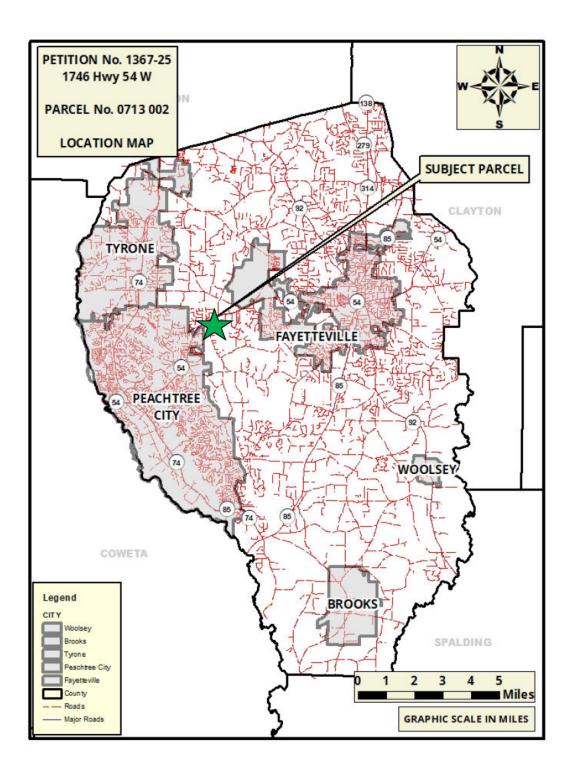
- (8) Florist;
- (9) Gift shop;
- (10) Photocopying and/or reproduction;
- (11) Restaurant (limited to five percent of total floor area of office park and included in overall ten percent limitation);
- (12) Stenographic and/or typing service;
- (13) Teleconferencing center; and
- (14) Travel agency and/or ticket office.
- (d) *Conditional uses.* The following conditional uses shall be allowed in the O-I zoning district provided that all conditions specified in article V of this chapter are met:
  - (1) Adult day care facility;
  - (2) Animal hospital and/or veterinary clinic (with no animal boarding or outdoor runs);
  - (3) Care home, convalescent center, and/or nursing home;
  - (4) Church and/or other place of worship;
  - (5) College and/or university, including, but not limited to: classrooms, administration, housing, athletic fields, gymnasium, and stadium;
  - (6) Child care facility;
  - (7) Home occupation;
  - (8) Hospital;
  - (9) Non-emergency medical transport service;
  - (10) Private school, including, but not limited to: classrooms, administration, playground, housing, athletic fields, gymnasium, and stadium;
  - (11) Religious tent meeting; and
  - (12) Single-family residence and residential accessory structures and/or uses (see article III of this chapter).
  - (13) Drug abuse treatment facility.
- (e) Auxiliary conditional uses for an office building with a minimum of 10,000 square feet of floor area. The following auxiliary permitted uses shall be allowed within the area with a land use designation of office as indicated on the county future land use plan map defined as that area north of SR 54 West, east of Tyrone Road, and west of Sandy Creek Road. This area shall also be known as the county community hospital district (hospital district). Such uses will support and shall be compatible with the county community hospital, the medical industry, and the development of the office and institutional uses planned for this area.
  - (1) Uses. The following auxiliary conditional uses shall be allowed in the O-I zoning district:
    - a. Durable medical and rehabilitation equipment sales/rental (i.e., wheelchairs, crutches, etc.);
    - b. Pharmaceutical sales (for the purpose of filling prescriptions only);
    - c. Counter service restaurants, including but not limited to: a bakery, cafe, coffee shop, or deli. No drive-through, drive-in, or freestanding facilities shall be allowed;
    - d. Optical care center to include prescription eyeglass/contact lens sales;
    - e. Gift shop for the sale of items usually associated with a medical condition and/or hospital stay (i.e., get well cards, etc.); and
    - f. Floral sales.
  - (2) Auxiliary conditional use limitations.

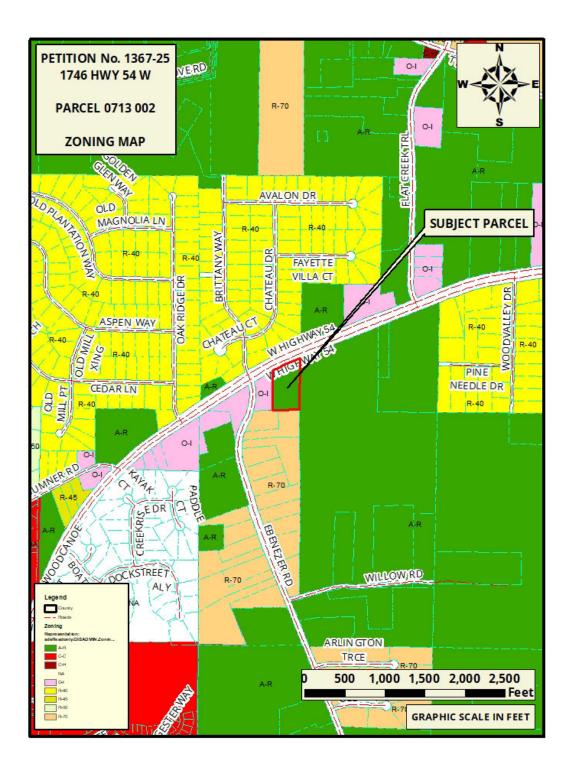
- a. These auxiliary conditional uses shall be allowed in an office building with a minimum of 10,000 square feet and such uses shall comprise no more than a total of 20 percent of the total floor area of the building and shall occupy space on the first floor of the building.
- b. Multiple uses may be permitted concurrently, but may not exceed the 20 percent limitation.
- (3) Architectural requirements.
  - a. Architecture shall conform to the existing hospital/medical office development. The architectural standards of the transportation corridor overlay zone shall not apply.
  - b. Elevation drawings shall be submitted as part of site plan approval.
- (f) *Dimensional requirements*. The minimum dimensional requirements in the O-I zoning district shall be as follows:
  - (1) Lot area:
    - a. Where a central water distribution system is provided: 43,560 square feet (one acre).
    - b. Where central sanitary sewage and central water distribution systems are provided:
    - 21,780 square feet (0.50 acre).
  - (2) Lot width: 125 feet.
  - (3) Outside storage shall not be permitted.
  - (4) Setbacks, yards adjoining rights-of-way:
    - a. Major thoroughfare:
      - 1. Arterial: 75 feet.
      - 2. Collector: 70 feet.
    - b. Minor thoroughfare: 55 feet.
  - (5) Setbacks, yards not adjoining rights-of-way:
    - a. Side yard: 15 feet.
    - b. Rear yard: 15 feet.
  - (6) Buffer: If the rear or side yard abuts a residential or A-R zoning district, a minimum buffer of 30 feet adjacent to such lot line shall be provided in addition to the required setback, and the setback shall be measured from the buffer. Additional buffer and setback requirements may be established as a condition of zoning approval.
  - (7) Height limit:
    - a. 40 feet as defined in article I of this chapter.
    - b. When a structure reaches a minimum height of four floors (including basements), it shall be sprinkled.
  - (8) Use of existing structure. When property containing legally conforming structures, under the current zoning, is rezoned to O-I, the dimensional requirements shall be reduced to the extent of, but only at the location of, any encroachment by the structures and said structures shall be considered legal nonconforming structures.
  - (9) Lot coverage limit, including structure and parking area: 60 percent of total lot area.
- (g) SR 74 North-East Side Special Development District.
  - (1) The following will apply to the area identified in the county Comprehensive Plan, SR 74 North Overlay District on the east side of SR 74 North and designated as special development district and office on the county future land use plan map. The purpose of this special development district is to promote planned office development along the frontage of SR 74

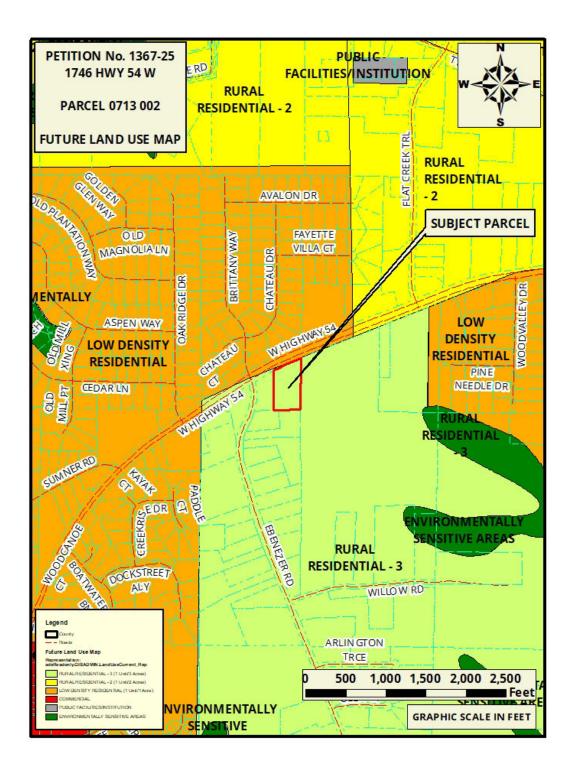
North to a depth of approximately 800 feet to fulfill the stated goals for the future development of the corridor. The goals of the SR 74 North Overlay District are:

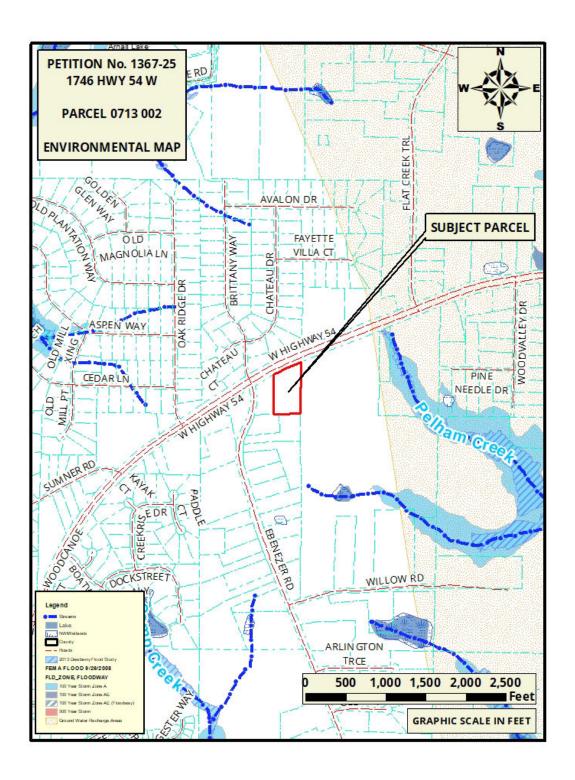
- a. To maintain the efficient traffic flow of SR 74 North as the county's main connection to Interstate 85;
- b. To enhance and maintain the aesthetic qualities of the corridor, as it is the gateway into the county; and
- c. To protect existing and future residential areas in the SR 74 North corridor.
- (2) The assemblage of parcels will be necessary in some areas to meet the intent of the special development district. The minimum requirements for acreage and road frontage will necessitate large tracts of land to achieve a reduction in individual curb cuts, consistency and coordination in architectural scheme, and capacity to develop a required service road where applicable.
  - a. In a planned office development consisting of a minimum of ten acres and 600 feet of road frontage on SR 74 North, a maximum of 20 percent of the floor area of each individual building may consist of businesses providing support services for the larger development. Permitted support service uses include:
    - 1. Restaurants (no drive-through, drive-in, or freestanding facilities shall be allowed);
    - 2. Personal services, including, but not limited to: alterations; barber shop; beauty salon; clothing/costume rentals; electrolysis and/or hair removal; laundry drop-off/pick-up; locksmith; nail salon; photography studio; shoe repair; and tanning salon;
    - 3. Convenience store (no gasoline sales);
    - 4. Blueprinting, graphic, and/or copying service;
    - 5. Office and/or computer sales and/or service; and
    - 6. Cellular phone/communication device sales and/or service.
- (h) State Route 54 West Special Development District.
  - (1) The following will apply to the area identified in the Comprehensive Plan as the SR 54 West Overlay District as specified in the Land Use Element and indicated on the future land use plan map. The purpose of this special development district is to expand uses in O-I on parcels of five acres or greater.
  - (2) On parcels zoned O-I with a minimum of five acres the following expanded business uses are allowed:
    - a. Businesses that supply services, equipment and/or resources to the film industry;
    - b. Call center;
    - c. Cellular phone/communication device sales and/or service;
    - d. Computer technology service, sales and/or repair;
    - e. Medical equipment sales, rental and/or repair;
    - f. Restaurant (no drive-through or drive-in);
    - g. Television/radio broadcasting studio, movie/music/media productions or telecommunications;
    - h. Server farm/data center; and
    - i. Internal access self-storage facility.
      - 1. No direct exterior access to individual storage units shall be allowed; all individual storage unit access shall be internal and the maximum size of an individual storage unit shall be 600 square feet.

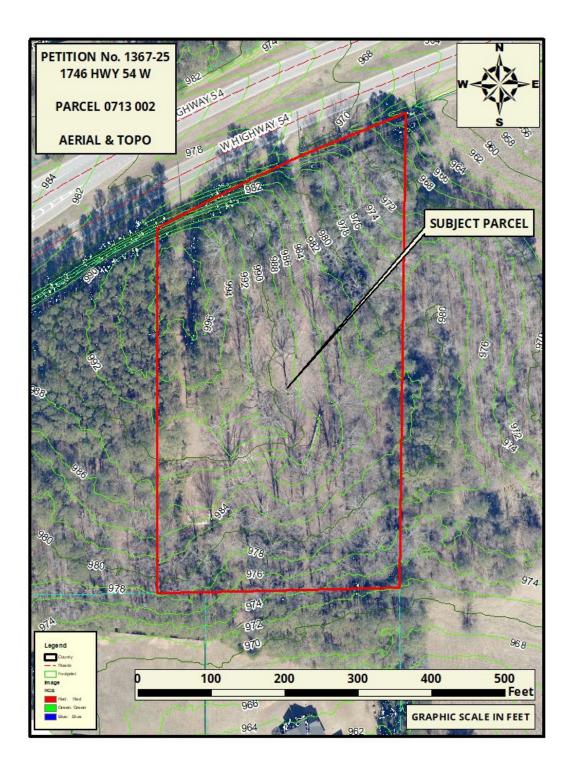
- 2. Vehicle loading/unloading bays shall only be located on the side or rear, and not facing SR 54. Vehicle loading/unloading bays on the side of the internal access self-storage facility shall require a canopy. Vehicle loading/unloading bays may also be internal to the structure or between two structures and a shed roof meeting the overlay pitch requirements may also be used in these instances.
- 3. Office, business and building contractor space with associated inside storage shall constitute a minimum of ten percent of the total building footprint area proposed for the internal access self-storage structure(s) excluding the footprint of a separate vehicle, recreational vehicle, boat, and/or trailer storage structure. This building contractor use shall only be allowed in conjunction with an internal access self-storage facility. The office, business and building contractor space may be located within the footprint of the internal access self-storage structure or an equivalent amount of office, business and building contractor space may be located outside of the footprint in an attached portion of the structure.
- 4. No outside storage of materials or equipment shall be allowed.
- 5. A vehicle, recreational vehicle, boat, and/or trailer storage structure shall be fully enclosed and be to the rear of the principal internal access self-storage facility structure. This use shall only be allowed in conjunction with an internal access self-storage facility. Said structure shall only be used for vehicle, recreational vehicle, boat and/or trailer storage and individual vehicle, recreational vehicle, boat and/or trailer storage units may be externally accessed.
- (3) If the side and/or rear yards abut a residential or A-R zoning district, the setbacks shall be increased five feet for every one foot of total building height over 40 feet.
- (4) Mixed residential/office use. Based on the Mixed Residential/Office Use Recommendations in the Land Use Element of the Fayette County Comprehensive Plan, where large tracts are proposed with a mix of residential and office development along SR 54, it is required at the time of rezoning for O-I and residential zoning that the concept plan depict how the entire property will be developed indicating the division between office and residential zoning districts with associated legal descriptions required for rezoning, the SR 54 entrance, and internal connecting road network.

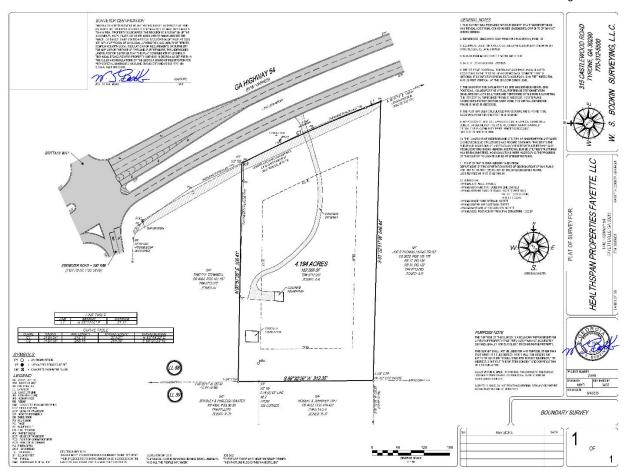




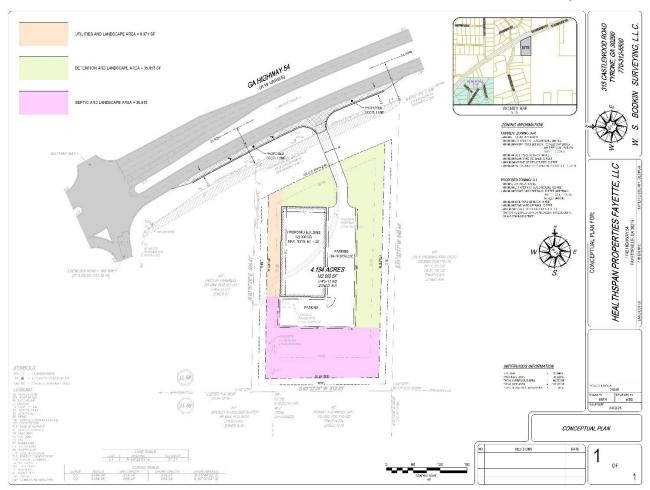

Ms. Heather Stewart has requested a partial refund of taxes for tax years 2022, 2023, and 2024 based on erroneous removal of her homestead exemption.

The homestead exemption was removed in error in 2022 due to a name change. The exemption was added back to the property for 2022 and subsequent years resulting in a refund due in the total amount of \$2,882.62.

The provisions of the refund statute were designed to enable correction of an error or illegality that exists in the record of assessment and is discovered after the payment of taxes. In this case, the homeowner's exemption was erroneously removed. Assessors' Office staff has confirmed that the property owner is eligible for the exemption and has corrected the error.

Phase II is envisioned to include a 3,218 square foot barn and kennel, to be constructed behind the Animal Shelter, and outdoor amenities such as fenced areas, walking paths, and shade structures.

## Judicial Correction Services, LLC Probation Services Agreement

#### Fayette County, Georgia

This Agreement is made by and between Judicial Correction Services, LLC organized under the laws of the State of Georgia, with its principal business at 1770 Indian Trail Road, Suite 350, Norcross, Georgia, 30093 hereinafter called "Contractor" and Fayette County, Georgia hereinafter called "County", upon the request and consent of the Chief Judge of Magistrate Court of Fayette County, Georgia herein after called "Court". This agreement is governed by Article 6 of Chapter 8 of Title 42 of the Official Code of Georgia, Annotated. The parties enter into the Agreement under the specific authority of O.C.G.A. § 42-8-101.

#### Witnesseth:

Whereas, the County has been duly authorized to establish service for a private probation system for the supervision of probationers as ordered by the Fayette County Magistrate Court, and to collect restitution, fines, and fees as ordered by the Chief Judge of Fayette County Magistrate Court.

Whereas, the County wishes to enter into an agreement with the Contractor to provide probation services upon the terms and conditions set forth herein with approval from the Court.

Now therefore, and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable considerations, the receipt, adequacy, and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the parties hereto, the County enters into the agreement with the Contractor to provide probation services for the jurisdiction of Fayette County upon the terms, covenants, and agreements as set forth herein.

Scope of Services and Responsibilities of Contractor

In consideration of the obligations of the County and the Court, Contractor shall provide the following services.

- A. Responsibilities of Probation Services Contractor
  - a. Compliance with Statues and Rules. Contractor shall comply with Article 6 of Title 42 Chapter 8 of the Official Code of Georgia and all standards, rules, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Community Supervision and the Misdemeanor Oversight Unit.
  - b. Records and Confidentiality. Contractor shall create and maintain individual files for each offender receiving services from Contractor in accordance with this Agreement. Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of all files, records, and papers relative to supervision of probationers under this Agreement. These records, files, and papers shall be available only to the Judge of the Court handling the case, the Department of Audits and Accounts, the Department of Supervision and upon transfer of supervision to the State, to the Georgia Department of Corrections or the Department of Community Supervision.
  - c. Financial Records. Contractor shall maintain financial records according to generally accepted accounting practices.

- d. Officer Qualifications and Training, Contractor shall employ competent and able personnel to provide the services to be rendered hereunder and to appropriately administer the caseload of a probation officer. In accordance with O.C.G.A. 42-8-107, any such person shall be at least 21 years of age at the time of appointment to the position of private probation officer or probation officer and shall have completed a standard four-year college course or have four years of law enforcement experience; provided, however, that any person employed as a private probation officer as of July 1, 1996, and who had at least six months of experience as a private probation officer or any person employed as a probation officer by a county, municipality, or consolidated government as of March 1, 2006, shall be exempt from such college requirements. Every private probation officer shall receive an initial 40 hours of training and orientation upon employment and shall receive 20 hours of continuing education per annum as approved by the Department of Community Supervision Board of Directors, hereinafter referred as the Board, provided that the 40 hour initial orientation shall not be required of any person who has successfully completed a basic course of training for supervision of probationers or parolees certified by the Peace Officer Standards and Training Council or any private probation officer who has been employed by a private probation corporation, enterprise, or agency for at least six months as of July 1, 1996, or any person employed as a probation officer by a county, municipal, or consolidated government as of March 1, 2006. In no event shall any person convicted of a felony be employed as a probation officer or private probation officer.
- e. Intake, Administrative, and Intern Qualifications and Training. Contractor shall employ competent and able personnel to provide the services to be rendered hereunder and to appropriately administer assistance to a private probation officer or the Contractor. Any such person shall be at least 18 years of age at the time of appointment to the position of intake officer, administrative staff, or intern and shall have completed a standard high school diploma or its equivalent.
- f. Criminal History Check. Contractor shall have a criminal history records check made of all employees and give written consent to the Department of Community Supervision to conduct periodic criminal history checks.
- g. Officer per Probationer Ratio and Standards of Supervision. Contractor shall manage caseload limits so as not to exceed 250 probationers per probation officer for basic supervision and 200 probationers per probation officer for intensive supervision. There are no caseload size limitations regarding pay-only cases. Probation Officers shall make a supervision assessment of each offender and determine the reporting schedule, type of contact(s), and frequency of contact(s) pursuant to the direction of the Court. There are no minimally required contacts for pay-only cases.
- h. Location Place of Business. Contractor shall maintain an office in Fayette County, Georgia for meeting with and the provision of services to probationers.
- B. Reports. Contractor shall provide to the Judge and the County with whom the contract or agreement was made and the Board a quarterly report summarizing the number of probationers under supervision; the amount of restitution, fines, and statutory surcharges collected; the amount of fees collected and the nature of such fees, including supervision fees, classes for rehabilitation programs fees, electronic monitoring fees, drug or alcohol detection device fees, and drug testing fees; the number of community service hours performed by probationers under supervision; a listing of any other service for which a probationer was required to pay to attend; the number of probationers for whom supervision or rehabilitation has been terminated

- and the reason for the termination; and the number of warrants issued during the quarter, in such detail as requested.
- C. Tender of Collections. Contractor shall tender to the Clerk of the Court of Fayette County, Georgia, hereinafter referred as the Clerk, a report of collections and all fines, fees, and costs collected during the month from probationers by the 9<sup>th</sup> day of the following month. Restitution shall be paid to the victim by the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the month following collection unless the Court orders payment to the Clerk, and then it shall be paid as such other collections are paid to the Clerk. In the event the Contractor cannot locate the victim, payment shall be made to the Clerk. Contractor shall credit payments of funds to in the following order of priority: 1) restitution, 2) fines, 3) courts costs and statutory surcharges, 4) probation fees, class and rehabilitation fees, drug and alcohol testing fees, and all other probation services rendered to the probationer. Contractor shall not retain or profit from any restitution, fines, court costs, or statutory surcharges collected from probationers except the probation fee authorized by this Agreement as set forth in the Schedule of Fees.
- D. Access to Contractor Records.
  - a. All records shall be open to inspection upon the request of the affected County, Court, the Department of Audits and Accounts as requested, an auditor appointed by the Commissioners, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Community Supervision, the State Board of Pardons and Paroles, or the Board.
  - b. Fiscal Audit. Contractor may be requested by the County or the Court to audit its records and books pertaining to the services rendered to the Court. A written copy of this audit shall be provided to the Court and the County within 3 months of the close of the audit.
- E. Conflicts of Interest per O.C.G.A. 42-8-109
  - a. No private corporation, private enterprise, or private agency contracting to provide probation services under the provisions of this article nor any employees of such entities shall engage in any other employment, business, or activity which interferes or conflicts with the duties and responsibilities under contracts authorized in this article.
  - b. No private corporation, private enterprise, or private agency contracting to provide probation services under the provisions of this article nor any employees of such entities shall own, operate, have any financial interest in, be an instructor at, or be employed by any private entity which provides drug or alcohol education services or offers a DUI Alcohol or Drug Use Risk Reduction Program certified by the Department of Driver Services.
  - c. No private corporation, private enterprise, or private agency contracting to provide probation services under the provisions of this article nor any employees of such entities shall specify, directly or indirectly, a particular DUI Alcohol or Drug Use Risk Reduction Program which a probationer may or shall attend. This paragraph shall not prohibit furnishing any probationer, upon request, with the names of certified DUI Alcohol or Drug Use Risk Reduction Programs. Any person violating this paragraph shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- F. Scope of Services to Probationers by Contractor. Contractor shall provide the following services:
  - a. Court Attendance and Probationer Case History. During all court sessions, Contractor shall make available an intake officer or probation officer to interview each probationer to complete a case and personal history and to provide orientation and instruction regarding compliance with the Court's ordered conditions of probation. At orientation, the intake or probation officer shall provide a list of all service fees to the probationer.

- b. Supervision. Contractor shall monitor and supervise probationers to ensure compliance with the Court's order of probation. Contractor shall make a supervision assessment of the offender and determine the probationer's reporting schedule.
- c. Restitution, Fine, Statutory Surcharges, and Fee Collection. Contractor shall collect restitution, fines, statutory surcharges, probation supervision fees, class and rehabilitation fees, drug and alcohol testing fees as ordered by the Court. Contractor shall provide an itemized bill prepared in accordance with accepted accounting practices for each month for each.
  - i. Indigent Probationers. Offenders determined by the Court to be indigent in accordance with O.C.G.A. 42-8-1025 shall be supervised at no cost to the probationer, the Court, or the County.
  - ii. Contractual Split of Payments. Each payment received from the probationer, if paid by the monthly schedule set forth by the probation officer on the initial first appointment, shall be applied according to the restitution, fines, statutory surcharges, court costs, and class and rehabilitation fees, drug and alcohol testing fees as ordered by the Court.
  - iii. Pay Only Probation. Offenders who are placed on probation sentences as outlined in O. C.G.A. 42-8-103 shall pay only three (3) months of probation fees regardless of the number of concurrent or consecutive cases. Fees and cases shall be terminated when paid in full unless the Court so modifies the sentence.
  - iv. Consecutive cases. Consecutive misdemeanor sentences shall be supervised in accordance with O.C.G.A. 42-8-103.1.
    - 1. Each payment, if said payment should be less than the amount specified by the probation officer on the initial first appointment, received from the probationer, excepting intensive testing, pay-only cases, and class and rehabilitative fees below, shall be split for the Court as payment for restitution, fine, statutory surcharges as seventy percent (70%) and the Contractor as payment for probation supervision fees, class and rehabilitative fees, drug and as thirty percent (30%).
    - 2. Payment for Intensive Drug and Alcohol Testing. For probationers ordered by the Court to intensive drug and alcohol testing, the probationer will be required to pay for the drug and alcohol testing as set in the schedule of fees as the tests are rendered. This payment shall be one payment not subject to the contractual split of payments. The Contractor shall make every effort to keep the probationer in compliance with normal monthly payments towards restitution, fine, and statutory surcharges.
    - 3. Payment for Class and Rehabilitative Fees. For probationers ordered by the Court to class and rehabilitative courses and required to pay them as set by the schedule of fees, the probationer will be required to pay for the class and rehabilitative courses as rendered and this payment shall a second payment not subject to the contractual split of payments. The Contractor shall make every effort to keep the probationer in compliance with normal monthly payments towards restitution, fine, and statutory surcharges.
    - 4. In no instance or under any circumstances will any court monies be moved or transferred from the Court's account to supervision fees without express permission and a corresponding order from the Court.

- 5. In no instance will any probation fees or drug and alcohol testing fees be collected by the Contractor in advance of the supervision services or drug and alcohol testing fees it provides.
- d. Community Service. Contractor shall coordinate, monitor, and ensure compliance with community service by each probationer as ordered by the Court. The court may convert fines, statutory surcharges, and probation supervision fees to community service on the same basis as it allows a defendant to pay a fine through community service as set forth in subsection (d) of O.C.G.A. 17-10-1. Contractor will maintain records of service participation.
  - i. Rate of Conversion. The current rate of community service conversion for fines, statutory surcharges, and probation supervision fees is \$10.00 per hour. The Court may amend this provision with an order from the Court. The minimum rate shall be Federal minimum wage or \$10.00 per hour, whichever is higher after this Agreement is signed.
  - ii. Location of Community Service. For probationers assigned to community service for court ordered hours or for conversion of fines, statutory surcharges, and supervision fees, the probation officer will instruct the probationer to complete said hours in Fayette County, Georgia. If a probationer is unable to comply, then the probation officer will require twenty (20) hours of community service to be done in Fayette County, Georgia and then may transfer the remaining hours to a local community service organization to the probationer, if approved by the probation supervising officer. In the event a probationer cannot travel to Fayette County, Georgia for community service obligations, then the probation supervising officer may request the Court a full transfer of community service obligations. The Court, in its discretion, may assent or refuse such requests.
- Employment Assistance. Contractor shall prepare referrals and lend reasonable
  assistance to probationers to the extent ordered by the Court or to the extent available
  for probationers desiring employment assistance or counseling.
- f. Drug and Alcohol Testing. Contractor shall not use drug and alcohol screening devices. Contractor shall use drug and alcohol tests. Contractor shall conduct drug and alcohol testing as determined necessary by the Court. The probationer shall be responsible for the costs of all drug and alcohol testing.
  - Intensive Drug and Alcohol Testing. For intensive testing as set by the Court, the probationer shall pay for drug and alcohol testing weekly as set by the schedule of fees.
- g. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Evaluations and Rehabilitative Services. Contractor shall coordinate with local authorities and facilities for the evaluation and assessment of probationers for drug and alcohol rehabilitation services, mental health or psychological counseling, or educational programs mandated by the Court and shall require probationer's compliance.
- h. Electronic Monitoring. Contractor when so ordered by the Court shall provide to the probationer a list of third party electronic monitoring or house arrest providers for the monitoring of said probationers.
- i. Reports of Violations of Probation and Revocation Procedures. Contractor shall recommend revocation of probation whenever the probationers have failed substantially to comply with the terms and conditions of probation. The Court shall provide Contractor with direction of what constitutes a substantial failure to comply with probation terms and conditions. Contractor shall prepare probation violation

warrants, orders, and revocation hearings for submission to the Court. Contractor shall have probation officers available to testify at probation revocation hearings, sentencing hearings, and other such hearings as deemed reasonable and necessary by the Court. Minor violations of probation, although not cause for revocation, shall be included in regular reports made to the Court if requested under this Agreement. The Court shall provide Contractor direction as to what curative measures should be taken in the case of minor violations.

- i. The supervising probation officer will instruct the probationer how to comply with the Court's ruling in reference to sentencing or revocation of probation.
- j. Pre-sentence Investigations. When directed by the Court, Contractor shall conduct presentence investigations for the Court as requested. A written report shall be prepared and delivered to the Court. A pre-sentence investigation shall include: 1) a report on the circumstances of the offense, 2) a social and family background examination, 3) a criminal history check through the Georgia Crime Information Center and the National Crime Information Center, and 4) a report of current circumstances and conditions of the defendant. The cost for pre-sentence investigations will be \$100 per report to be paid by the Court to the Contractor.
- k. The Contractor may recommend as set forth in O.C.G.A. 42-8-103.1. (a) & (b) to the Court early termination or non-reporting probation. A probationer will not be assessed probation supervision fees if such a request is granted by the Court.

#### Obligations of the Court or Governing Authority

In consideration for the services of Judicial Correction Services, the Contractor, the Fayette County Magistrate Court of Georgia, the Court, shall provide the following:

- G. For regular probation supervision according to the order of the Court, probationer shall pay a fee of \$35 per month.
- H. For intensive probation supervision according to the order of the Court, probationer shall pay a fee of \$50 per month.
- Contractor shall collect such probation fee for each month or portion of a month a probationer
  is under probation supervision. During the term of the Agreement and the Contractor's
  satisfactory performance, the Court shall refer all probationers to serve time on probation to the
  Contractor for purposes of probation supervision services.
- J. Probation Fee. The Court shall make payment of the probation fee as listed in this agreement a term and condition of the order of probation for each probationer assigned for supervision to Contractor unless the Court determines the probationer to be indigent. The Court shall not be liable for payment of any supervision fee or any program fee of a probationer.
  - Pre-Sentencing Investigations. When ordered by the Court, Contractor shall provide a presentence investigation report and Court shall pay to the Contractor \$100 for each report.
- L. Access to Criminal Histories. The Court shall assist the Contractor in obtaining access to criminal histories in the Georgia Crime Information Center and National Crime Information Center through local law enforcement in order for Contractor to conduct pre-sentence investigations as may be requested.
- M. Notice of Court Sessions. The Court shall provide the Contractor notice of the current yearly schedule of court sessions by December 21<sup>st</sup> of the previous year. The Court shall provide the Contractor a general court calendar or notice of changes in the schedule of court sessions by 5 PM of the previous day.

- N. Court Facilities. The Court and the Clerk shall provide to the Contractor an area, as available, for the purpose of conducting initial interviews and orientation with the probationer on the day of sentencing.
- O. Period of Service. The services to be performed under this Contract shall commence on January 1, 2020. The initial term of this Contract shall be through December 31, 2020. This Contract shall terminate absolutely and without further obligation on the part of the County on December 31 of each succeeding and renewed year, as required by O.C.G.A. §36-60-13, as amended, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the termination provisions of this Contract. This Contract may be automatically renewed on an annual basis for four (4) additional twelve-month terms, for a total lifetime Contract term of five (5) years, upon the same terms and conditions as provided for in this Contract, unless previously terminated. This Contract will terminate on December 31, 2024. The County shall have the option to renew the contract for five (5) additional one-year intervals provided that the service is satisfactory, both parties are willing to renew, and the renewal is approved with the written consent of the County. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice. The Court or the County may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause, including without limitation material breach of this Agreement, insolvency of Contractor, filing of voluntary or involuntary case in bankruptcy. Within sixty (60) working days of termination, Contractor shall peacefully surrender to the Court all records and documents generated by the Contractor in connection with this Agreement and the services thereunder and any equipment or supplies assigned to the Contractor by the Court. Contractor shall turn over to the Clerk any monies collected or received less supervision fees validly incurred and duly owing to the Contractor through the termination date. Any restitution, fines, statutory surcharges, or court costs received by the Contractors from probationers of this Court after termination of this Agreement shall be forwarded to the Clerk, other than fees earned by the Contractor. The Court shall provide the Contractor receipt for all property surrendered under this provision.

#### Indemnity, Insurance, and Bonding Obligations of Contractor

- P. Insurance and Bond. Upon registration application to operate a private probation entity, the Contractor must include written evidence of general liability insurance coverage of at least one million (\$1,000,000). This insurance must be maintained at all times while providing services.
- Q. Bonding. The Contractor shall include written evidence of bonding coverage of at least twenty-five thousand (\$25,000).
- R. Indemnification. Neither the Court nor the County shall be liable to the Contractor nor to anyone who may claim a right resulting from any relationship with Contractor, for any acts of the Contractor, its employees, agents, or participants in the performance of services conducted on the property of the County. Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Court and County from any claims, demands, actions, proceedings, expenses, damages, liabilities, or losses (including by not limited to attorney's fees and court costs) and any causes of action arising from any acts or omissions arising out of or in connection with the services performed by the Contractor or its employees and agents under the terms of this Agreement.

#### Representations and Warranties of Contractor

S. Deficiency in Service by Contractor. In the event that the Court and County determines that there are deficiencies in the services provided by the Contractor hereunder, the Court and the County may terminate this Agreement in accordance with item O or notify the Contractor in writing as to the exact nature of such deficiency. Within sixty (60) days of receipt of such notice,

the Contractor shall cure or take reasonable steps to cure the deficiencies. In the event the company fails to cure or take reasonable steps to cure the deficiencies to the Court and County satisfaction, then either may declare the Contractor in default and may terminate this Agreement.

- T. Time is of the Essence of this Agreement.
- U. Compliance with the Law. The Contractor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws statutes, regulations, and ordinances arising out of or in connection with the performance of its services pursuant to this Agreement.
- V. Independent Contractor. Contractor is an independent contractor and is not an agent, joint venture, or other affiliate of the Court or County in any way. Contractor shall use its own employees and agents to perform this Agreement. It is agreed that the Contractor is solely responsible for all payment of federal, state, and local income taxes, self-employed Social Security taxes, and any other similar obligations arising from the performance of this Agreement or receipt of compensation thereof. The Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Court and the Court from and against any and all federal, state, or local tax liability or penalties that may arise from the payments made to the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement. The Contractor acknowledges that neither it nor its employees are eligible for any benefits provided by the Court or the County.
- W. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, including all exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes any and all agreements, whether written or oral, that may exist between the parties regarding the same. No representations, inducements, promises, or agreements between the parties not embodied herein shall be of any force and effect. No amendment or modification to this Agreement or any waiver of any provision hereto shall be effective unless in writing and signed by all parties to include the Court, the County, and the Contractor.
- X. Binding Agreement. This Contract shall be binding on any successor to the undersigned official of the County or Courts. The provisions enumerated in this Contract shall be deemed valid insofar as they do not violate any City, State, or Federal laws. In the event any provision of this Contract should be declared invalid, the remainder of this Contract shall remain in full force and effect.
- Y. Subcontractors. The Contractor may not delegate, assign, or subcontract any obligation, excepting drug and alcohol testing and electronic monitoring mentioned above, of the Contractors performance under the Agreement and may not assign any right under this Agreement, in either case without the Court's approval. The Court has discretion in this regard and this discretion shall be absolute. Any notices made in accordance with this Agreement except as otherwise set out in item M, shall be in writing and shall be made in person, by registered mail, or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the Contractors.

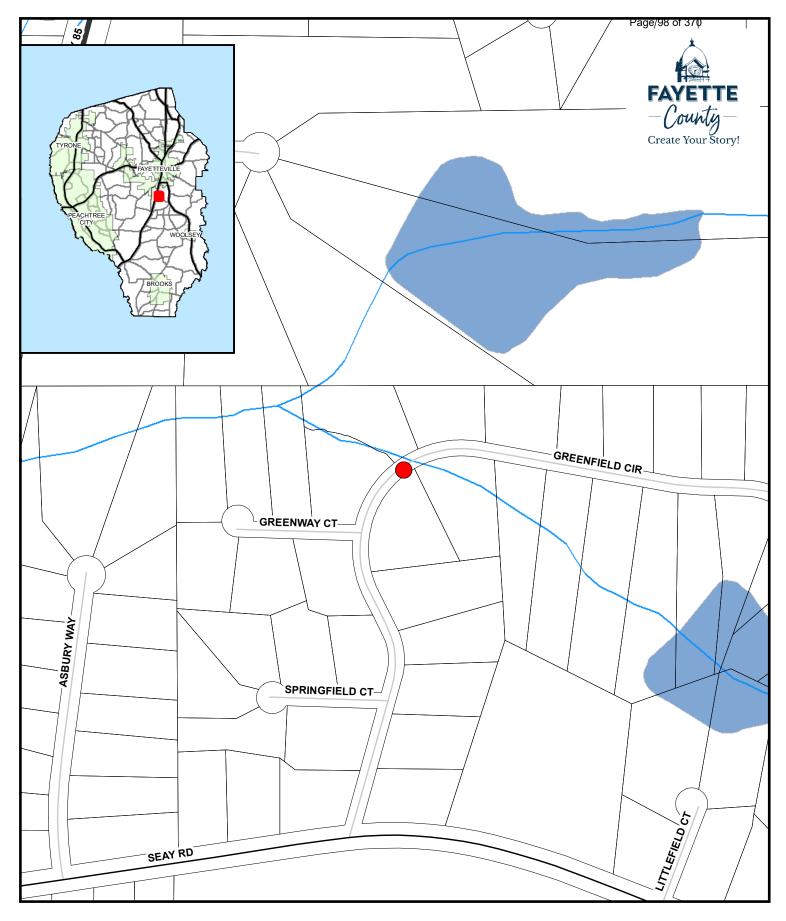

#### **DEED OF EASEMENT**

THIS DEED OF EASEMENT (this "Agreement") is made as of the \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2025, by and between PEACHTREE CITY, GA (1501 GEORGIAN PARK) LLC, an Illinois limited liability company ("Grantor") and FAYETTE COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia ("Grantee"). Grantor and Grantee are sometimes individually referred to herein as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Grantor is the owner in fee simple of certain real property located in Peachtree City, Fayette County, Georgia, legally described on <u>Exhibit A</u>, attached hereto and incorporated herein (the "**Grantor Parcel**"); and

WHEREAS, Grantee desires an easement from Grantor as legally described on <a href="Exhibit B">Exhibit B</a> and depicted on <a href="Exhibit C">Exhibit C</a> attached hereto and incorporated herein (the "Easement Area"), for an existing water line crossing the southeast corner of the Grantor Property in the location shown on <a href="Exhibit C">Exhibit C</a> (the "Existing Water Line"); and

WHEREAS, Grantor desires to grant said easement to Grantee.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of ONE and 00/100 DOLLAR (\$1.00) cash in hand paid, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Grantor does hereby grant and convey unto Grantee, the easement as follows, subject to all reservations, leases, licenses, easements, restrictions, covenants, encumbrances and other matters of record:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are hereby adopted and incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Easement</u>. Grantor hereby grants and conveys to Grantee a non-exclusive, perpetual easement (the "Easement") over the Easement Area for the purpose of the maintenance, repair, replacement and removal of the Existing Water Line and any existing related equipment (collectively, the "Water Line Facilities"), subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Duration</u>. The Easement granted herein is appurtenant to and shall run with title to the Grantor Parcel and is perpetual.
- 4. Private Use. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall ever be deemed to create a gift or dedication of all or any portion of the Grantor Parcel to the general public or for any public use or public purpose whatsoever. Grantee acknowledges that Grantor shall have the right to install, maintain, repair, replace and remove improvements in the Easement Area, including but not limited to an asphalt golf cart path, an electric line and related improvements and appurtenances, so long as: (i) Grantor shall not erect or construct or cause to be erected or constructed any building, structure or similar improvement limiting access to or within the limits of the Easement Area; (ii) Grantor shall not install any physical

encroachments or obstacles within the Easement Area that will materially impair Grantee's maintenance and operation of the Water Line Facilities.

- 5. <u>Maintenance, Costs and Repair</u>. Following any disturbance of the Easement Area or any other part of the Grantor Property by Grantee, caused by Grantee, its agents, employees and/or contractors, Grantee agrees to return the Easement Area and/or any other part of the Grantor Property disturbed to as near its pre-disturbance condition as is practicable. If Grantee disturbs any physical encroachments or obstacles installed by Grantor and that materially impaired Grantee's maintenance and operation of the Water Line Facilities, the cost to return such encroachments and/or obstacles to pre- disturbance condition shall be borne by Grantor.
- 6. <u>Indemnification</u>. To the extent permitted by Georgia law, Grantee shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend Grantor, its mortgagee, general partner, limited partner, members, managers, employees, agents, contractors, invitees, officers, directors, lessees, affiliates and subsidiaries from and against any and all claims, actions, damages, liabilities and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and other professional fees, in connection with any property damage or personal injury, arising from or out of the exercise of the rights granted under this Agreement, including without limitation, the installation, operation, maintenance, repair, replacement or removal by Grantee its employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors, of the Water Line Facilities, except to the extent that any such claims, actions, damages, liabilities, expenses or damage arise out of the negligence or willful misconduct caused by Grantor, its employees, agents, contractors, invitees, officers, directors, affiliates or subsidiaries. The terms and conditions of this Section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice given under this Agreement must be in writing and will be deemed to have been delivered: (a) upon receipt or refusal of delivery, when delivered personally; (b) the day deposited with the U.S. Postal Service, when sent by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested; or (c) the day deposited with a nationally recognized overnight courier service such as Federal Express, when sent next business day delivery to a U.S. address.

- 9. <u>Separability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is hereafter expressly declared by a court of proper jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such provision shall be cancelled and severed from this Agreement and the other provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.
- 10. <u>Amendment; Modification</u>. This Agreement may be amended by the written consent and mutual agreement of the Parties herein. Any such modification or amendment shall be effective when duly recorded with the Fayette County, Georgia Recorder's Office.
- 11. <u>Authority</u>. Each signatory hereto hereby warrants to the other Party that the individual has the authority to execute this Agreement for and on behalf of the entity for which it purports to act.
- 12. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which will constitute an original, but all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one Agreement.
- 13. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement and all the provisions hereof shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia.

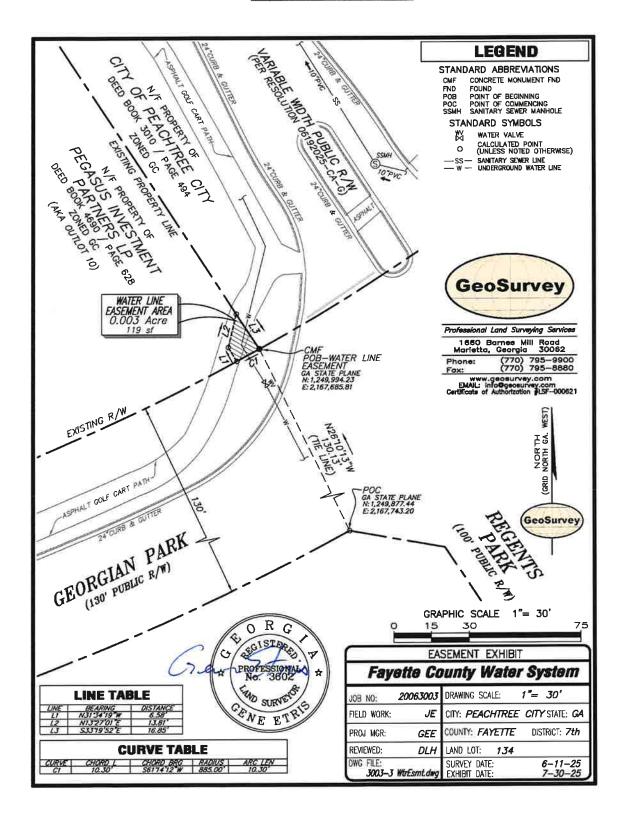

THIS WATER LINE EASEMENT (this "Easement") is made this Z day of accompany, 2025, by QTS FAYETTEVILLE I, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, as grantor hereunder ("Grantor"), to FAYETTE COUNTY, GEORGIA, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia ("Grantee").

WHEREAS, Grantor is the owner of certain real property in the City of Fayetteville, County of Fayette, Georgia, legally described on <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, having the above-referenced Tax Parcel Number (the "Grantor Property"); and

WHEREAS, Grantor has agreed to grant to Grantee non-exclusive easement over and across a portion of the Grantor Property, to place, construct, operate, use, maintain, repair, replace, inspect and reconstruct a water line and related facilities, on and subject to the terms and conditions of this Easement, and as further provided below;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals, incorporated herein by this reference, and for value received, Grantor, does hereby grant to Grantee, a non-exclusive easement to place, construct, operate, use, maintain, repair, replace, inspect and reconstruct a water line and related facilities (the "Water Line Facilities") in, over, under, across and through that part of the Grantor Property legally described and depicted on <a href="Exhibit B">Exhibit B</a> attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof (the "Easement Area"), to support or accommodate the Water Line Facilities within such Easement Area. Grantee shall have the non-exclusive right of ingress to and egress from the rights of way adjoining the Grantor Property, and over and across private roads, and driveways which may now or hereafter exist on the Grantor Property for access to the Easement Area. All rights of ingress and egress shall be exercised only as needed for access to the Easement Area from Flat Creek Trail and in such manner as shall cause the least practicable damage to and interference with the Grantor Property and use thereof.

Grantor, in addition to the above, hereby expressly grants to Grantee, its successors and assigns, the right to trim, cut or remove all trees, shrubs, and other vegetation lying wholly or partially situated within the Easement Area, that in Grantee's reasonable judgment endangers or will endanger the safety of, interfere with or encroach upon the use of the Water Line Facilities.

The Water Line Facilities located within the Easement Area shall be owned and maintained by Grantee at Grantee's sole cost and expense.

Grantor retains, reserves and shall continue to enjoy the use of the Easement Area for any purposes that do not unreasonably interfere with Grantee's use thereof, as permitted under this Easement. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Grantor shall have the right to, to install landscaping, driveways, and to grant additional non-exclusive easements to others in, over, under, across and through the Easement Area and permit additional utility lines (including fiber and telecommunication lines and facilities) and other installations, so long as: (i) Grantor shall not erect or construct or permit to be erected or constructed any building, structure or similar improvement limiting access to or within the limits of the Easement Area; (ii) Grantor shall not permit the installation of any physical encroachments or obstacles that will materially impair Grantee's maintenance and operation of the Water Line Facilities.

Any work performed by Grantee on the Water Line Facilities or in connection with the construction, use, maintenance or operation thereof under this Easement, shall be in accordance with all applicable laws, rules, regulations and ordinances. In no event shall Grantee permit to be filed against the Grantor Property any mechanic's or other lien arising out of any such work by Grantee. Prior to Grantee's use of the Easement Area and the commencement of the installation or any removal, repair, replacement or maintenance of any of the Water Line Facilities, Grantee shall be solely responsible for obtaining and shall obtain (at Grantee's sole expense) all permits and approvals (including wetlands permits and approvals), bonds and authority required under any federal, state or local statute, rule, order, ruling, court decision or regulation.

Following any disturbance of the Easement Area or any other part of the Grantor Property by Grantee, caused by Grantee, its agents, employees and/or contractors, Grantee agrees to return the Easement Area and/or any other part of the Grantor Property disturbed to as near its predisturbance condition as is practicable. If Grantee disturbs any physical encroachments or obstacles installed by Grantor and that materially impaired Grantee's maintenance and operation of the Water Line Facilities, the cost to return such encroachments and/or obstacles to predisturbance condition shall be borne by Grantor.

Grantee shall protect, indemnify, defend and hold Grantor, its agents, customers, employees and invitees (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") harmless from and against any and all third party claims for loss, damage, liability, injury to person or property, including reasonable costs and expenses incurred by the Indemnified Parties on account of any claim or assertion of liability arising or alleged to have arisen out of the use of the Easement Area or the rights and/or privileges granted herein, including by reason of Grantee's access to, use of, or operation of the Water Line Facilities or the installation, excavation, maintenance, repair or other work performed by Grantee within the Easement Area. Grantee's indemnification obligations hereunder shall not be applicable to any claims to the extent caused by the negligence, intentional acts or omissions or willful misconduct of the Indemnified Parties.

It is expressly understood and agreed that this Easement and the easements granted herein are granted subject to all currently existing recorded easements, agreements, covenants, restrictions and conditions, if any, affecting the Easements Area, or any part thereof, or the Grantor Property. Grantor covenants that (i) it has the right to grant and convey the easements and all other rights, privileges and easements conveyed herein; (ii) subject to the immediately preceding sentence, Grantee shall have quiet and peaceable possession, use and enjoyment thereof; and (iii) Grantor shall execute such further assurances thereof as may be required by Grantee.

This Easement, and the terms, covenants and provisions set forth herein, shall run with the land and inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Grantor and Grantee, and their respective successors and assigns in perpetuity.

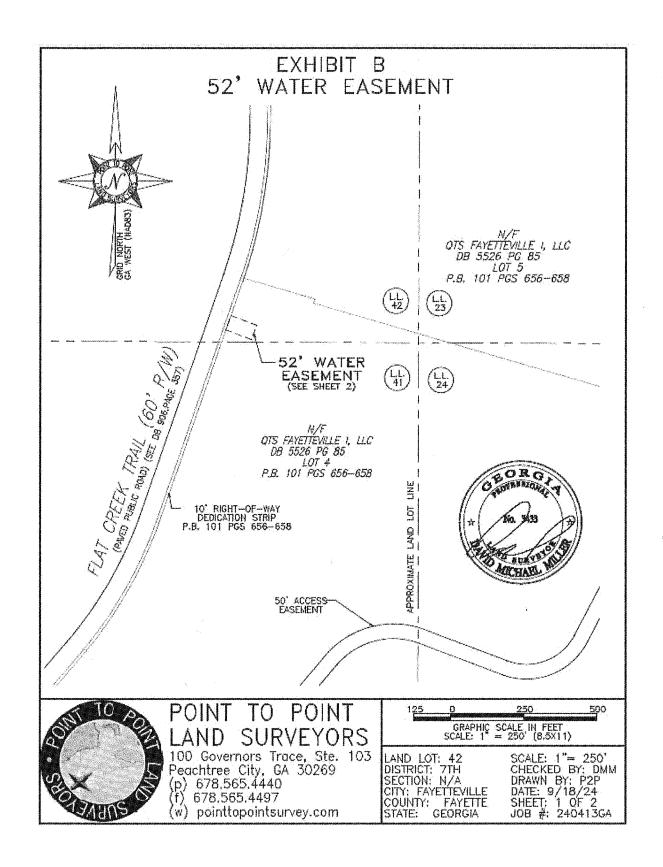

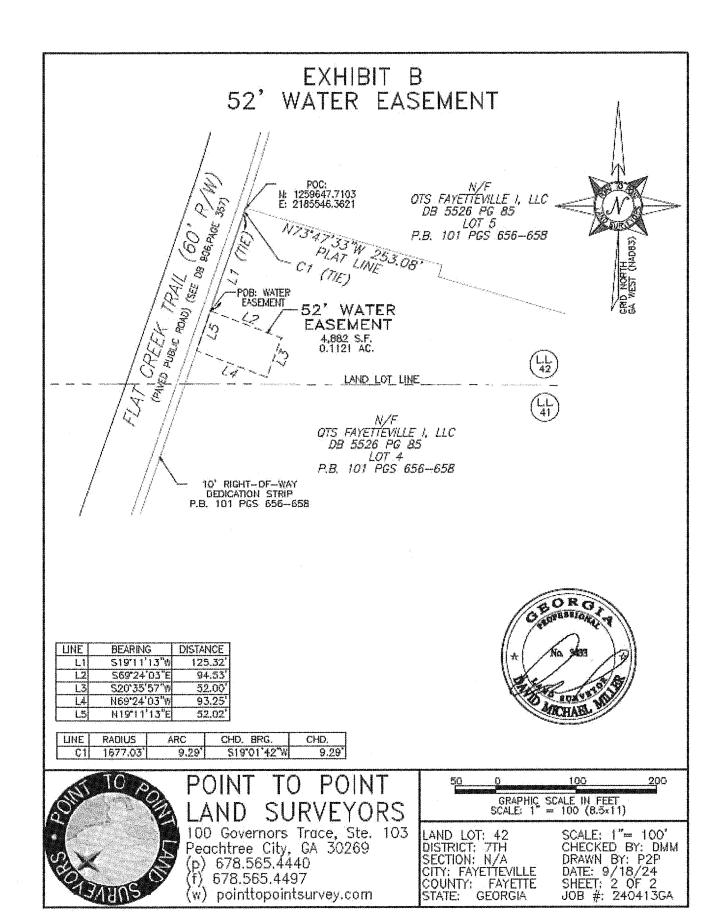

On August 20, 2025, the Purchasing Department issued a Request for Quotes 26028-A to secure a contractor to resurface several tennis, basketball and pickle ball courts. Notice of the opportunity was emailed to 10 companies. Another 289 were contacted through the webbased Georgia Procurement Registry, who had registered under commodity code # 91235 (Construction, Tennis and Sports Court) and #91265 (Maintenance and Repair, Tennis and Sport Court). The offer was also advertised through Georgia Local Government Access Marketplace.

Four (4) quotes were received (Attachment 1). The lowest bidder for each of the six courts offered a 5% discount if all courts included in the solicitation were resurfaced. This brings the quoted price of \$68,800 to \$65,360.

The Parks and Recreation Department recommends awarding Signature Tennis Courts, Inc to resurface the six courts to take advantage of the discount offer. With the current budget for court resurfacing \$36,133, Parks and Recreation is asking the board to approve a transfer of \$29,227 from Park Contingency. A Contractor Performance Evaluations is attached (Attachment 2).

September 25, 2025 5:00 p.m.

Welcome to the meeting of your Fayette County Board of Commissioners. Your participation in County government is appreciated. All regularly scheduled Board meetings are open to the public and are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month at 5:00 p.m.

#### **OFFICIAL SESSION:**

#### Call to Order

Vice Chairman Edward Gibbons called the September 25, 2025 Board of Commissioners meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. A quorum of the Board was present. Chairman Lee Hearn was absent.

#### Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance by Commissioner Eric Maxwell

Commissioner Eric Maxwell gave the Invocation and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **Acceptance of Agenda**

Commissioner Charles Oddo moved to approve the agenda as written. Commissioner Maxwell seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Chairman Lee Hearn was absent.

#### PROCLAMATION/RECOGNITION:

#### **PUBLIC HEARING:**

Planning and Zoning Director Deborah Bell read the Public Hearing process and procedures.

1. Consideration of Ordinance 2025-04 amending Chapter 110. Zoning Ordinance, regarding Article VII. Zoning Board of Appeals. Sec. 110-242. - Powers and duties.

Ms. Bell stated that staff was presenting a recommendation to amend Sec. 110-242. Powers and Duties. She advised that the amendment addressed the powers and duties of the Zoning Board of Appeals. It provided criteria for variances for unimproved nonconforming lots. The Planning Commission also recommended Ordinance 2025-04 to amend Chapter 110. Zoning Ordinance, regarding Article VII. Zoning Board of Appeals. Sec. 110-242. - Powers and duties for approval. She noted that the attached staff report detailed the proposed amended language. Ms. Bell stated that there were some existing nonconforming lots in the County that did not meet the criteria for minimum lot size in their zoning districts but might otherwise support the development of a single-family home. Staff prepared a graphic showing the required elements for a single-family home on a typical 1-acre lot. This included the house, driveway, well with buffer, septic tank, primary septic field and backup septic field. There would still be space for an accessory structure or a pool to be added to the property in most instances. In addition, the State Department of Environmental Health has a 1-acre minimum lot size requirement for homes served by well and septic system. She added that there were other variables that would affect the approval of the septic system, such as the size of the

house, number of bedrooms, and the presence or absence of suitable soil, lot shape and topography. This did not supersede the requirements of the Health Department, which may have additional criteria, depending on each individual project.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

Chief Financial Officer Sheryl Weinmann stated that the next three items were requests for appointment to the Public Facilities Authority. Ms. Weinmann stated that some of the duties included the issuance of bonds for the acquisition, construction, equipping, maintaining, and operating of building and facilities. She stated that based on County Policy 100.19 which states that, "If less than one year remains at the time an individual is appointed to fill such a vacancy, that individual shall also be reappointed to the position for the next successive term." The Selection Committee recommended appointment of the next successive term, July 24, 2026 to July 23, 2027.

Commissioner Oddo moved to approve to reappoint Thomas Gray to the Public Facilities Authority for a term beginning July 24, 2025 and expiring July 23, 2026, and to extend said appointment to the next successive term ending July 23, 2027 per County Policy 100.19; Board Appointments. Commissioner Maxwell seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Chairman Hearn was absent.

Commissioner Maxwell seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Chairman Hearn was absent.

11. Request to award Bid #26015-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBJ Darren Drive Culvert Replacement to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$1,404,158.93.

Public Works Director Phil Mallon stated that this request was to award Bid #26015-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBJ Darren Drive Culvert Replacement to Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$1,404,158.93. Mr. Mallon stated that this was a very complicated project. The project consisted of removing the existing deteriorating triple 96-inch corrugated metal pipes conveying Shoal Creek below Darren Drive and replacing with triple 9-foot x 9-foot and triple 9-foot x 5-foot concrete box culverts. This project also included utility coordination and/or relocation, grading, and asphalt paving. Mr. Mallon highlighted that the County had worked with Piedmont Paving on past project and was happy with their performance.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve to award Bid #26015-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBJ Darren Drive Culvert Replacement to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$1,404,158.93. Commissioner Oddo seconded.

Commissioner Maxwell stated that he was concerned with the large variance in the bid amounts received for this project.

Mr. Mallon stated that based only on speculation, he knew Piedmont Paving had recently started in the pre-cast culvert business, where they would be able to manufacture the culverts [according to appropriate standards] themselves. As a result, some of the work they are about to do in-house, while other companies still have to outsource, which would contribute to the price variance seen via the other bids.

County Administrator Steve Rapson also advised that he had noticed the variance in the bid amounts and reached out to the vendors to ensure they understood the project scope and specifications.

Vice Chairman Gibbons moved to approve to award Bid #26015-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBJ Darren Drive Culvert Replacement to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$1,404,158.93. Commissioner Oddo seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Chairman Hearn was absent.

12. Request to award Bid #26016-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBK Mark Lane Culvert Replacement to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$476,388.72 and to reallocate \$99,437 from 17SAS Stormwater Improvement Plans CAT IV.

Mr. Mallon stated that this item was to award Bid #26016-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBK Mark Lane Culvert Replacement to Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$476,388.72 and to reallocate \$99,437 from 17SAS Stormwater Improvement Plans CAT IV. Mr. Mallon stated that he failed to mention that the construction schedule was 215 days for completion from the notice to proceed for the previous project item #11, and because this was a simpler project the construction schedule was 150 days for completion.

Commissioner Oddo moved to approve to award Bid #26016-B: 2017 SPLOST; Stormwater Category II, Tier II; 19SBK Mark Lane Culvert Replacement to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, Piedmont Paving, Inc., in the amount of \$476,388.72 and to reallocate \$99,437 from 17SAS Stormwater Improvement Plans CAT IV. Commissioner Maxwell seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Chairman Hearn was absent.

13. Request to accept an \$800,000 federal-aid grant from Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) for the Preconstruction Engineering (PE) of the Sandy Creek Road at Eastin Road/Sams Drive/Trustin Lake Drive Intersection Improvement project (I-2) and approval for the Chairman to execute the Project Framework Agreement (PFA) with Georgia Department of Transportation.

Mr. Mallon stated that this item was seeking Board approval to accept an \$800,000 federal-aid grant from Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) for the Preconstruction Engineering (PE) of the Sandy Creek Road at Eastin Road/Sams Drive/Trustin Lake Drive Intersection Improvement project (I-2) and approval for the Chairman to execute the Project Framework Agreement (PFA) with Georgia Department of Transportation. He stated that the Board approved staff to apply to the ARC in response to their open solicitation for Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) projects. Mr. Mallon stated that the County was awarded funding. If the Board approves acceptance, next steps in this process would be to present before the Board a design contract to a qualified vendor. Mr. Mallon noted that the estimated total cost of this project was \$5M, with the design work costing about \$1M and the grant award being \$800K.

Commissioner Oddo moved to approve to accept an \$800,000 federal-aid grant from Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) for the Preconstruction Engineering (PE) of the Sandy Creek Road at Eastin Road/Sams Drive/Trustin Lake Drive Intersection Improvement project (I-2) and approval for the Chairman to execute the Project Framework Agreement (PFA) with Georgia Department of Transportation. Commissioner Maxwell seconded. The motion passed 4-0. Chairman Hearn was absent.

Mr. Rapson stated that he provided the Board with the Hot Topics with updates to the Parks and Recreation Multi-Use Facility, Starrs Mill Tunnel, and Coastline Bridge Improvements, North Bend Ct. Culvert Replacement, and the QTS Traffic Signal and guardrail project. He also advised that an email regarding the Brooks/school system adjacent road project was sent discussing the project status.

Mr. Rapson advised that staff propose that the October 9<sup>th</sup> BOC Meeting be cancelled. There are currently no agenda items and both leadership staff and some of the Board would be traveling to attend the ACCG Legislative Leadership Conference.

Mr. Rapson also advised that the Digest had been reconciled so a Special Called Meeting would be convened on October 16<sup>th</sup> at 10 am and 6 pm to conduct the Public Hearings for the 2025 Property Tax Milliage Rate. The final Public Hearing would be held on October 23<sup>rd</sup>.

As a reminder Mr. Rapson outlined the end-of-year Board meeting schedule [which was approved last year] noting that there would only be one meeting in October (with the recent cancellation of the October 9<sup>th</sup> meeting), November, and December.

Variance Appeal Background - Memo

<u>Appeal Request by the property owner:</u> The owner of 170 Laydon Avenue is requesting an appeal to Environmental Managements Director, Bryan Keller, decision denying a variance for a home built within the watershed protection buffer and setbacks. The Board is asked to review the case record, consider the facts presented, and determine whether to **uphold or overturn** the Department's decision.

<u>Fayette County's Watershed Protection Ordinance</u> (Article VII, Fayette County Code): The ordinance establishes buffers and setbacks along state waters to protect water quality, control erosion, and maintain aquatic habitats. The ordinance is consistent with the Environmental Planning Criteria set forth by the state and required to keep Fayette County a Qualified Local Government. The required buffer must remain undisturbed, and the corresponding setback prohibits the placement of impervious surfaces within that area.

Background and Notification of Potential State Waters Requiring a Buffer: In April 2022, the Environmental Management Department, Deborah Sims (EMD) informed through email, Mr. Dwight Beadle that a stream visible on the 1993 USGS Riverdale quadrangle required a state waters determination before development could proceed at 170 Laydon Court (Lot 7, North Haven subdivision). This was reiterated to Mr. Beadle via email, by Brian Harris (EMD) in January 2023.

<u>Building Permit Submittals:</u> Multiple subsequent building permit applications submitted into the County's on-line permit application portal, SAGES, by YDG Design Group (Mr. Louis White) on behalf of Mr. Beadle, on **July 20, 2023**, **September 15, 2023**, and **July 8, 2024**, were all rejected at intake due to various deficiencies, preventing departmental review. Deficiencies for the most recent application were corrected on **July 23, 2024**, allowing distribution for review.

<u>Unauthorized Construction and Initial Enforcement:</u> During the review of the July 23, 2024, building permit application, EMD staff noticed unauthorized residential construction via aerial photography. This was confirmed during a site inspection on **July 26, 2024** by the Building Safety Department and EMD. A formal investigation on **July 30, 2024** found that Mr. White initiated the work without the required Land Disturbance or Building permit. The Building Safety Department issued **seven (7) citations** for starting work without an official permit and required approvals from Fayette County.

<u>Watershed Violation and State Waters Verification:</u> On August 8, 2024, Mr. Beadle granted EMD staff access to the site to perform a state water quality determination. Two EMD staff members, Todd Bethune and Richard Brooks, independently verified the presence of a **perennial stream**, (i.e., a stream that contains water year-round) which mandates adherence to the established Watershed Protection Buffer (100 feet) and the corresponding Setback (50 feet from the buffer). This determination was further verified by an independent consultant, **Mill Creek Environmental**, retained on behalf of Mr. Beadle, on **September 3, 2024**. EMD issued citations on **September 4,** 

**2024**, for land disturbance without a permit and for violation of the Fayette County Watershed Protection Ordinance. The resulting court case has undergone several continuances awaiting the decision of the Board of Commissioners, and staff is prepared to address any questions the Board may have regarding these associated legal matters.

Variance Application and Appeal to the Board of Commissioners (BOC): The property owner subsequently pursued the variance process outlined in the Ordinance. A variance application was submitted on July 10, 2025, and was formally denied by EMD on August 1, 2025. Documentation detailing the site, Ordinance, violations, prior communications regarding compliance options, and the variance denial decision is provided to the Board for review. The property owner on August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025 appealed the Environmental Management Department's variance denial to the Board of Commissioners in accordance with Sec. 104-184(c) of the ordinance. The Fayette County Building Official operates in an administrative capacity in this matter; as EMD has formally denied the application, Building Safety cannot issue a building permit for 170 Laydon Avenue.

Mr. Beadle,

The building permit application submitted in SageGov on July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024, for the home at 170 Laydon Ave has been denied by the Fayette County Environmental Management Department.

On July 26, 2024, a building permit was applied for this lot. Upon review, it was discovered that construction of a residential structure had already began.

On April 14, 2022, Deborah Sims sent you an email to dwightbeadle@yahoo.com (enclosed), which included a property evaluation form. This form stated: "The 1993 USGS Quadrangle for Riverdale, GA, identifies a stream on the property. A state waters determination is required to assess whether the stream necessitates buffers." The same property evaluation form was sent to you by Brian Harris on January 1, 2023 (enclosed).

On August 8, 2024, you signed and returned a "Permission to Enter Private Property" form, allowing Fayette County staff to visit the site to determine if state waters requiring a buffer were present on the property. On August 16, 2024, two inspectors independently visited the site. Both confirmed that the stream on the property is perennial, which requires a buffer. Lot 7 of North Haven falls within the Flint River Watershed.

ARTICLE VII. - WATERSHED PROTECTION (formally Watershed Protection Areas) is as follows:

- (f) The following shall apply to all other perennial streams within the Flint River and Whitewater Creek Watersheds and all state waters requiring a buffer within 1,000 feet of the streams named in this section.
  - (1) The minimum watershed buffer shall be 100 feet from wrested vegetation or 50 feet from 100-year floodplain elevation, whichever is greater; and
  - (2) The minimum watershed setback shall be 50 feet as measured from the buffer.

After conducting both desktop and field measurements, I've determined that a significant portion of the structure is located within the watershed protection buffer and setback.

Citations will be issued for the structure within the watershed protection buffer and setback and land disturbance without a permit.

Additionally, a watershed buffer protection and replacement plan (as per Sec. 104-183 of the Watershed Protection Ordinance) is required.

On September 3, 2024, Mill Creek Environmental, LLC (MCE) conducted a site reconnaissance to identify the presence of streams with buffer areas that would be regulated by the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD) and Fayette County. The EPD regulates land disturbance along "buffered waters of the State" through the Erosion and Sedimentation Control Act of 1975 (E&S Act). Local land development regulations may require additional setbacks that are more restrictive than state buffer requirements.

The subject property is identified by the Fayette County Tax Assessors Office as Tax Parcel ID 055104007, totaling approximately 2 acres. Data was collected and recorded on North Carolina DWQ Stream Identification Forms. A site map showing the parcel and location of the identified features is included as **Figure 1**.

MCE identified the presence of one jurisdictional area. A Perennial stream, identified as Perennial Stream #1, is located approximately 100 feet southeast of Laydon Avenue. Perennial Stream #1 originates off the subject property and flows from the northeast to the southwest. Perennial Stream #1 is a jurisdictional feature regulated by the EPD and Fayette County and will require setbacks.

While conducting the EMD Plan Review for a proposed Residential New Structure, Brian looked at his software with the recent maps and noticed that the lot already showed a home built on the property. He printed out a copy to give to DBS to confirm if this was accurate.

9:30 am: Caitlin Reul, Nicole Anderson from DBS, and Todd Bethune from EMD visited the site. It was confirmed that the entire house was erected. We walked around the house, and the contractor, Louis White, was onsite and opened the inside for us, allowing us access to the house. Pictures of the interior and some of the exteriors were obtained.

Mr. White informed Nicole that he already had engineer letters to cover the work that had been completed. We explained to the contractor that we would be posting an SWO on-site, that no work would be continued on the property until a permit was issued and approved, and that the Building Official Leslie Nieber would reach out on Monday, July 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

10:03 am: A Stop Work Order was posted on the structure and above the permit box by the road. EMD posted an ESC-SWO. Todd explained to the contractor that the only work he could do would be to add rock to the construction exit and some temporary stabilization on the property.

July 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024—Nieber contacted Louis White, contractor, via phone and scheduled a meeting for July 30th, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. in her office.

July 30, 2024: Leslie Nieber and Louis White, the Contractor for the property at 170 Laydon Drive, met. Seven citations were issued to the contractor, with an advised court date. There were no issues with the issuance.

Clear direction was given for the presented plans, with corrections needed.

The pool excavation area was discussed, with an unsafe open hole in the ground. Action is required in the way of a demolition permit or permit application.

Nieber summary: Gross negligence regarding the Fayette County ordinances and requirements for obtaining an issued building permit was observed as an entire home was erected before the approval by Planning and Zoning, Environmental Management, and Building Safety.

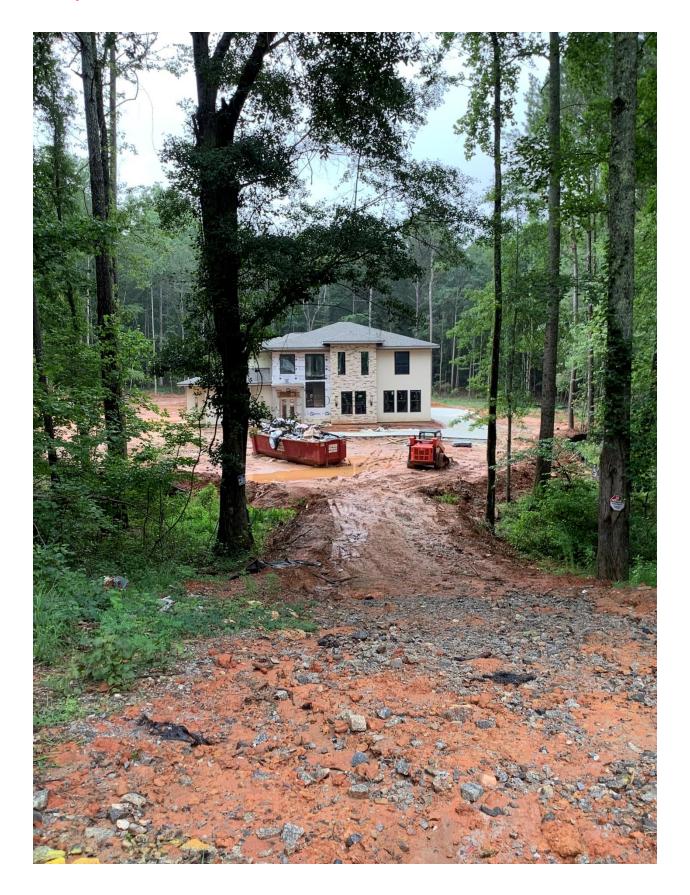

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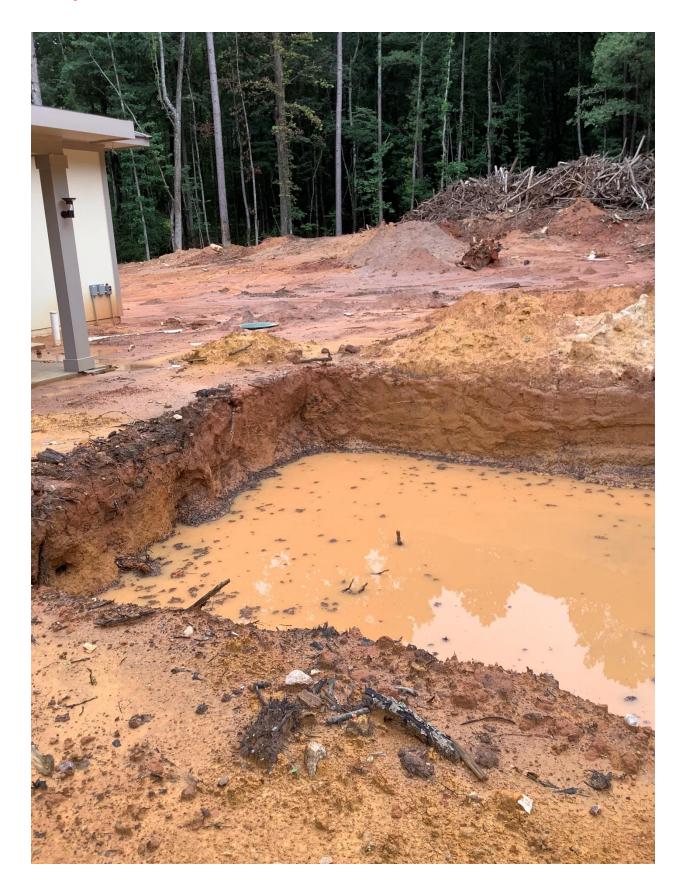
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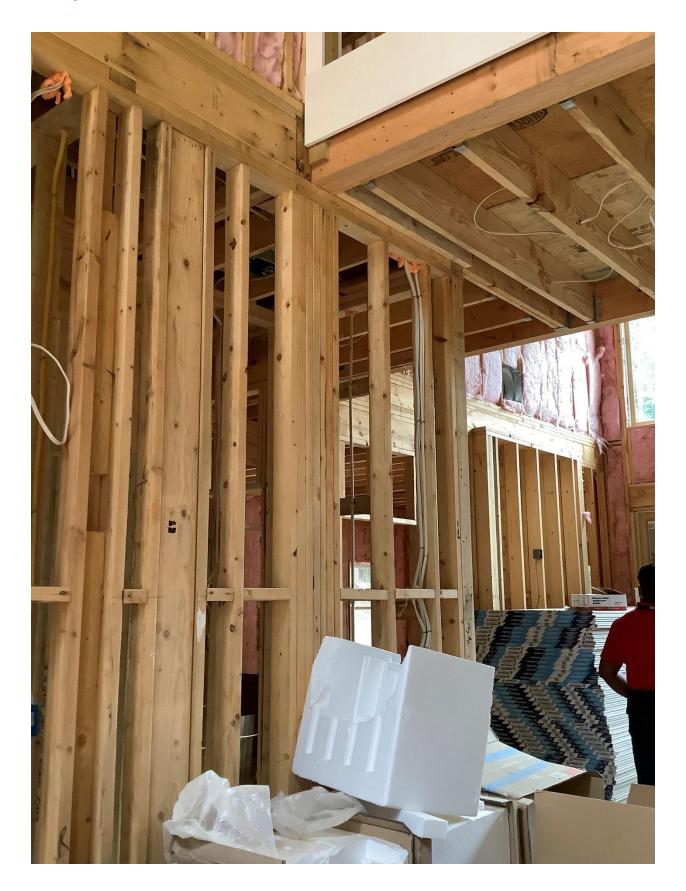


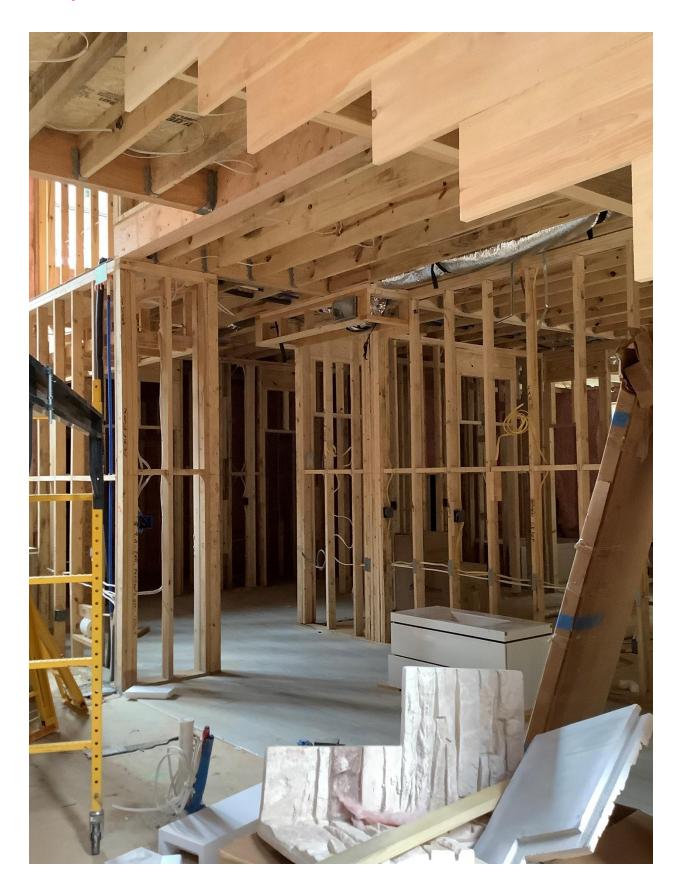


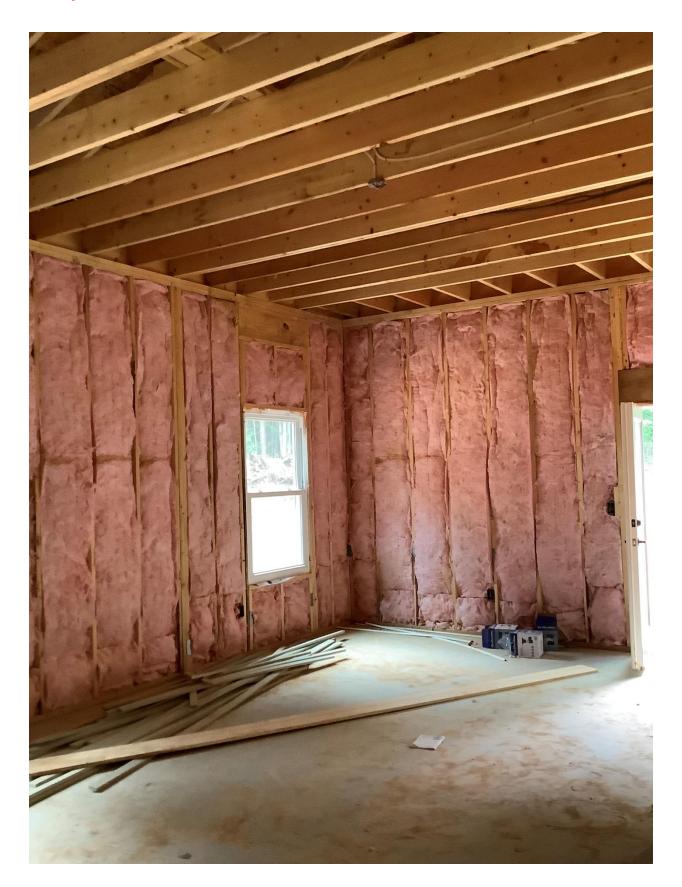


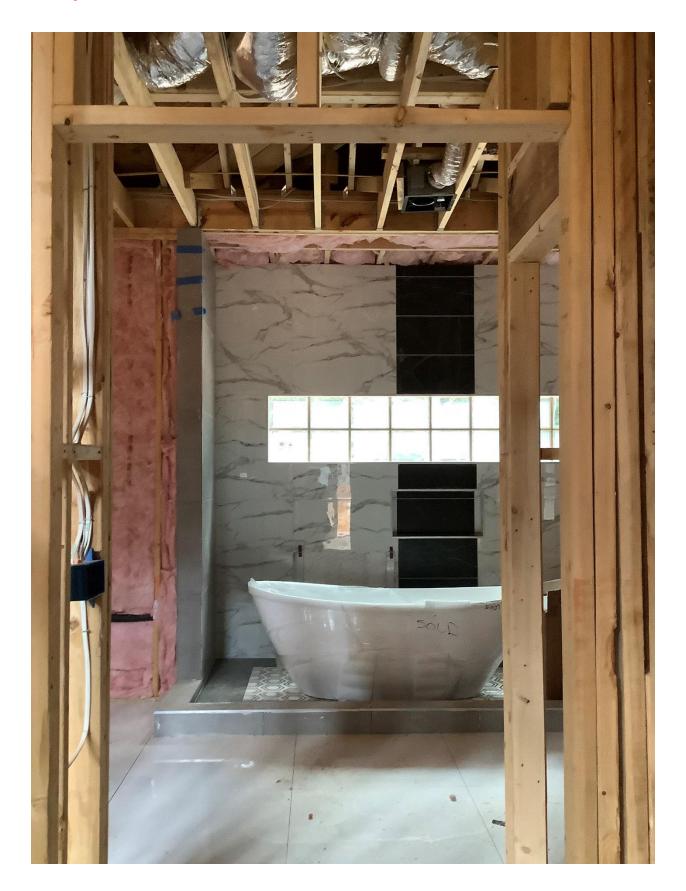


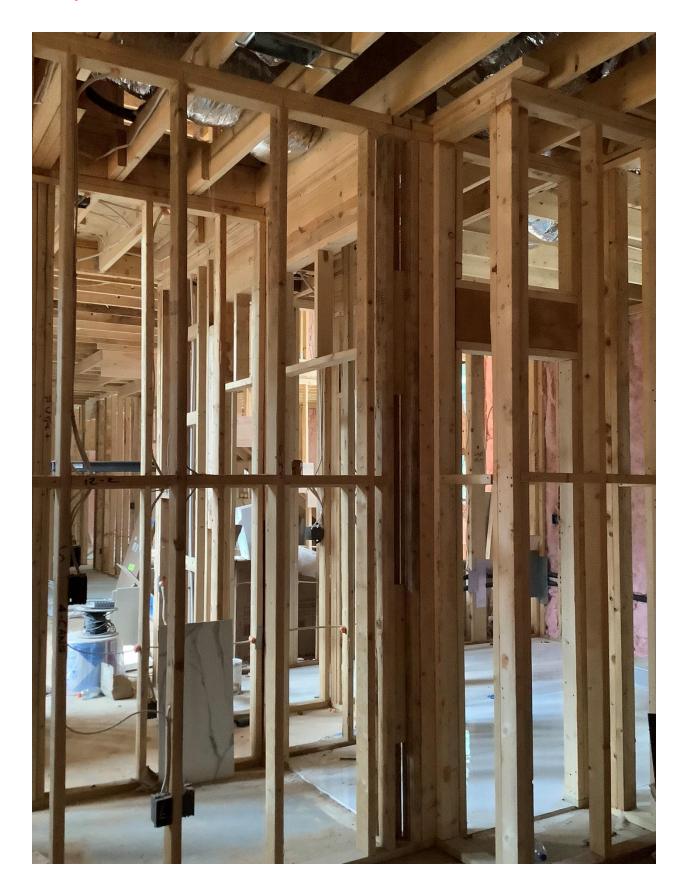




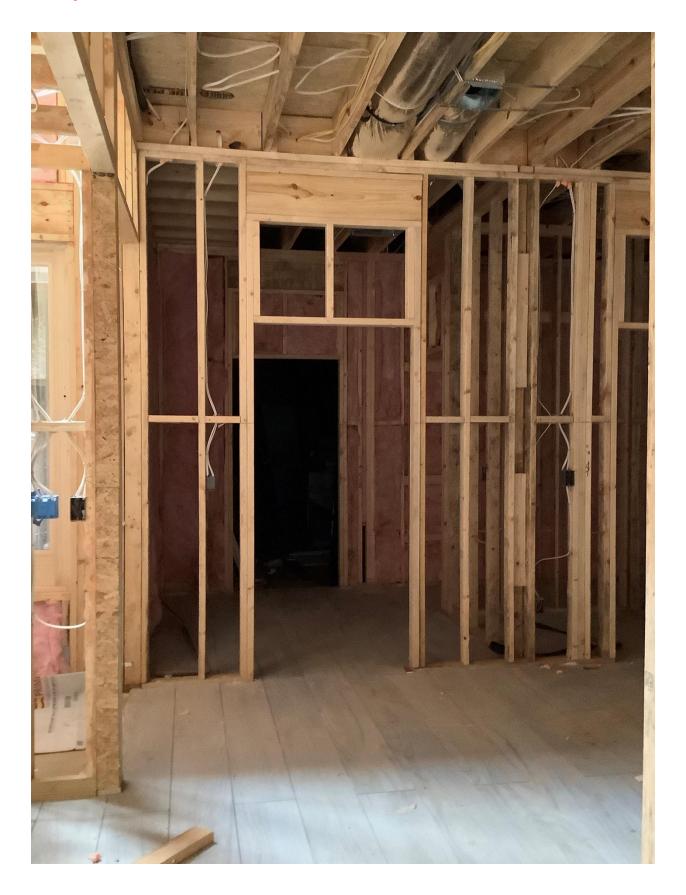


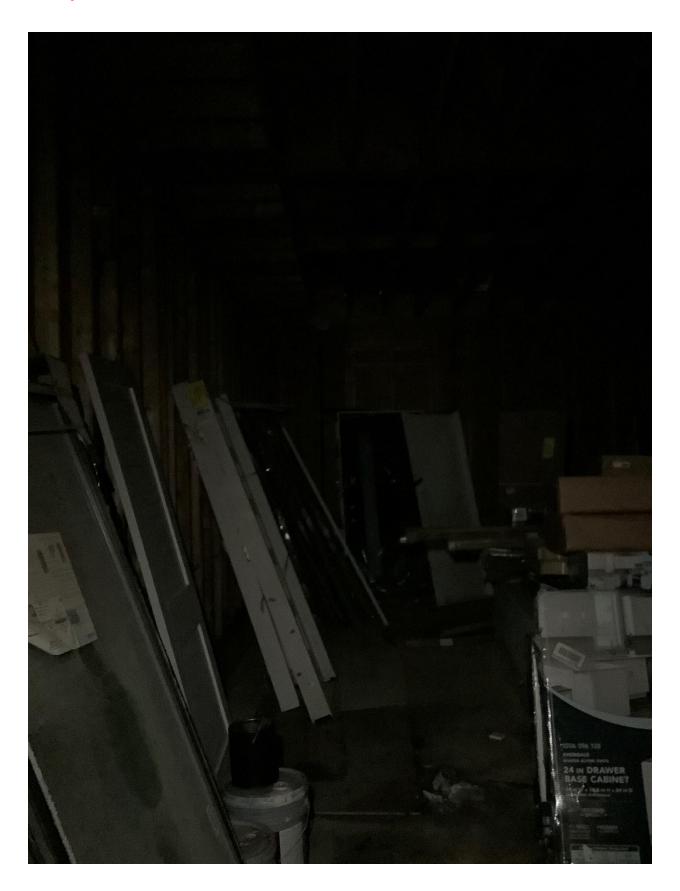








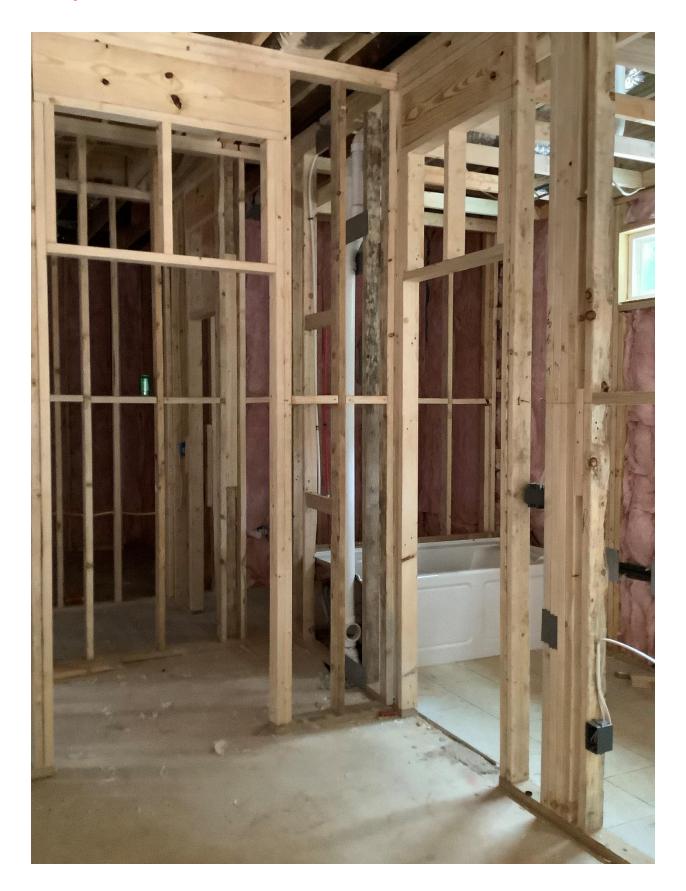






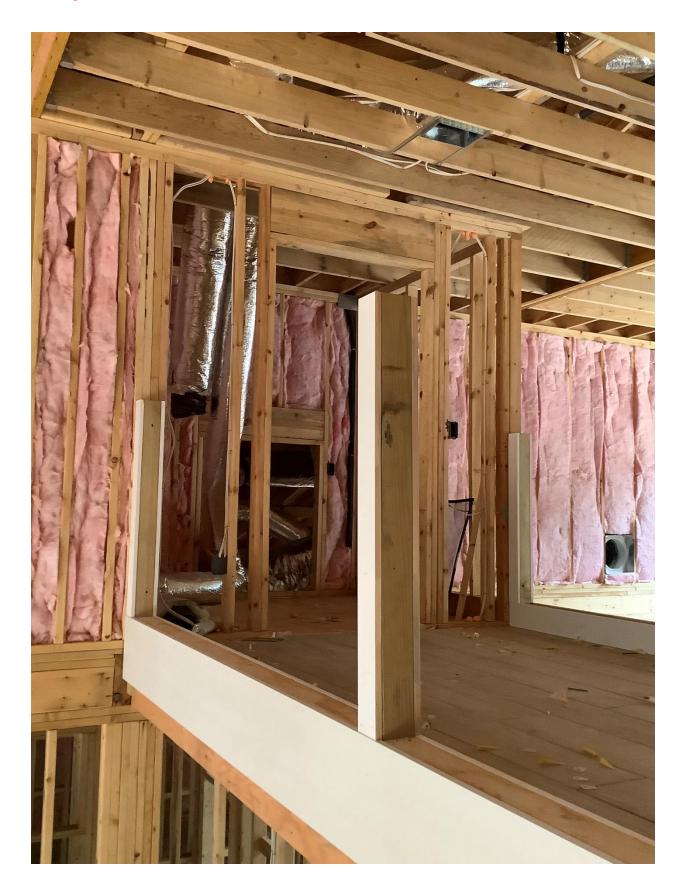


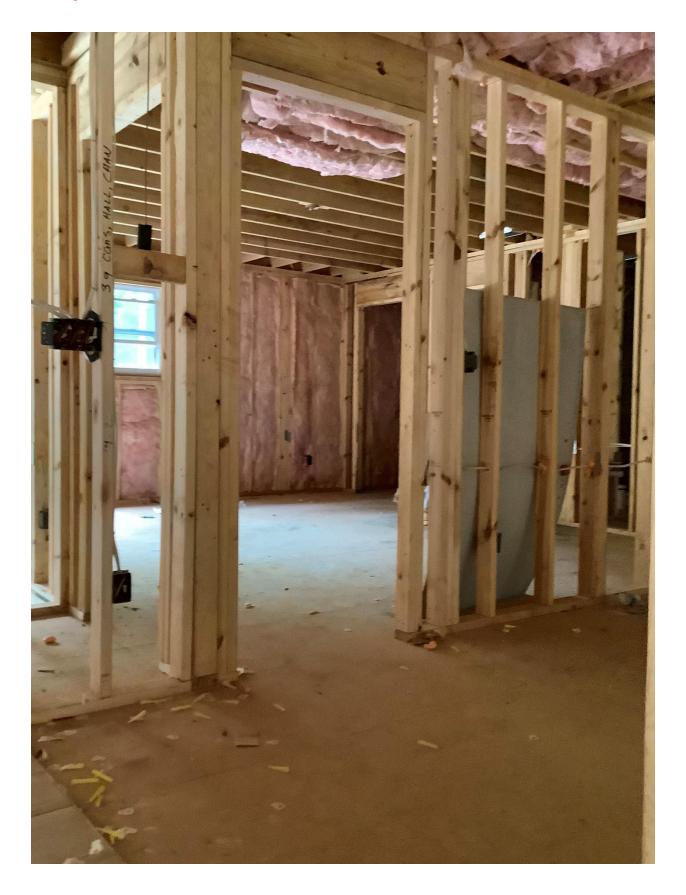


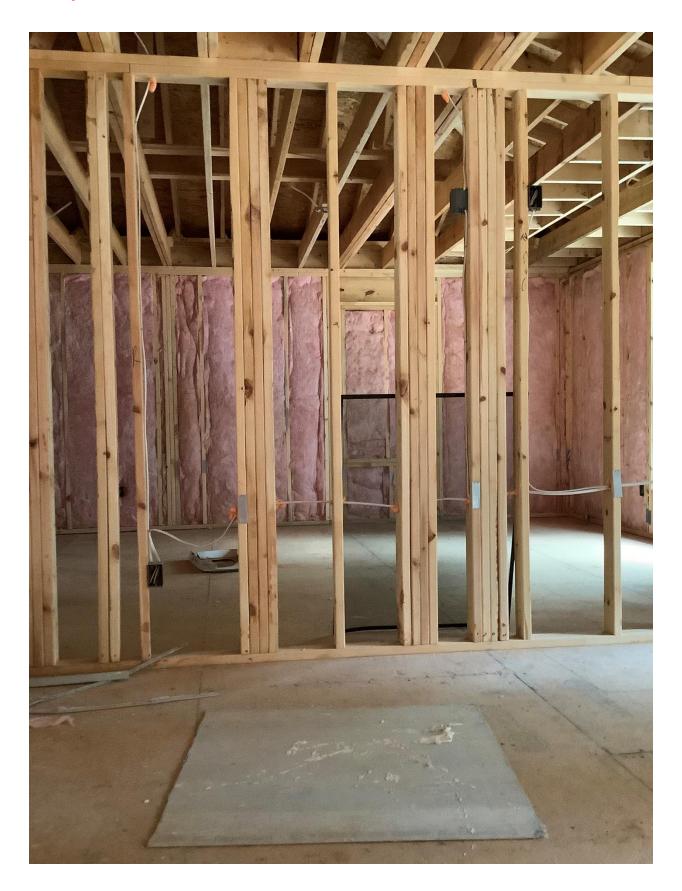




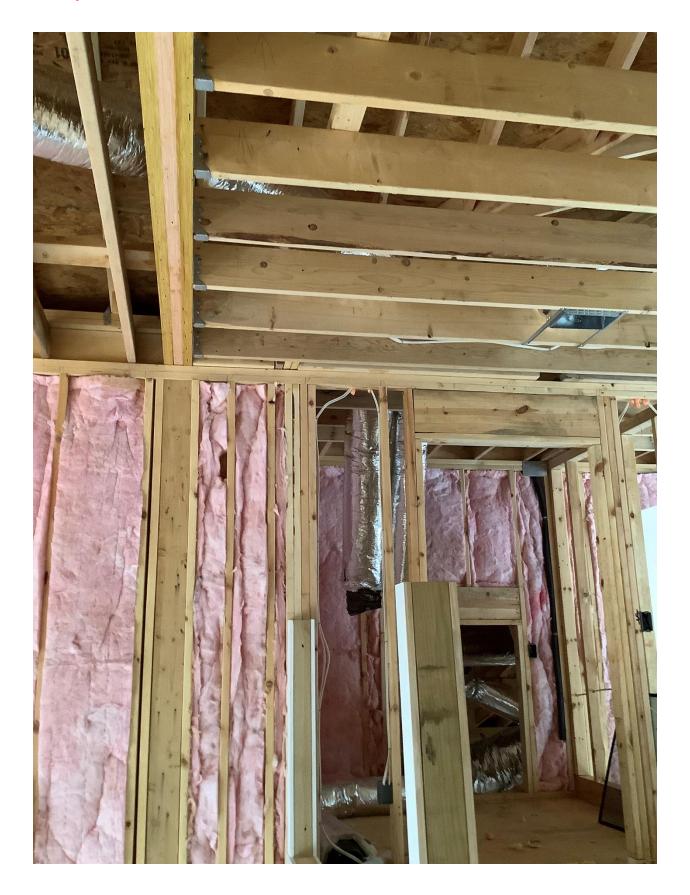


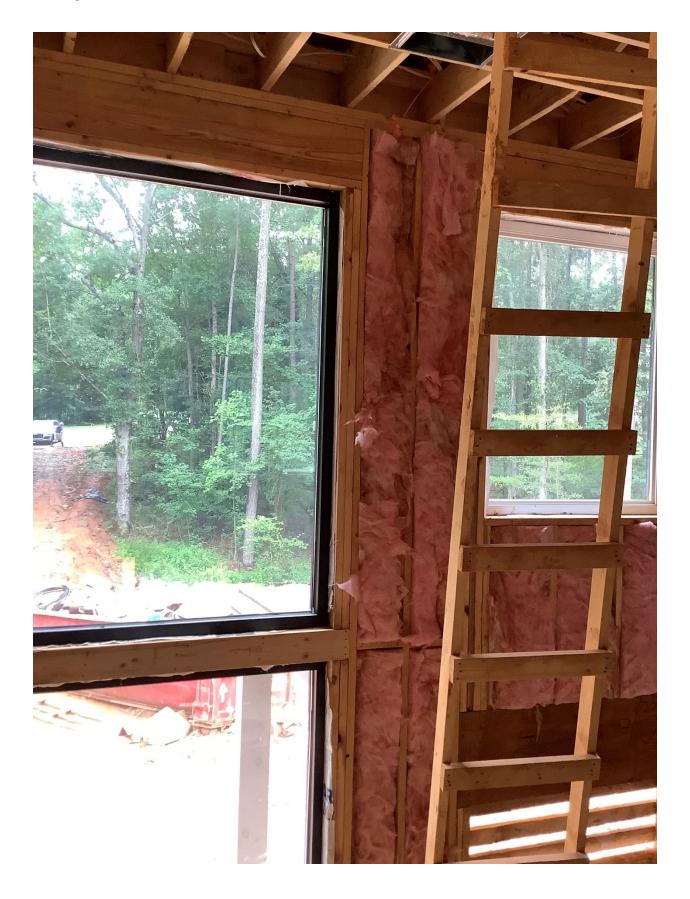
















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#### I. Introduction

This email provides a detailed chronological timeline of the permitting process for 170 Laydon Ave, permit number RNEW-07-24-073333, for your review. It includes a comprehensive account of the initial application errors, the Environmental Management Department (EMD) site visit, a Stop Work Order (SWO) issuance, subsequent meetings, and ongoing legal actions. This timeline highlights significant discrepancies between the submitted plans and the existing site conditions, culminating in multiple citations and a pending court case.

A request for a variance may be submitted by an applicant who has been denied a permit by the Environmental Management Department or by an owner or developer who has not previously applied for a permit for the reasons stated within the Fayette County Watershed Protection ordinance. A request for a variance may not be submitted when the recorded final plat defines a watershed buffer and setback.

# (a) A variance shall be issued only when all of the following conditions are met:

- When there are unusual circumstances, such that strict adherence to the minimal buffer/setback requirements in this article would create an extreme hardship.
- When necessary for the conduct of a functionally dependent use, provided the criteria of this section are met, no reasonable alternative exists, and the development is protected by methods that minimize buffer disturbances.
- (b) Any person requesting a variance shall, from the time of the request until the time the request is acted upon, submit such information and documentation as the environmental management department and the board of commissioners shall deem necessary to the consideration of the request.
- (c) Upon consideration of the factors listed below and the purposes of this ordinance, Environmental Management Department and the Fayette County Board of Commissioners may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as they deem necessary or appropriate, consistent with the purposes of this ordinance.
- (d) In reviewing requests the environmental management department (and the board of commissioners when considering an appeal pursuant to subsection (c) of this section) shall consider all technical evaluations, relevant factors, and all standards specified in the watershed protection ordinance.
- (e) Any person to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice specifying the difference between the current buffers and setbacks requirements and the buffers and setbacks allowed by the variance.

The following factors will be considered in determining whether to issue a variance:

- The shape, size, topography, slope, soils, vegetation and other physical characteristics of the property;
- 2. The locations of all streams on the property, including along property boundaries;
- 3. The location and extent of the proposed buffer or setback intrusion; and,
- Whether alternative designs are possible which require less intrusion or no intrusion;
- 5. The long-term and construction water-quality impacts of the proposed variance; and,
- Whether issuance of the variance is at least as protective of natural resources and the environment.

# **Factors Supporting Request for Variance**

A variance is appropriate for issuance in this matter as there are unusual circumstances, such that strict adherence to the minimal buffer/setback requirements of the Watershed Protection ordinance would create an extreme hardship as explained and set forth below. In addition, for any use of the property in question, no reasonable alternative development exists. The applicant is proposing a mitigation plan to protect the stream from the buffer disturbance.

The factors and circumstances that support the issuance of a variance are as follows:

- Mr. Beadle is innocent of any wrongdoing and did not cause the intrusion into the 1. Watershed Protection area. Mr. Beadle hired a licensed contractor to construct the home on 170 Laden Avenue and depended upon the contractor to comply with all local ordinances and state law. In 2022, prior to any construction work on the house, Mr. Beadle was informed by Deborah Sims that a stream is identified on the property and a state waters determination is needed. (See Environmental Management - Property Evaluation dated 4/14/2022 attached as Exhibit "A".) However, the Property Evaluation also states, "This lot is eligible to receive a land disturbance permit prior to the building permit." A surveyor was hired by the contractor to determine the exact location of the stream. The survey prepared in April of 2023 shows a stream but also shows the 25' state buffer. The survey does not show any additional buffers or setbacks. (See survey prepared by Hurd Prince & Associates, Inc. dated April 25, 2023 attached as Exhibit "B".) Based on the survey, the contractor gave assurance to Mr. Beadle that the lot was buildable. The contractor selected the location for the house to be outside of the 25' state buffer and outside of the building setbacks. Mr. Beadle was not involved in that process other than agreeing to the location selected for the house, but when doing so he had no knowledge of required setbacks and buffers. He depended on his contractor and surveyor for that. Mr. Beadle trusted his contractor and for good reason. The same contractor had previously built a house for Mr. Beadle in Legacy Hills in the northern part of Fayette County with no issues. As such, Mr. Beadle was comfortable with the information provided to him by his contractor, which appeared to be confirmed by the surveyor.
- 2. The lot in question was plated in October of 1998. (See plat dated October 27, 1998 recorded in Plat Book 31, Page 182 attached as Exhibit "C".) While I have not been able to locate a copy of the ordinance in effect in October of 1998, the ordinance found in the 2007 Code adopted on January 14, 1998, amended on June 22, 2000 and again on June 9, 2005 required a 50' undisturbed natural buffer and 75' setback measured from the stream bank and not from the edge of the buffer. (See Section 8-203(10)(a) & (b) attached as Exhibit "D".) I assume the 2000 and 2005 amendments to the watershed protection ordinance did not decrease any buffers in place prior to that date. Thus, I assume that the required buffer and setback in 1998 would not have been any greater than those in effect in 2000 and 2005, which were 75' from the stream bank.

The current ordinance, which requires the 100' buffer and 50' setback measured from the buffer, was adopted in 2019, twenty-one years after the property was platted. The current buffer and setback make the lot unbuildable. (See the Existing Conditions site plan

prepared by Highland Land Planning and yellow dotted line showing the 150' impervious surface setback attached as Exhibit "E".) With the current required 150' buffer and setback, the lot is not buildable. Pushing the house back behind the 150' impervious surface setback forces an encroachment into the 30' building setbacks of the southern and eastern property lines. Additionally, the limited buildable area is not large enough for a septic system. The property is 2.02 acres in size. The buildable area is about 1/6 to 1/5 of the property – far less than the one acre minimum required by the County for a septic system. The lot was buildable when platted in 1998 since the 75' setback leaves sufficient area to build the house. (See the yellow dotted line showing the 75' impervious surface setback on Exhibit "E".) It is not now buildable with the current impervious surface setback.

- 3. Mr. Beadle obtained a construction loan from United Community Bank to build his house. The house is almost complete (see attached photo of the house attached as Exhibit "F"), and the loan proceeds are almost depleted. Mr. Beadle does not have the funds to tear down the house and start over on another lot. If Mr. Beadle were to default on the loan, United Community Bank is not likely to foreclose on the property as it will not want to have the liability associated with the property, the responsibility for demolishing the house, and be stuck with an unbuildable lot. Thus, the most likely scenario if the variance is not granted is that the house will remain in its current state of completion, remain vacant, deteriorate, and become a nuisance to the community and the County.
- 4. Mr. Beadle hired Jason Walls of Highland Land Planning to prepare an effective mitigation plan to alleviate the issues caused by the unintended encroachment. (See mitigation plan attached as Exhibit "G". I will send the plan electronically so that they may be enlarged and revised more closely than is possible on the printed copies.) The mitigation plan, which will be expensive to implement, is designed to rectify and address the problem so that water discharged into the perennial stream does so at a quality commensurate with that if the encroachment had not occurred and at a flow rate that would have existed had the encroachment not occurred.
- Finally, if the County has additional measures it would like to see in the mitigation plan short of demolishing the house, Mr. Beadle is willing to consider those and adding them to the mitigation plan.

# Floodplain

There is a piped drainage easement shared with North Haven, Lot 6.

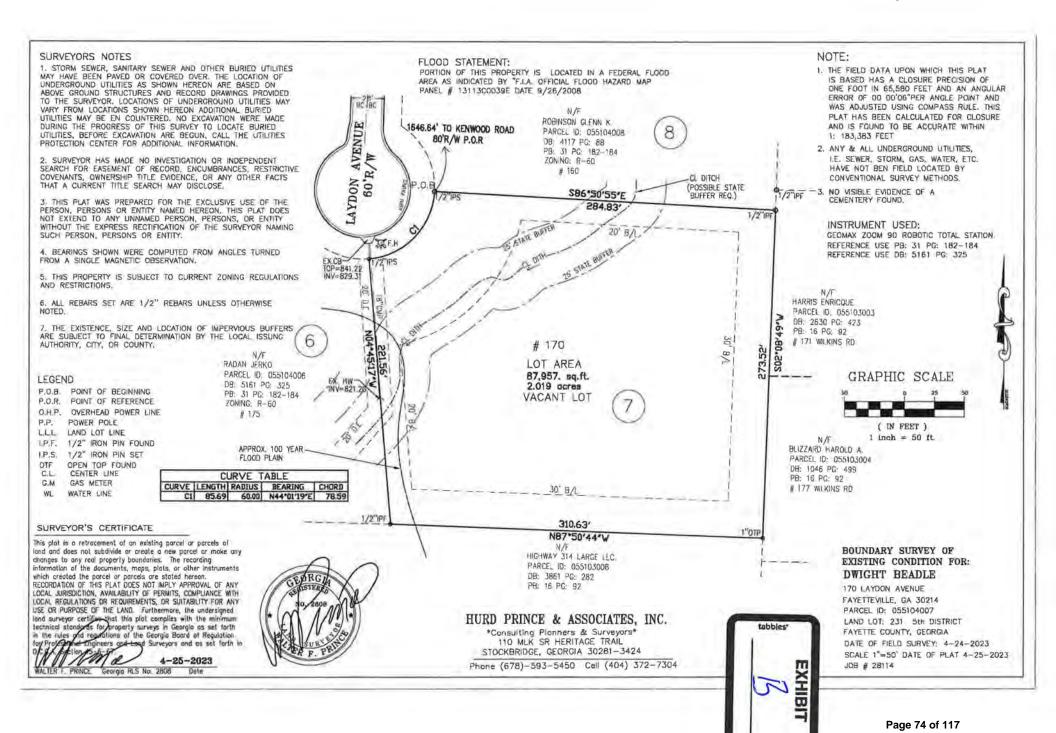

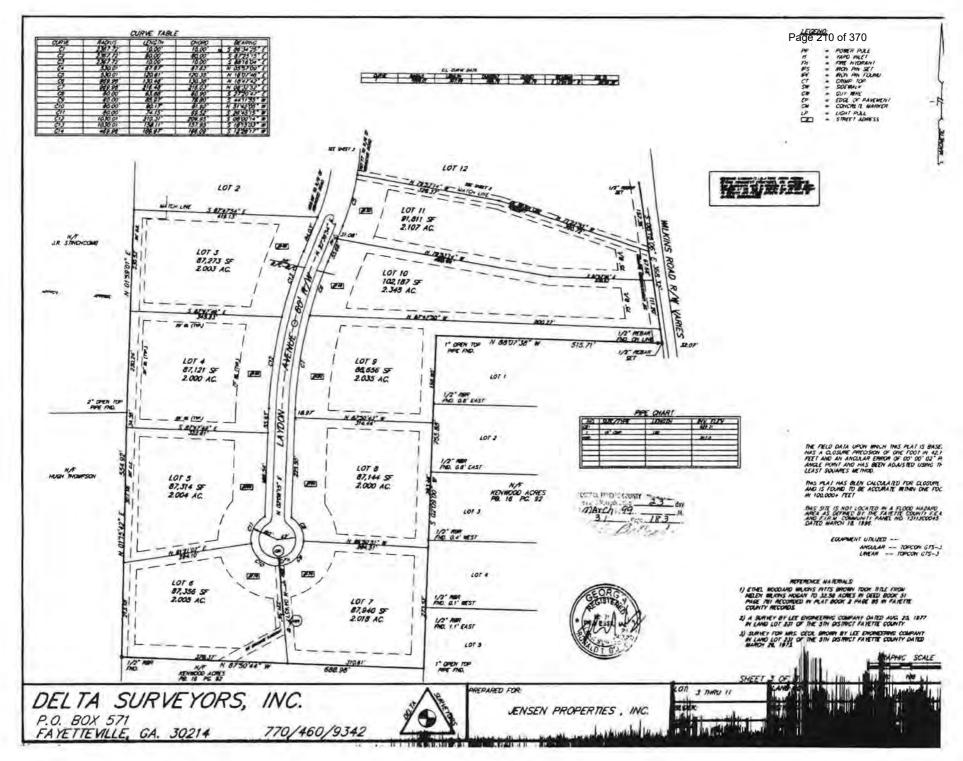
A state waters determination is required to determine if the stream identified on the 1993 USGS Quadrangle is a perennial stream. If it is a perennial stream or if an acre or more is disturbed, an approved erosion control plan following the Stand Alone Checklist is required. This lot is eligible to receive a land disturbance permit prior to the building permit.

    - 1. Minimum natural buffer—Four hundred (400) feet as measured from the stream bank, or one hundred (100) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.
    - 2. Minimum lot size—Residential: per zoning ordinance; and commercial: two (2) acres.

    - 2. Minimum natural buffer—Two hundred (200) feet as measured from the stream bank or one hundred (100) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.
    - 3. Minimum setback for all structures, nitrification fields, and impervious surfaces—Two hundred fifty (250) feet as measured from the stream bank or one hundred fifty (150) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.

    - 1. Minimum lot size—Five (5) acres
    - 2. Minimum natural buffer—Two hundred (200) feet as measured from the stream bank or one hundred (100) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.
    - 3. Minimum setback for all structures, nitrification fields, and impervious surfaces—Two hundred fifty (250) feet as measured from the stream bank or one hundred fifty (150) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.

    - 2. Minimum natural buffer—One hundred (100) feet as measured from the stream bank or fifty (50) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.
    - 3. Minimum setback for all structures, nitrification fields, and impervious surfaces—One hundred fifty (150) feet as measured from the stream bank or one hundred (100) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.
    - 4. No multi-family residential or manufactured home park uses allowed.

# b. Permitted agricultural uses:

1. Minimum natural buffer—One hundred (100) feet as measured from the stream bank or fifty (50) feet from the 100-year flood plain elevation, whichever is greater.

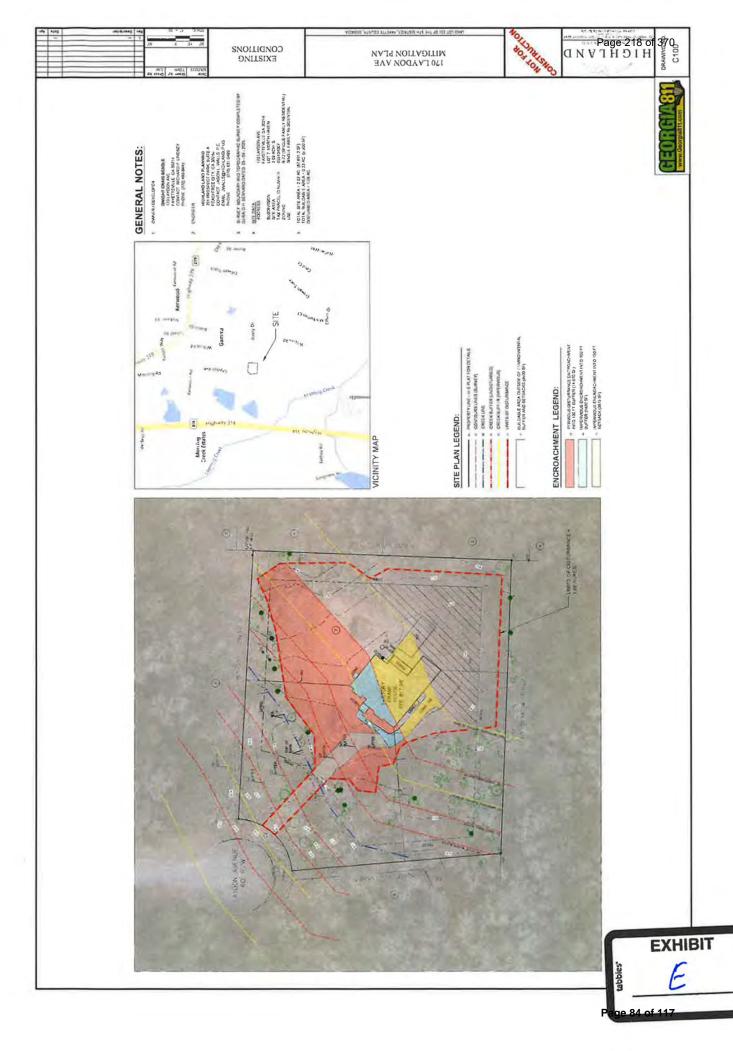

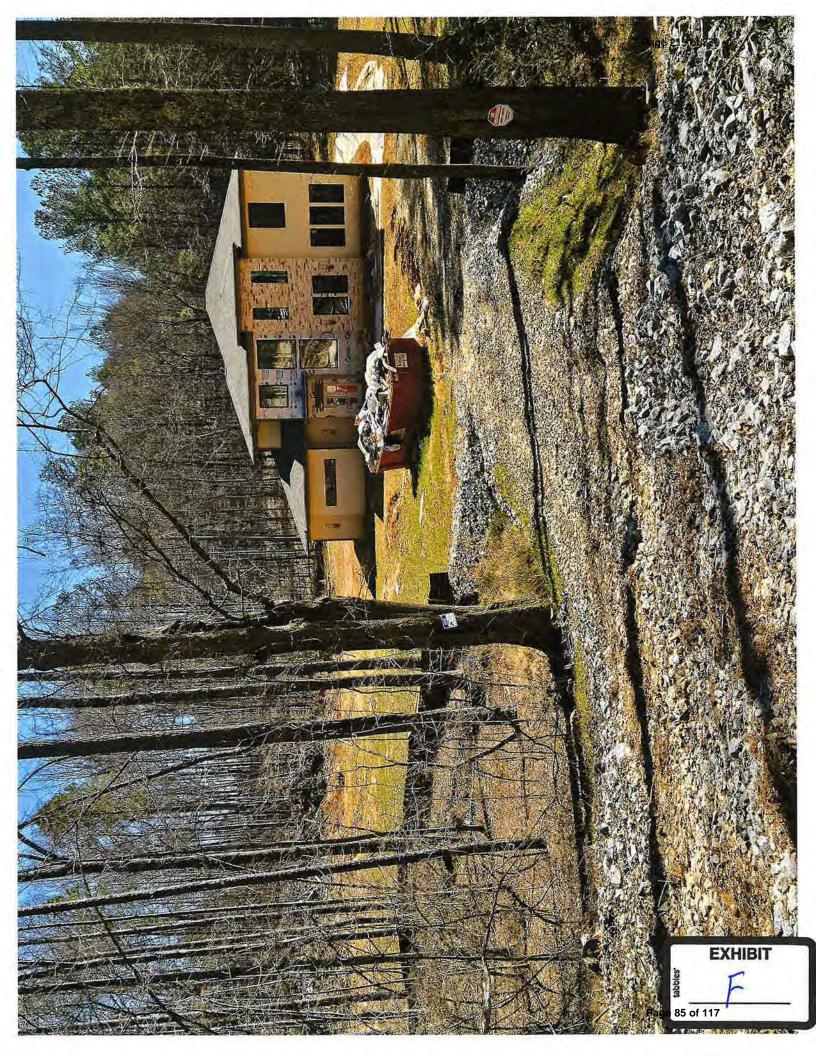

  - b. A setback shall be maintained for seventy-five (75) feet in which all impervious cover shall be prohibited, and grading, filling, and earthmoving shall be minimized. The setback applies to both sides of the stream and shall be measured horizontally from the top of stream bank.
  - c. No specific tanks or septic drain fields shall be permitted within the buffer or the setback. This section of the article shall not apply to the following activities:
    - Agricultural operations as defined in subsection 8-243(5) of Fayette County's Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Ordinance; and

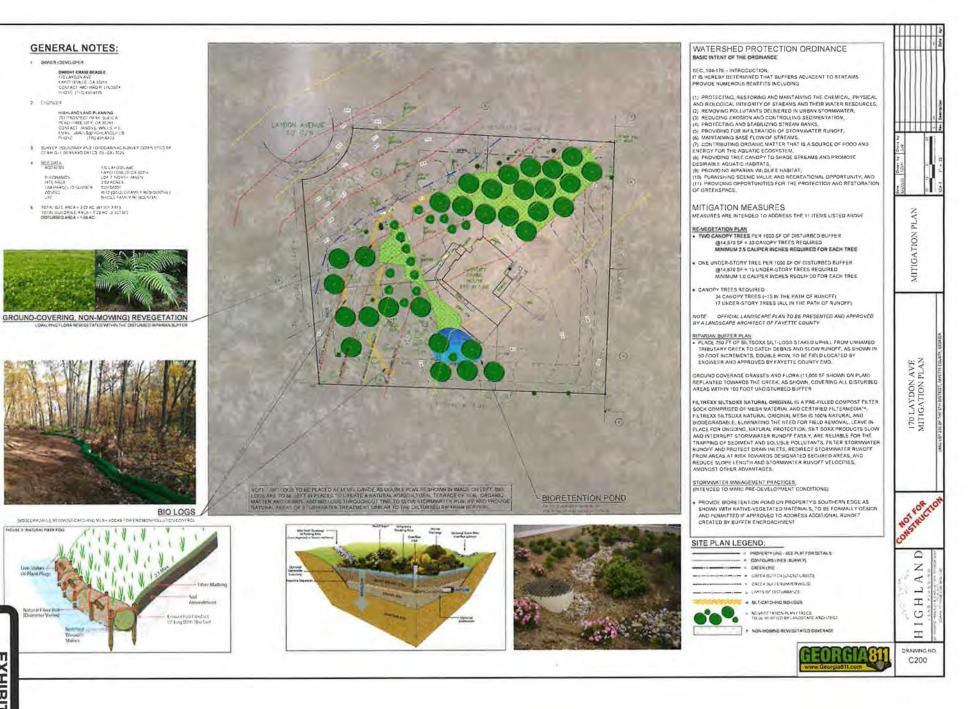
Forestry land management practices as defined in subsection 8-243(6) of Fayette County' \$ 96 ft E 6378 n and Sedimentation Control Ordinance.

- (11) The following restrictions shall apply specifically to large water supply watersheds as identified in the ordinance: New facilities located within seven (7) miles of a water supply intake or water supply reservoir, which handle hazardous materials of the types listed in Section 312 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (excluding underground storage tanks) in amounts of ten thousand (10,000) pounds on any one (1) day or more, shall perform their operations on impervious surfaces and in conformance with any applicable federal spill prevention requirements or requirements of the Standard Fire Code.
- (12) The following restrictions shall apply specifically to small water supply watersheds as identified in the article:
  - a. New facilities located within seven (7) miles of a water supply intake or water supply reservoir, which handle hazardous materials of the types listed in Section 312 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (excluding underground storage tanks) in amounts of ten thousand (10,000) pounds on any one (1) day or more, shall perform their operations on impervious surfaces and in conformance with any applicable federal spill prevention requirements or requirements of the Standard Fire Code.
  - b. New landfills must be lined with a synthetic material and have a leachate collection system.
  - c. The impervious surface area, including all public and private structures, utilities or facilities, of the entire water supply watershed shall be limited to twenty-five (25) percent, or existing use, whichever is greater.

Mr. Lindsey,

The County has completed its review of your request to encroach into the required watershed buffer and setback for the above-referenced parcel. After evaluating the submission under Section 104-184 of the Watershed Protection Ordinance, the variance is **denied** for the reasons outlined below.

#### Variance eligibility (stand-alone determination)

Section 104-184(2) allows a buffer variance **only** when:

- **a.** strict adherence to the 100-foot natural buffer and 50-foot impervious-setback would create an **extreme hardship**, or
- **b.** the intrusion is **necessary for a functionally dependent use** and no reasonable alternative exists.

The proposed single-family dwelling meets neither condition: the use is not stream-dependent, and sufficient buildable land exists outside the buffer and setback.

#### **Supporting findings**

#### 1. Incorrect buffer width claim

Your application cites a 50-foot buffer and 25-foot setback. The Watershed Protection regulations adopted October 13, 1994 (attached) as part of the Zoning Ordinance —and in effect when this subdivision was rezoned on June 26, 1997—establish a **100-foot natural buffer plus a 50-foot setback** along all the stream on this site.

The stream on this site has continuous flow, a perennial stream (as determined independently by an expert hired by Mr. Beadle, and two of my staff members) making it a minor stream which flows into a named tributary Morning Creek within the Flint River Watershed. The stream is also indicated on the 1993 Riverdale Quad Sheet (Attached) as required by the ordinance at that time.

Per the October 13, 1994 ordinance:

#### **Article V, Section 47 Watershed Protection Areas**

#### A. Applicability

 Any and all minor unnamed streams that continuously flow into major water supply streams or named tributaries which flow into major water supply streams. As indicated as perennial on the latest U.S.G.S. Quad Sheets. (Amended 10/13/94)

#### **B** Restrictions

- 5. If a reservoir is not constructed on a major water supply stream then the following shall apply to other minor streams within 1,000 feet of a minor stream:
  - Permitted Residential, Industrial, or Commercial uses:
    - Minimum Lot Size residential per zoning ordinance; commercial - 2 acres; and industrial - 5 acres. (Amended 10/13/94)
    - Minimum Natural Buffer 100 feet from centerline of stream or 50 feet from 100 year elevation, whichever is greater. (Amended 10/13/94)
    - Minimum setback from natural buffer for all structures, nitrification fields and impervious surfaces - 50 feet. (Amended 10/13/94)
    - No multi-family residential or mobile home park uses allowed. (Added 10/13/94)

These are the same conditions which are in the current ordinance.

#### **Article VII Watershed Protection**

Sec. 104-182. - Minimum watershed protection requirements.

(f) The following shall apply to all other perennial streams within the Flint River and Whitewater Creek Watersheds and all state waters requiring a buffer within 1,000 feet of the streams named in this section.

- (1) The minimum watershed buffer shall be 100 feet from wrested vegetation or 50 feet from 100-year floodplain elevation, whichever is greater; and
- (2) The minimum watershed setback shall be 50 feet as measured from the buffer.

#### 2. Footprint size versus required minimum

The current house footprint is approximately **3,800 ft²**, is **90 percent larger** than the **2,000 ft²** minimum required per the rezoning conditions (952-97) and as indicated on the final plat dated October 27, 1998. Based on the submitted documents, there is approximately 9,900 square feet of contiguous buildable area on the site, free and clear of zoning setbacks, floodplain, watershed protection buffers and setbacks, jurisdictional wetlands, and easements of any kind.

Because none of the ordinance's variance criteria are satisfied the request is denied.

You may appeal this decision to the Board of Commissioners within thirty (30) days pursuant to § 104-184(c) of the Fayette County Code.

Sec. 104-179. - Introduction.

It is hereby determined that buffers adjacent to streams provide numerous benefits including:

- (1) Protecting, restoring and maintaining the chemical, physical and biological integrity of streams and their water resources:
- (2) Removing pollutants delivered in urban stormwater;
- (3) Reducing erosion and controlling sedimentation;
- (4) Protecting and stabilizing stream banks;
- (5) Providing for infiltration of stormwater runoff;
- (6) Maintaining base flow of streams;
- (7) Contributing organic matter that is a source of food and energy for the aquatic ecosystem;
- (8) Providing tree canopy to shade streams and promote desirable aquatic habitats;
- (9) Providing riparian wildlife habitat;
- (10) Furnishing scenic value and recreational opportunity; and
- (11) Providing opportunities for the protection and restoration of greenspace.

(Ord. No. 2019-02, § 1, 2-28-2019)

Sec. 104-180. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Base flood elevation means the highest water surface elevation anticipated at any given point during the flood having a one percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year as identified in the Fayette County Flood Insurance Study published by the Federal Emergency Management Agency dated September 28, 2008. When this study indicates a Zone A the base flood elevation is identified from the 2013 Fayette County Flood Study.

Ephemeral stream means a drainage feature with no evidence of base flows in the stream bank.

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Ground cover means a plant with a low-growing, spreading habit, grown specifically to cover the ground, generally not attaining a height of more than two feet.

*Impervious surface* means any manmade structure or natural surface that prevents the infiltration of stormwater into the ground below the structure and/or surface. Examples include buildings, paved roads, paved driveways, paved parking lots, swimming pools, hardscaping to include gravel (any size) or landscaping rocks, covered structures or patios.

Large water-supply watershed means a watershed area that is greater than 100 square miles upstream of a government-owned public drinking water supply intake as defined by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources.

*Natural vegetation* means a generally undisturbed, maintenance-free, self-perpetuating stand of vegetation comprised of indigenous shrubs, flowers, wild grasses, and trees.

Nitrification field means any area used for the on-site disposal of wastewater.

*Normal pool elevation* means the lowest crest level of overflow on a reservoir or lake with a fixed overflow level (spillway crest elevation).

Perennial stream means a stream that flows in a well-defined channel throughout most of the year under normal climatic conditions.

*Pollutant* means any liquid, gas, solid, radioactive, hazardous or other substance that, when not used and/or disposed of in accordance with manufacturer's instructions, causes or contributes to pollution

*Pollution* means contamination or other alteration of any water's physical, chemical or biological properties by the addition of any constituent and includes, but is not limited to, a change in temperature, taste, color, turbidity or odor of such waters, or the discharge of any liquid, gaseous, solid, radioactive, or other pollutant into any such waters as will or is likely to create a nuisance or render such waters harmful, detrimental or injurious to the public health, safety, welfare or environment, or to domestic, commercial, industrial, agricultural, recreational and other legitimate beneficial uses, or to livestock, wild animals, birds, fish or aquatic life.

*Shrub* means a plant with persistent woody stems and a relatively low growth habit, distinguished from a tree by producing several basal stems instead of a single trunk.

*Small water-supply watershed* means a watershed area that is less than 100 square miles as defined by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources.

State water means any and all rivers, streams, creeks, branches, lakes, reservoirs, ponds, drainage systems, springs, wells, and other water bodies of surface or subsurface water, natural or artificial, lying within or forming a part of the boundaries of the state that are not entirely confined and retained completely upon the property of a single individual, homeowners' association, partnership, or corporation.

Tree means a self-supporting woody perennial plant that, at maturity, has one or more stems or trunks that attain a diameter of at least three inches, a more or less definitely formed crown of foliage, and a height of ten feet or more.

*Tributaries and streams* mean state waters, whether named or unnamed, that continuously flow through major and minor water-supply watersheds.

*Understory tree* means a tree that, under normal forest conditions, grows to maturity beneath canopy trees and will generally reach a mature height of at least ten feet, but less than 40 feet. Examples include dogwood, red bud, fringe tree, lusterleaf holly, and red cedar.

*Utility* means a public or private water or sewer piping systems, water or sewer pumping stations, electric power lines, fuel pipelines, telephone lines, roads, driveways, bridges, river/lake access facilities, stormwater systems and railroads or other utilities identified by a local government.

*Water supply reservoir* means a governmentally owned impoundment of water for the primary purpose of providing water to one or more governmentally owned public drinking water systems. This excludes the multipurpose reservoirs owned by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Water supply watershed means the area of land upstream of a governmentally owned public drinking water intake.

*Watershed buffer* means the area of a parcel set aside to provide a separation between the uses on the parcel and adjoining parcels and state waters requiring a buffer using natural vegetation, replanting, and supplemental plantings.

*Watershed setback* means the area of a parcel where all structures, septic tanks, nitrification fields and any impervious surfaces shall be prohibited. Grading, filling and earthmoving shall be minimized within the setback.

*Wrested vegetation* means vegetation that has been disturbed, moved, or removed by flowing water creating a clear demarcation between water flow and vegetative growth.

(Ord. No. 2019-02, § 1, 2-28-2019)

Sec. 104-181. - General provisions.

- (a) *Purpose and intent*. The purpose of this article is to protect, maintain and enhance the public health, safety, environment and general welfare; to minimize public and private losses due to erosion, siltation and water pollution; to preserve stream water quality; and to comply with the laws of the state pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 12-2-8 by provisions:
  - (1) Create buffers and setbacks along state waters in the county for stream bank stabilization, water resource protection, and protection of aquatic and riparian habitat; and

(2)

Minimize land development within such buffers and setbacks by limiting development activities within these protected areas and by requiring authorization for any such activities.

- (b) *Applicability*. The following large and small water supply watersheds, designated major water supply streams, named tributaries, minor unnamed streams, lakes and waters requiring a state buffer located in and out of the large and small water supply watersheds shall be governed by this article.
  - (1) This article shall be applicable to any parcel within the unincorporated county that has been created or reconfigured after May 28, 1987, unless it is a minor revision to a recorded final plat/minor subdivision plat as defined in article XV of this chapter.
  - (2) It shall be the responsibility of every property owner, developer or builder to present required plans and to comply with article IX of this chapter.
- (c) *Administration of article*. The environmental management director shall administer and implement the provisions of this article.
- (d) *Compatibility with other regulations*. This article is not intended to modify or repeal any other ordinance, rule, regulation, statute, easement, covenant, deed restriction or other provision of law. The requirements of this article are in addition to the requirements of any other ordinance, rule, regulation or other provision of law, and where any provision of this article imposes restrictions different from those imposed by any other ordinance, rule, regulation or other provision of law, whichever provision is more restrictive or impose higher protective standards for human health or the environment shall control.
- (e) Watershed buffer. Vegetation within a watershed buffer area shall not be disturbed unless approved by the environmental management department.
- (f) Watershed setback. All buildings, elevated structures, septic tanks, nitrification fields and/or impervious surfaces shall be prohibited within a watershed setback area. Grading, filling and earthmoving shall be minimized within the watershed setback area. Upon recommendation by the Fayette County Environmental Health Director, the environmental management director may allow for a replacement nitrification field in the setback when a property's recorded final plat defines a watershed buffer and setback and the current septic system is failing.
- (g) Water-supply watersheds. The county contains one large water-supply watershed and four small water-supply watersheds as indicated on the county watershed protection map.
  - (1) The Flint River is the only large water-supply watershed in the county where intakes for Fayette County, Clayton County and the City of Griffin are located. This water-supply watershed does not contain a reservoir.
  - (2) The four small water-supply watersheds are:
    - a. Line Creek Watershed where Fayette County and Coweta County intakes are located. Lake McIntosh (a water-supply reservoir) is located within this watershed.

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- b. Flat Creek Watershed where a Fayette County intake is located. Flat Creek and Gin Branch are named tributaries that flow into Lake Kedron and then into Lake Peachtree (both are water-supply reservoirs).
- c. Whitewater Creek Watershed where Fayette County and City of Fayetteville intakes are located. This water-supply watershed does not contain a reservoir.
- d. Horton Creek Watershed where a Fayette County intake is located. Antioch Creek and Woolsey Creek are named tributaries that flow into Lake Horton (a water-supply reservoir).
- (h) State waters determination. For purposes of this article, the environmental management director shall make state water determinations, but will not delineate said waters. Recorded drainage easements and ditches/swales used for conveying wet weather flows (i.e., ephemeral stream) shall not require a watershed buffer.

Sec. 104-182. - Minimum watershed protection requirements.

- (a) The following watershed buffer and setback requirements shall be required on all state waters requiring a buffer within the unincorporated county:
  - (1) No sewage treatment facility, dumping, discharging, releasing, spraying, distributing of any toxic or other pollutant is allowed onto the watershed buffer and setback.
  - (2) Watershed buffer areas may be hand thinned or hand trimmed of vegetation in accordance with the county's soil erosion and sedimentation control ordinance (article IX of this chapter).
  - (3) Pervious hiking trails, four feet wide or less, and pervious picnic areas, 100 square feet or less and with standard-size picnic tables, will be allowed within the watershed buffer and setback, but not within the 25 foot state water buffer unless all federal permits and state variances have been granted. Any land disturbance activities are subject to articles IV and IX of this chapter.
  - (4) The watershed buffer shall only constitute 50 percent of a livestock containment area.
  - (5) The watershed buffer shall only extend for 1,000 feet from the wrested vegetation of state waters requiring a buffer. If the watershed buffer exceeds the said 1,000 feet then the 1,000 feet will become the watershed buffer and watershed setback will not be applied.
  - (6) For subsections (c), (d) and (e) of this section only the watershed buffer may be reduced to 100 feet for activities that do not require grubbing or tilling, such as tree harvesting without stump removal, if and only if, a copy of documentation submitted to the Georgia Forestry Commission is submitted to the environmental management department prior to requesting a reduction in the watershed buffer.

(b)

For any property within 1,000 feet of a water-supply reservoir, the minimum watershed buffer shall be 100 feet as measured from the normal pool elevation. The minimum watershed setback shall be 50 feet as measured from the watershed buffer.

- (c) The following shall apply to these major water-supply streams: Antioch Creek, Flat Creek, Gin Branch, Horton Creek, Line Creek, and Woolsey Creek:
  - (1) The minimum watershed buffer is 100 feet as measured from the wrested vegetation; ands
  - (2) The minimum watershed setback is 50 feet as measured from the buffer.
- (d) The following shall apply to these major water-supply streams: Flint River, Whitewater Creek and all state waters requiring a watershed buffer within 1,000 feet of the Flint River and Whitewater Creek:
  - (1) The minimum watershed buffer is 400 feet as measured from the wrested vegetation or 100 feet from the base flood elevation, whichever is greater; and
  - (2) The minimum watershed setback is 50 feet as measured from the buffer.
- (e) The following shall apply to these named tributaries: Ginger Cake Creek, Pelham Creek, Perry Creek, South Camp Creek, Sandy Creek, Shoal Creek, Tar Creek, and Whitewater Creek within the Whitewater Creek Watershed; Gay Creek, Morning Creek, Murphy Creek, North Camp Creek, and Nash Creek within the Flint River Watershed, Trickum Creek within the Line Creek Watershed, and all other state waters requiring a buffer within 1,000 feet of the streams set forth in this subsection:
  - (1) The minimum watershed buffer is 200 feet from wrested vegetation or 100 feet from base flood elevation, whichever is greater; and
  - (2) The minimum watershed setback is 50 feet as measured from the buffer.
- (f) The following shall apply to all other perennial streams within the Flint River and Whitewater Creek Watersheds and all state waters requiring a buffer within 1,000 feet of the streams named in this section.
  - (1) The minimum watershed buffer shall be 100 feet from wrested vegetation or 50 feet from 100-year floodplain elevation, whichever is greater; and
  - (2) The minimum watershed setback shall be 50 feet as measured from the buffer.
- (g) All lakes and state waters requiring a buffer but not otherwise protected by provisions of this article shall meet the following requirements:
  - (1) The minimum watershed buffer shall be 50 feet from wrested vegetation measured horizontally from both sides of the stream;
  - (2) The minimum watershed setback shall be 25 feet as measured from the buffer; and
  - (3) This section shall not apply to the following activities:
    - a. Agricultural operation as defined in section 104-266(5); and

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- b. Forestry land management practices as defined in section 104-266(6).
- (h) The following restrictions shall apply specifically to water-supply watersheds as identified in this article: new facilities located within seven miles of a water-supply intake or water-supply reservoir, which handle hazardous materials of the types and amounts determined by the Department of Natural Resources, shall perform their operations on impermeable surfaces having spill and leak collection systems as prescribed by the Department of Natural Resources.
- (i) The following restrictions shall apply specifically to small water supply watersheds as identified in this article:
  - (1) New facilities located within seven miles of a water-supply intake or water-supply reservoir, which handle hazardous materials of the types and amounts determined by the Department of Natural Resources, shall perform their operations on impermeable surface having spill and leak collection systems as prescribed by the Department of Natural Resources.
  - (2) The impervious surface area, including all public and private structures, utilities, or facilities, of the entire water-supply watershed shall be limited to 25 percent, or existing use, whichever is greater.
  - (3) New hazardous waste treatment or disposal facilities are prohibited.

Sec. 104-183. - Watershed buffer protection and replacement.

Vegetation within a watershed buffer, as defined in this article, shall not be disturbed except as indicated herein. Where a watershed buffer area is otherwise disturbed, it shall be replanted according to this article.

- (1) Watershed buffer and stream/shoreline mitigation plan. A watershed buffer and stream/shoreline mitigation plan is required for the replacement/replanting of natural vegetation and shall meet the following requirements:
  - a. The plan shall be prepared by a landscape architect registered in the state and approved by the environmental management department prior to execution.
  - b. The plan shall show two canopy trees with a minimum trunk caliper of two and one-half inches (at six inches from the ground) for every 1,000 square feet of disturbed buffer area on the site.
  - c. The plan shall show one understory tree with a minimum trunk caliper on one inch (at six inches from the ground) for every 1,000 square feet of disturbed buffer area on the site.
  - d. Required trees shall be randomly placed so that the mature overstory covers the buffer area. All disturbed buffer areas shall be 100 percent covered with deciduous trees, shrubs, and/or ground cover.

e.

The plan shall show stream bank and shoreline restoration and must follow Georgia Environmental Protection Division Streambank and Shoreline Stabilization Guidance.

- f. Within seven days of the plan's execution, a stamped letter from the landscape architect who designed the plan shall be submitted to Environmental Management.
- (2) Watershed buffer and stream/shoreline mitigation plan requirements. A watershed buffer and stream/shoreline mitigation plan shall contain the following information:
  - a. Name, address, and telephone number of property owner.
  - b. Name, address, telephone number, and seal of landscape architect who prepared the plan.
  - c. Site location map, north point, and scale of drawings.
  - d. All pertinent site features, including buildings, walks, drives, underground utilities, water bodies, etc.
  - e. All property lines, distances to bodies of water and/or streams, and the limits of the natural buffer areas.
  - f. Total parcels area, buffer area disturbed (square feet and square inches) and numbers of canopy and understory trees required by ordinance.
  - g. Planting key with botanical and common names of all plant materials proposed; quantity of each species, size of plant material (caliper, height, width); condition (i.e., balled and burlapped, container grown, bare root, collected, etc.).

Sec. 104-184. - Variance procedures and appeals.

- (a) The following variance and appeals procedures shall apply to an owner/operator or developer who has been denied a permit for a development activity or to an owner or developer who has not applied for a permit because it is clear that the proposed development activity would be inconsistent with the provisions of this article:
  - (1) A request for a variance may be submitted by an owner/operator who has been denied a permit by the environmental management department or by an owner/operator or developer who has not previously applied for a permit for the reasons stated hereinabove. A request for a variance may not be submitted when the recorded final plat defines a watershed buffer and setback.
  - (2) Variances will be considered only in the following cases:
    - a. When there are unusual circumstances, such that strict adherence to the minimal buffer/setback requirements in this article would create an extreme hardship.

b.

When necessary for the conduct of a functionally dependent use, provided the criteria of this section are met, no reasonable alternative exists, and the development is protected by methods that minimize buffer disturbances.

- (b) *Procedure*. Requests for variances from the requirements of this article shall be submitted to the environmental management department. All such requests shall be heard and decided in accordance with plan review procedures established by the environmental management department. At a minimum, such procedures shall include notice to all affected parties and the opportunity to be heard.
  - (1) At a minimum, a variance request application shall include:
    - a. A site map that includes locations of all streams, wetlands, floodplain boundaries and other natural features, as determined by field survey;
    - b. A description of the shape, size, topography, slope, soils, vegetation and other physical characteristics of the property;
    - c. Locations of all existing and proposed structures and other impervious cover, the limits of all existing and proposed land disturbance, both inside and outside the buffer and setback. The exact area of the buffer to be affected shall be accurately and clearly indicated;
    - d. Documentation of unusual hardship should the buffer be maintained;
    - e. At least one alternative plan, which does not include a buffer or setback intrusion, or an explanation of why such a site plan is not possible;
    - f. A calculation of the total area and length of the proposed intrusion;
    - g. A stormwater management site plan, if applicable; and
    - h. Proposed mitigation, for the intrusion. If mitigation is not proposed, the request must explain why.
  - (2) The following factors will be considered in determining whether any of the conditions identified in paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of this section are present:
    - a. The shape, size, topography, slope, soils, vegetation and other physical characteristics of the property;
    - b. The locations of all streams on the property, including along property boundaries;
    - c. The location and extent of the proposed buffer or setback intrusion;
    - d. Whether alternative designs are possible which require less intrusion or no intrusion;
    - e. The long-term and construction water quality impacts of the proposed variance; and
    - f. Whether issuance of the variance is at least as protective of natural resources and the environment.

(3)

Any person requesting a variance shall, from the time of the request until the time the request is acted upon, submit such information and documentation as the environmental management department and the board of commissioners shall deem necessary to the consideration of the request.

- (4) Upon consideration of the factors listed in paragraph (2) of this subsection and the purposes of this article, the environmental management department (and the board of commissioners when considering an appeal pursuant to subsection (c) of this section) may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as they deem necessary or appropriate, consistent with the purposes of this article.
- (5) In reviewing requests pursuant to this section the environmental management department (and the board of commissioners when considering an appeal pursuant to subsection (c) of this section) shall consider all technical evaluations, relevant factors, and all standards specified in this and other sections of this article.
- (6) Any person to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice specifying the difference between the current buffers and setbacks requirements and the buffers and setbacks allowed by the variance.
- (c) *Appeals*. Any person adversely affected by any decision of the environmental management department shall have the right to appeal such decision to the board of commissioners for the county in accordance with procedures issued by the board of commissioners. At a minimum, such procedures shall include notice to all affected parties and the opportunity to be heard. Any person aggrieved by the decision of the board of commissioners may appeal such decision by petitioning for writ of certiorari with the Superior Court of Fayette County, as provided in section 5-4-1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A. § 5-4-1).

Sec. 104-185. - Penalties.

In the event the remedial measures described in the notice of violation have not been completed by the date set forth for such completion in the notice of violation, any one or more of the following actions or penalties may be taken or assessed against the person to whom the notice of violation was directed. Before taking any of the following actions or imposing any of the following penalties, the environmental management department shall first notify the owner/operator or other responsible person in writing of its intended action, and shall provide a reasonable opportunity, of not less than ten days (except, that in the event the violation constitutes an immediate danger to public health or public safety, 24 hours' notice shall be sufficient) to cure such violation. In the event the owner/operator or other responsible person fails to cure such violation after such notice and cure period, the environmental management department may take any one or more of the following actions or impose any one or more of the following penalties:

(1)

Stop work order. The environmental management department may issue a stop work order which shall be served on the owner/operator or other responsible person. The stop work order shall remain in effect until the owner/operator or other responsible person has taken the remedial measures set forth in the notice of violation or has otherwise cured the violations described therein, provided the stop work order may be withdrawn or modified to enable the owner/operator or other responsible person to take the necessary remedial measures to cure such violations.

- (2) Suspension, revocation or modification of permit. The environmental management department may suspend, revoke or modify any permit authorizing any development within the county. A suspended, revoked or modified permit may be reinstated after the owner/operator or other responsible person has taken the remedial measures set forth in the notice of violation or has otherwise cured the violations described therein, provided such permit may be reinstated (upon such conditions as the environmental management department may deem necessary) to enable the owner/operator or other responsible person to take the necessary remedial measures to cure such violations.
- (3) *Criminal penalties.* For intentional violations of this article, or in the event the owner/operator or other responsible person fails to take the remedial measures set forth in the notice of violation or otherwise fails to cure the violations described therein within ten days, or such greater period as the environmental management department shall deem appropriate (except, that in the event the violation constitutes an immediate danger to public health or public safety, 24 hours' notice shall be sufficient), the environmental management department may issue a citation to the owner/operator or other responsible person, requiring such person to appear in the Fayette County State Court to answer charges for such violation. Upon conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$2,500.00 per day, per violation or a sentence of imprisonment for up to 60 days or both. Each act of violation and each day upon which any violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense.

- 3. Minimum setback from natural buffer for all structures, nitrification fields and impervious surfaces 50 feet. (Amended 10/13/94)

## d. Permitted agricultural use:

 Minimum Natural Buffer -200 feet from centerline of stream or 100 feet from 100 year elevation, whichever is greater. (Amended 10/13/94)

- 2. Minimum setback from natural buffer for all structures, nitrification fields and impervious surfaces 50 feet. (Amended 10/13/94)
- 3. Activities that do not require grubbing or tilling, such as tree harvesting with no stump removal, shall be allowed in the natural buffer. An undisturbed buffer of 100 feet, as measured from the stream bank, must be maintained. (Added 10/13/94)
- 4. No chemical treatment (herbicides, pesticides, fertilizers, or paint) allowed in the buffer, natural or undisturbed. (Added 10/13/94)
- e. Permitted recreational uses: (Amended 9/14/89)

Uses permitted in the natural buffer and setback: public and private golf courses, cart paths, driving ranges, playing fields, picnic areas and improved An undisturbed buffer of 100 feet, as measured from the stream bank, must be maintained. Unimproved hiking within will be allowed trails undisturbed buffer. Any land disturbance activities are subject to Fayette County Sedimentation Erosion and Ordinance (Article IX, Zoning Ordinance) and Flood Plain Regulations (Article IV., Regulations). Development (Amended 10/13/94)
  - 4. No chemical treatment (herbicides, pesticides, fertilizers, or paint) allowed in the buffer, natural or undisturbed. (Added 10/13/94)

## D. Other Quality Considerations.

- 1. It shall be the responsibility of every developer or builder to present required plans and to comply with Article IX, SEDIMENT CONTROL, of the Zoning Ordinance.
- Whenever the zoning district regulations, including lot size requirements, are more restrictive than those contained in this Section, the more restrictive provisions shall prevail.
- 3. Nonresidential developments may be required to install any or all of, but not limited to, the following devices:

- a. Oil-water separators.
- b. Grease traps.
- c. Pre-setting basins.
- 4. No agricultural or recreational activity that does not strictly comply with Georgia Pesticide Act of 1976, Georgia Pesticide Use and Application Act of 1976, and Georgia Laws 1982, House Bill 1780 (O.C.G.A. 2-1-4) as amended, or with any and all other laws of the State of Georgia, will be allowed. (Amended 9/14/89)

(Section E. added in its entirety 10/13/94)

E. <u>Natural Buffer Protection and Replacement.</u> Vegetation within a Natural Buffer, as defined in <u>Article III.</u> of this ordinance, shall not be disturbed except as indicated herein. Where a natural buffer area is otherwise disturbed, it shall be replanted according to this Section.

## A. <u>Definitions</u>.

The following definition of terms shall apply to this Section.

<u>Ground cover</u>: Natural plant material such as vines, shrubs, or grasses which would not normally attain a height of more than two (2) feet.

<u>Natural vegetation</u>: Natural vegetation shall connote a generally undisturbed, maintenance-free, self-perpetuating stand of vegetation comprised of indigenous shrubs, flowers, wild grasses, and trees.

<u>Shrub</u>: A woody plant or bush of relatively low height (two (2) to six (6) feet), distinguished from a tree by having several stems rather than a single trunk.

Tree: A self supporting woody plant having one (1) or more well-defined stems or trunks, a more or less definitely formed crown, usually attaining a mature height of at least ten (10) feet, and a trunk diameter of at least two (2) inches measured at a point four (4) feet above the ground.

Tree, canopy: Any tree having reached a relatively tall height compared to surrounding trees and vegetation and providing shade and protection to the earth and

vegetation beneath it from its foliage mass; also individual or tree groups forming an overhead cover. Examples include oak, red maple, hickory, beech, pecan, sycamore, sweetgum, poplar, ash, river birch, long leaf pine, loblolly pine and Virginia pine.

Tree, understory: Any tree, which is of relatively lesser height and spread than surrounding canopy trees, but still provides shade and a degree of protection to the earth and vegetation beneath it. Examples include dogwood, cherry, red bud, sassafras, crabapple, pear, American holly, red cedar, and magnolia.

#### B. Landscape Plan Requirements.

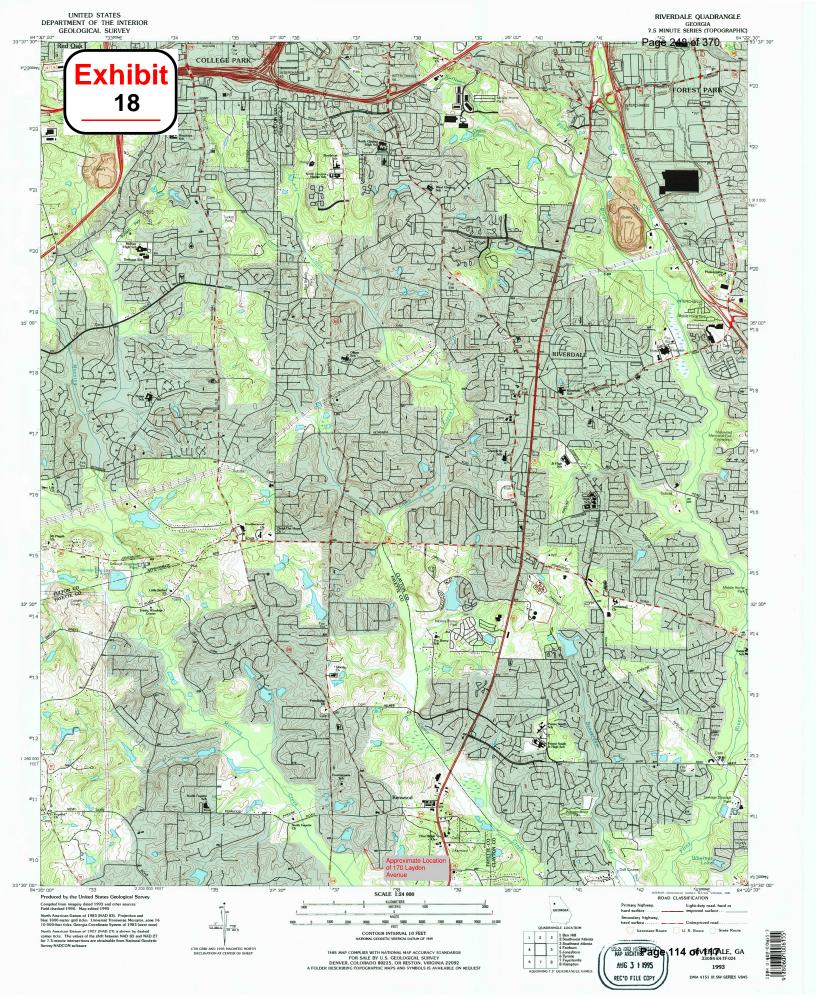
- A landscape plan is required for the replacement/replanting of buffer vegetation:
- (1) A landscape plan shall be prepared by a landscape architect registered in the State of Georgia.
- (2) A landscape plan shall include two (2) canopy trees with a minimum trunk caliper of two and one-half (2 1/2) inches (at four (4) inches from the ground) for every one thousand (1,000) square feet of disturbed buffer area on the site.
- (3) A landscape plan shall include one (1) understory tree with a minimum trunk caliper of one (1) inch (at four (4) inches from the ground) for every one thousand (1,000) square feet of disturbed buffer area on the site.
- (4) Required trees shall be randomly placed so that the mature canopy covers the buffer area.
- (5) All disturbed buffer areas shall be one hundred (100) percent covered with deciduous trees, shrubs, and/or ground cover (not requiring mowing).

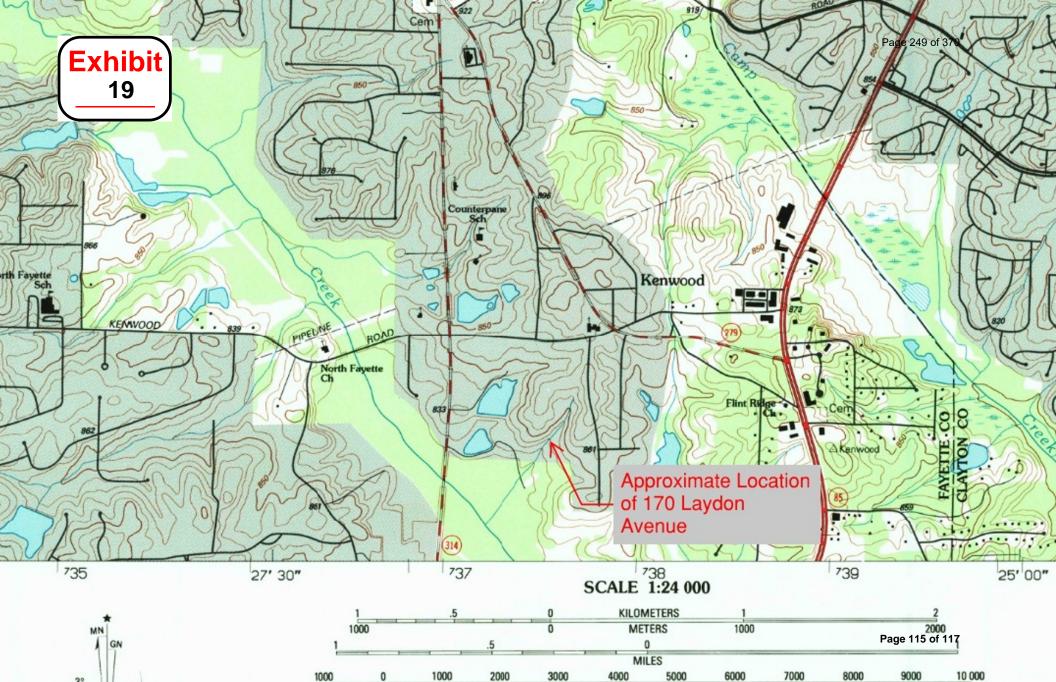
### C. Landscape Plan Check Sheet.

A landscape plan shall contain the following information:

- (1) Name, address and telephone number of property owner.
- (2) Name, address, telephone number and seal of landscape architect who prepared the plan.
- (3) Site location map, north point, scale of drawings.

- (4) Show all pertinent site features: buildings, walks, drives, underground utilities, water bodies, etc..
- (5) Show all property lines, distances to bodies of water and/or streams, and the limits of the natural buffer areas.
- (6) Show calculations on the plan for: total area, buffer area disturbed (in acres and square feet). Indicate numbers of canopy and understory trees required by ordinance.
- (7) Planting key: botanical and common name of all plant materials proposed; quantity of each species, size of plant material (caliper, height, width); condition (i.e. balled and burlapped, container grown, bare root, collected, etc.).
- (8) Submit three (3) copies of plans for review. One (1) will be returned upon approval.

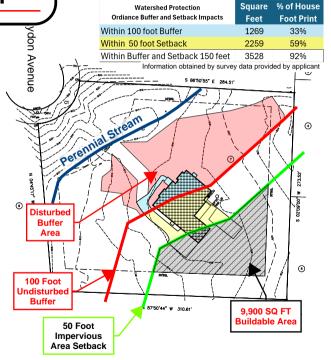

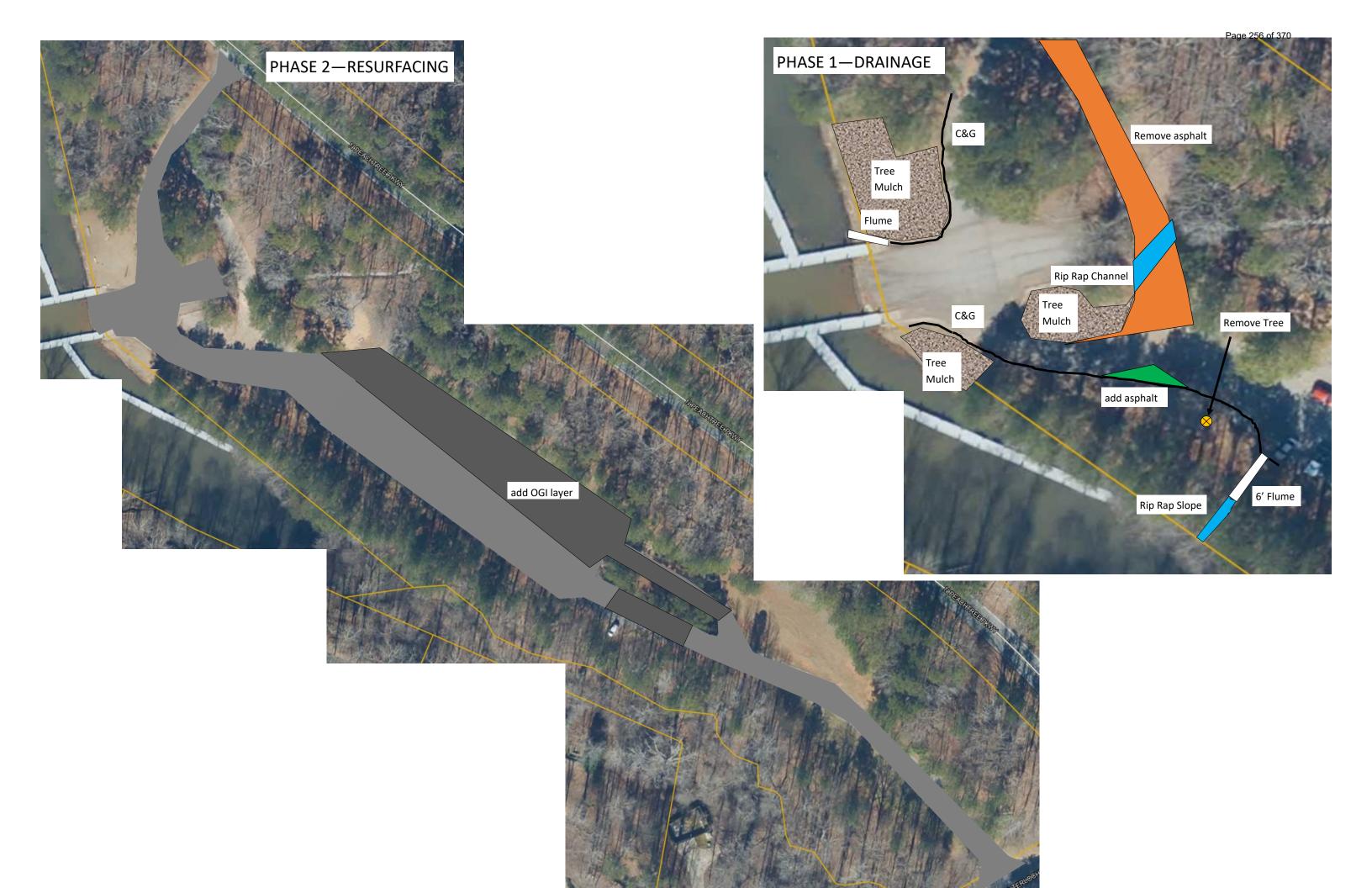

A core function of county and municipal public works departments is the use of professional engineering services to support stormwater-related planning, permitting, design, utility coordination, and construction support services. These services are essential for both planned capital projects and unexpected needs that arise during daily operations.

Requiring a formal sealed bid or request for proposals (RFP) process each time engineering services are needed would be inefficient, time-consuming, and could delay critical projects. To streamline operations and ensure timely response, many local governments establish contracts with qualified firms to serve as their On-Call Engineer or Engineer of Record, providing professional engineering services as needed under a continuing services agreement.

To this end, the Purchasing Department issued Request for Proposal #2605-P to secure an engineer of record for the Public Works and Environmental Departments. Notice of the opportunity was emailed to 49 companies. Another 540 were contacted through the webbased Georgia Procurement Registry, who had registered under commodity code #92535 (Environmental Engineering), #92536 (Engineering Services (Not Otherwise Classified)) and #92597 (Water Supply, Treatment, and Distribution Engineering). The offer was also advertised through Georgia Local Government Access Marketplace.

Nine companies submitted proposals. All proposals were evaluated by a team of staff members. The criteria included qualifications, project team and individual experience, understanding & approach, scheduling and resource availability (Attachment 1). Purchasing reviewed the price schedule for scoring.

Based on the combined technical and price evaluation (Attachment 2)., LJA Engineering, Inc. received the highest overall score and is recommended for award. This company has not contracted with the county in the past, so a Contractor Performance Evaluation is not available. During the reference check positive responses were received.

In conformance with requirements of the federal Surface Transportation Block Grant and the Georgia Department of Transportation, the contract is similar to an engineer-of-record contract, in that all work and funds are awarded as Task Orders.

To date, PDP has been awarded six task orders totaling \$1,322,621.40. Task Order 7 will add \$460,201.65 bringing the total awarded to \$1,782,823.05 (Attachment 1). Up to 80% of costs are eligible for federal aid reimbursement.

Under Task Order #7, PDP will provide final design plans. County staff and PDP met on August 25, 2025, to negotiate Task Order 7. Following review and discussions with PDP, Fayette County has determined the proposed fee to be acceptable and hereby requests approval of Task Order No. 7 as submitted (Attachment 2).

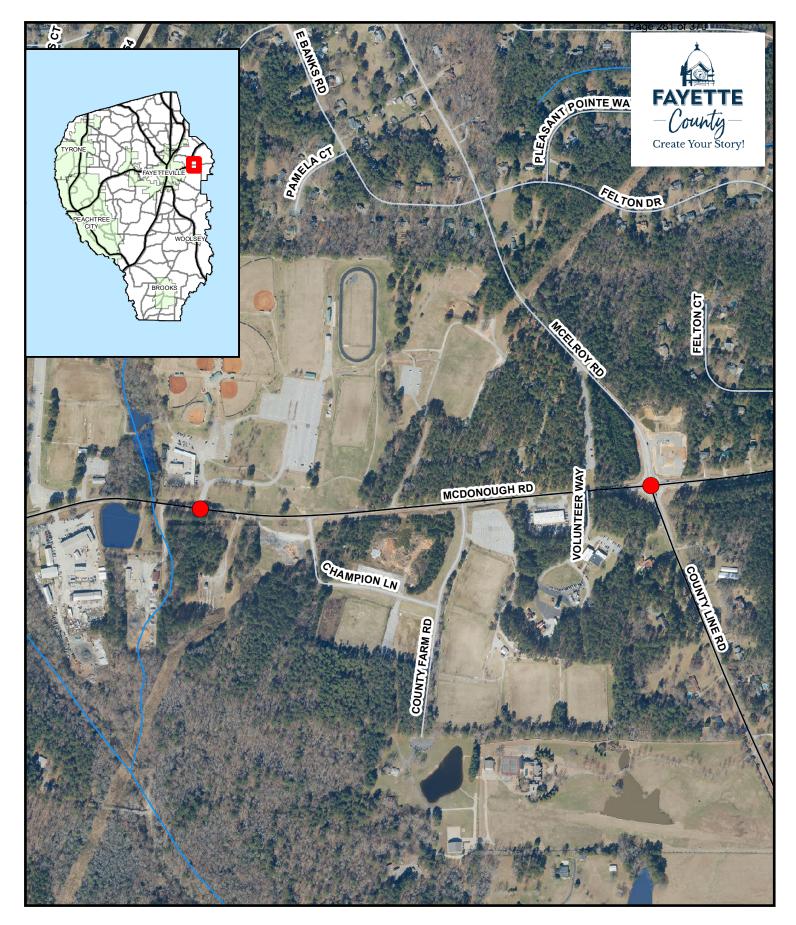

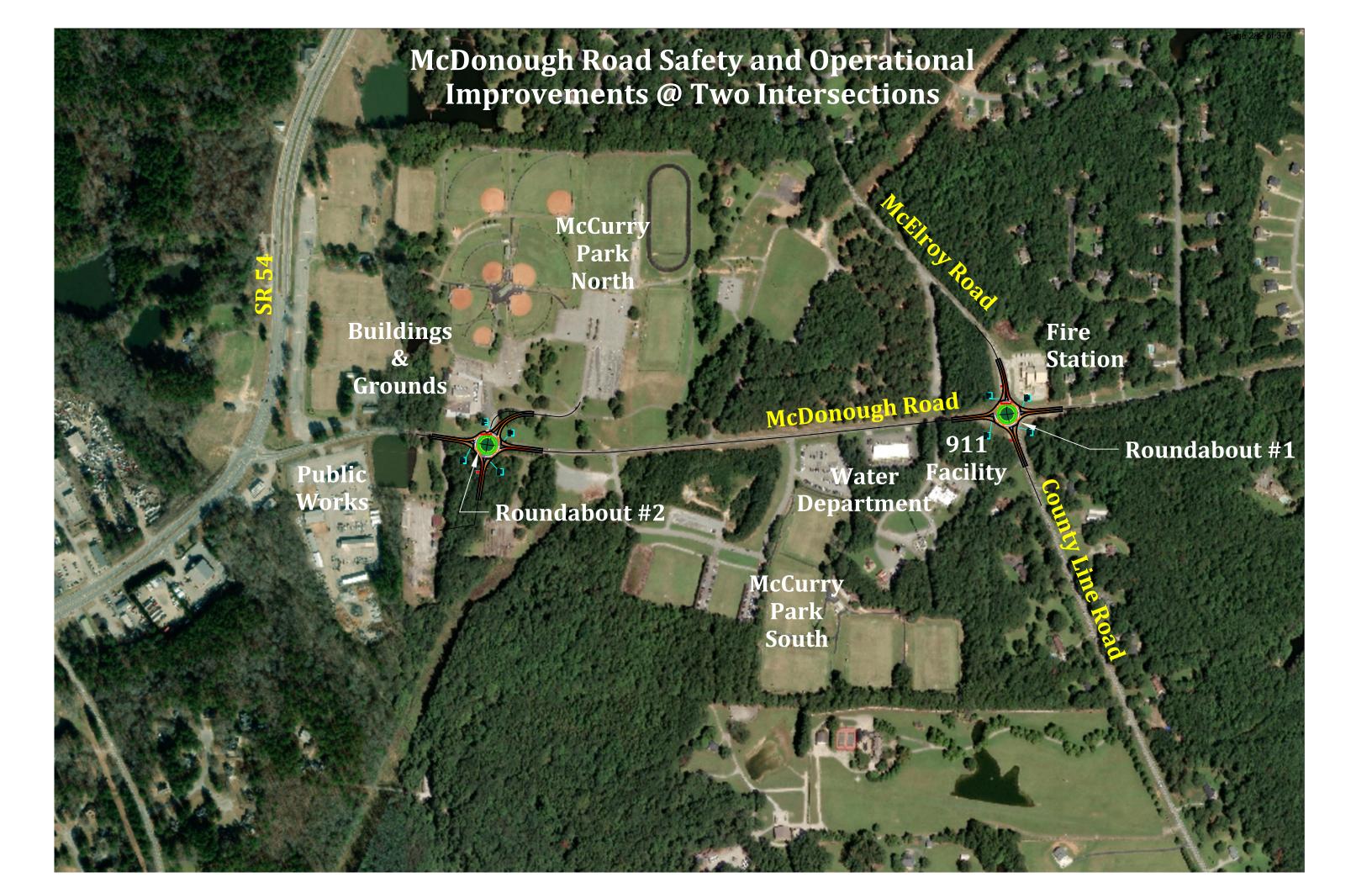

### **Project Benefits and Challenges**

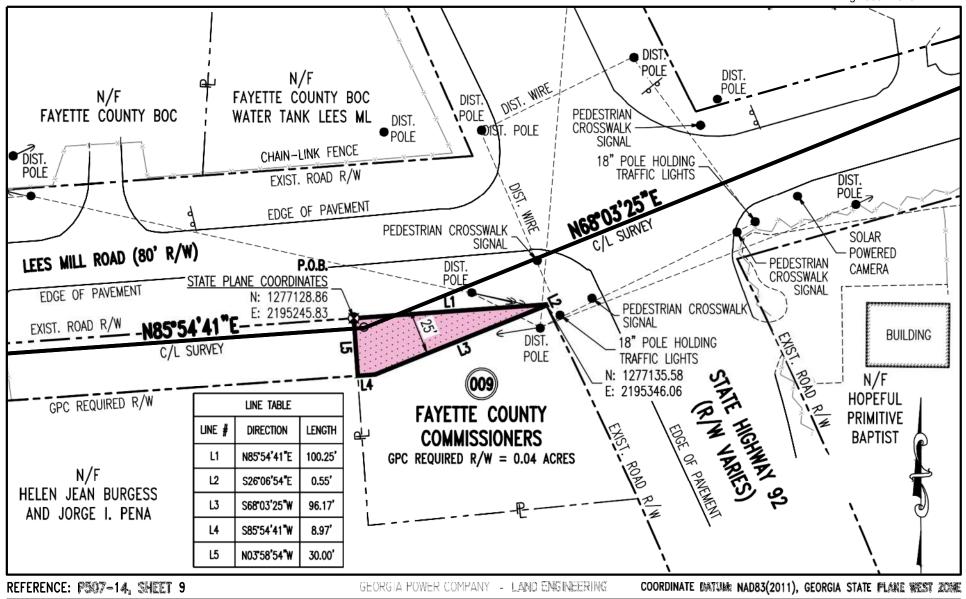

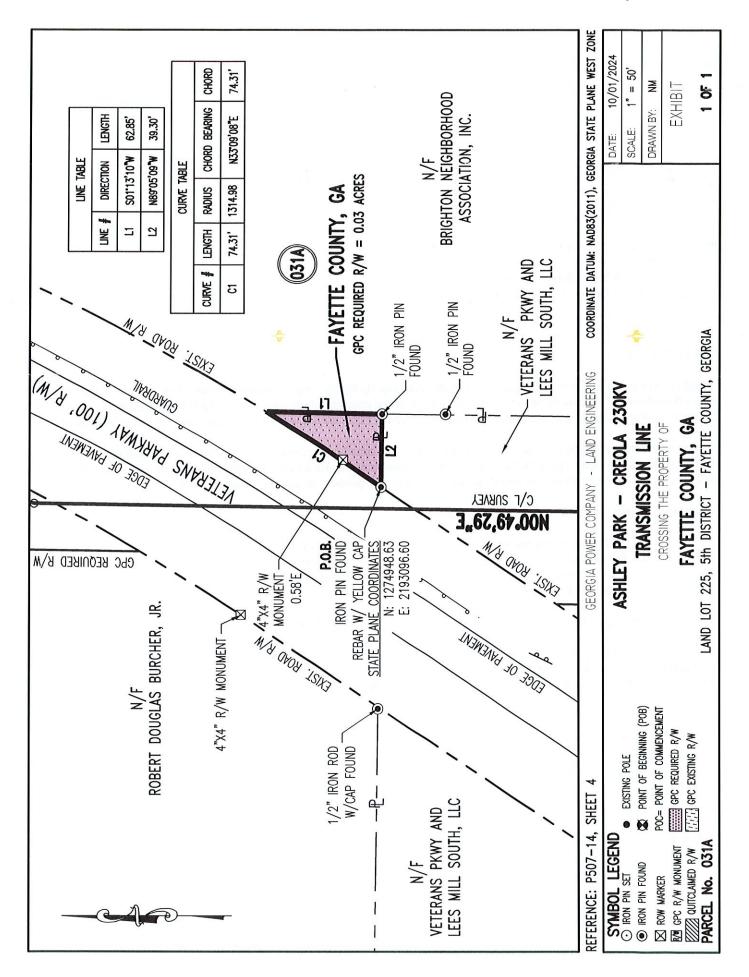

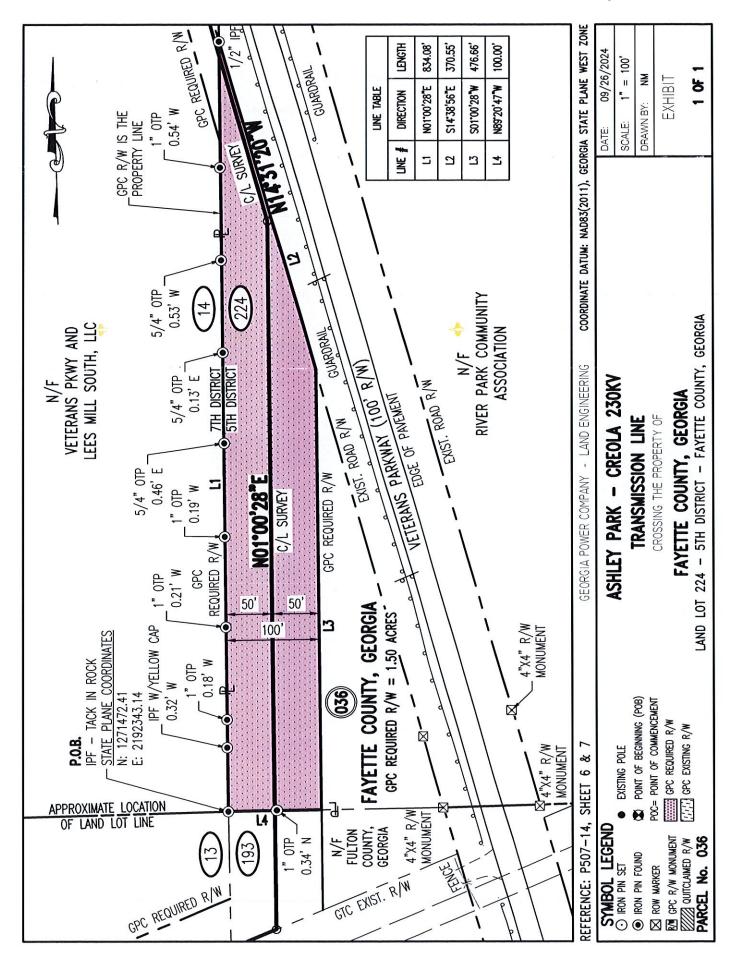

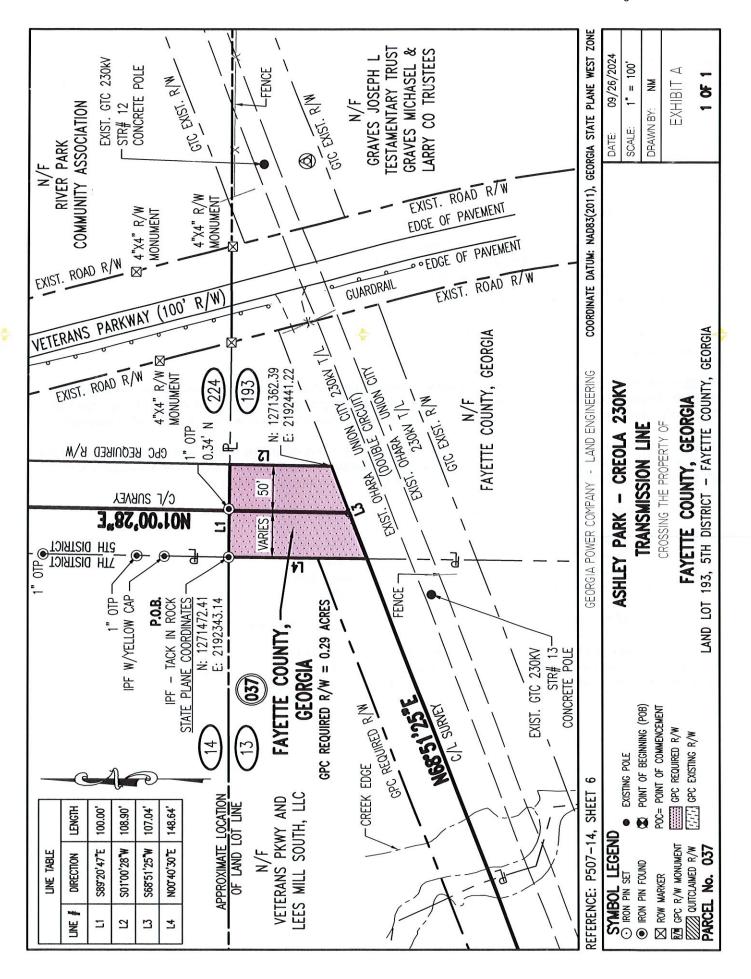

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR FAYETTE
COUNTY; TO REQUEST THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FOR THE STATE OF
GEORGIA PASS LOCAL LEGISLATION CREATING A NEW BOARD OF ELECTIONS
AND REGISTRATION FOR FAYETTE COUNTY; TO PROMOTE THE PUBLIC
HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners for Fayette County (the "County") is the duly elected governing authority for the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has the authority to request the General Assembly for the State of Georgia to adopt local legislation pertaining to the Board of Elections of Fayette County, which was created by local legislation approved on March 24, 1994 (Ga. L. 1994, p. 3712); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined it to be in the best interests of Fayette County and its citizens that legislation be adopted to abolish the existing Board of Elections for Fayette County and create a new Board of Elections and Registration for Fayette County; and

**WHEREAS**, GA. CONST. Art. 1,  $\S$  2,  $\P$  I states that "[a]ll government, of right, originates with the people, is founded upon their will only, and is instituted solely for the good of the

whole. Public officers are the trustees and servants of the people and are at all times amenable to them;" and

**WHEREAS**, GA. CONST. Art. 1, § 2, ¶ II states that "[t]he people of this state have the inherent right of regulating their internal government. Government is instituted for the protection, security, and benefit of the people; and at all times they have the right to alter or reform the same whenever the public good may require it;" and

**WHEREAS**, the Supreme Court of Georgia, in *Delay v. Sutton*, 304 Ga. 338 (2018), held that "private entities do not answer to the people as required by our constitution, [so] they are not authorized to wield the power to appoint public officials ...;" and

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Ga. L. 1994, p. 3712 provides that one member of the Board of Elections of Fayette County is to be appointed by the chairperson for the political party which received the highest number of votes within the county for its candidate for Governor in the general election preceding the appointment of the member and that one member of such Board is to be appointed by the chairperson for the political party which received the second highest number of voters within the county for its candidate for Governor at such election; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined it is in the best interests of Fayette County and its citizens that legislation creating a new Board of Elections and Registration provide, among other things, for appointment of members to such Board in a manner consistent with the Georgia Constitution and the Supreme Court's holdings, as set out above; and

**WHEREAS**, a draft of the local legislation requested by the Board of Commissioners is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners for Fayette

County, Georgia, hereby requests that the General Assembly adopt local legislation repealing Gal L. 1994, p. 3712, abolishing the existing Board of Elections for Fayette County, and creating a new Board of Elections and Registration for Fayette County, as follows:

1.

As used in this Act, the term:

- (1) "Board" shall mean the Fayette County Board of Elections and Registration.
- (2) "County" shall mean Fayette County, Georgia.
- (3) "Election," "elector," "primary," "public office," "special election" and "special primary" shall have the same meanings as ascribed to those terms by Code Section 21-2-2 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, unless otherwise clearly apparent from the text of this Act.
- (4) "Governing authority of the county" shall mean the Board of Commissioners for Fayette County, Georgia.

2.

Pursuant to subsection (b) of Code Section 21-2-40 of the O.C.G.A., there is created a board of elections and registration for Fayette County which shall have jurisdiction over the conduct of primaries and elections and the registration of electors in such county in accordance with the provisions of this Act. Such Board shall be known as the Fayette County Board of Elections and Registration. The Board shall have the powers, duties and responsibilities of the superintendent of elections of Fayette County under Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A., the "Georgia Election Code," currently being exercised by the board of elections of Fayette County, and the powers, duties and responsibilities of the board of registrars of Fayette County under Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A., the "Georgia Election Code," also currently being exercised by the

board of elections of Fayette County.

3.

On July 1, 2026, the board of elections of Fayette County shall be relieved of all powers and duties to which the Board succeeds by the provisions of this Act. They shall deliver thereafter to the chairperson of the Board, upon his or her written request, custody of all equipment, supplies, materials, books, papers, records and facilities of every kind pertaining to such powers and duties. At such time, the board of elections of Fayette County shall stand abolished, and an Act providing a board of elections for Fayette County, as approved March 24, 1994, (Ga. L. 1994, p. 3712), shall stand repealed.

4.

- (a) The Board shall be composed of five members, each of whom shall be an elector of the county and who shall be appointed by the governing authority of the county.
- (b) The three members of the board of elections of Fayette County holding office on the effective date of this Act shall be appointed by the governing authority of the county to serve terms on the Board beginning July 1, 2026, and ending December 31, 2026, or until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. Their successors shall be appointed by the governing authority of the county to serve terms beginning January 1, 2027, and ending December 31, 2030. For the remaining two positions on the Board, the governing authority shall appoint members to serve terms beginning July 1, 2026, and ending December 31, 2028, or until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. The subsequent terms for all positions on the Board shall be for a four-year period, or until successors are appointed and qualified.
- (c) No person who holds or qualifies as a candidate for elective public office shall be eligible

to serve as a member of the Board during their term of such office, and the position of any member of the Board shall be deemed vacant upon such member's qualifying as a candidate for elective public office.

5.

The appointment of each member shall be made by the governing authority of the county filing an affidavit with the clerk of the superior court stating the name and residential address of the person appointed and certifying that such member has been duly appointed as provided in this Act. The clerk of the superior court shall record each such certification on the minutes of the superior court and shall certify the name of each such appointed member to the Secretary of State and provide for the issuance of appropriate commissions to the members within the same time and in the same manner as provided by law for registrars.

6.

Each member of the Board shall be eligible to succeed himself or herself without limitation and shall have the right to resign at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the governing authority of the county. Each member shall be subject to removal from the Board at any time, for cause after notice and hearing, in the same manner and by the same authority as provided for removal of registrars.

7.

In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of any appointed member before the expiration of his or her term by removal, death, resignation, or otherwise, the governing authority of the county shall appoint a successor to serve the remainder of the unexpired term as provided for in Section 4 of this Act. The clerk of the superior court shall be notified of interim appointments and record and certify such appointments in the same manner as the regular appointment of members.

8.

Before entering upon his or her duties, each member of the Board shall take substantially the same oath as required by law for members of a board of elections and registration. Each member of the Board shall have the same privileges from arrest as registrars.

9.

The Board shall be authorized and empowered to organize itself, elect its officers, determine its procedural rules and regulations, adopt bylaws and otherwise take such action as is appropriate to the management of the affairs committed to its supervision; provided, however, that no such action shall conflict with state law. Action and decision by the Board shall be by a majority of the members of the Board present at any meeting at which there is a quorum. The Board shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson at the pleasure of the Board.

10.

The Board may hold regular meetings at such location as the Board may prescribe. All meetings of the Board of whatever kind shall be conducted pursuant to Chapter 14 of Title 50 of the O.C.G.A., relating to open meetings.

11.

With the consent of the governing authority of the county, the Board shall be authorized to expend public funds for the purpose of distributing sample ballots, voter information booklets and other material designed to inform and adequately instruct the electors of the county with regard to elections. No material distributed by the Board shall contain or express, in any manner or form, any commentary or expression of opinion or request for support with respect to any political issue or matter of political concern.

- (a) The county administrator shall hire a full-time elections supervisor to administer and supervise the conduct of elections and primaries and the registration of electors of the county. The elections supervisor shall not be eligible to serve as a member of the Board. The elections supervisor shall be considered a county employee for purposes of pay, benefits, sick leave, vacation, termination of employment and other purposes. The elections supervisor shall be subject to direction, evaluation and corrective action by the county administrator.
- (b) The elections supervisor shall be the chief executive officer and shall generally supervise, direct and control the administration of the affairs of the Board pursuant to law and duly adopted resolutions of the Board. The Board shall fix and establish, by appropriate resolution entered on its minutes, directives governing the execution of matters within its jurisdiction.
- (c) The elections supervisor may recommend to the county administrator for employment such full-time and part-time employees as may be deemed necessary by the elections supervisor and as are approved in the annual budget adopted by the governing authority of the county. All such employees shall be considered county employees for purposes of pay, benefits, sick leave, vacation and other purposes in accordance with policies adopted by the governing authority of the county.

13.

The compensation of the chairperson and other members of the Board, the elections supervisor, clerical assistants and other employees shall be as fixed by the governing authority of the county. Such compensation shall be paid from county funds.

14.

The governing authority of the county shall provide the Board and the elections supervisor with

proper and suitable offices and equipment.

15.

The Board shall have the authority to contract with any municipality located within the county for the holding by the Board of any primary or election to be conducted within the municipality and to contract as otherwise necessary for conduct of an election; provided, however, that any such contract shall be approved and ratified by the governing authority of the county.

16.

- (a) For the purpose of making initial appointments to the Board, this Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

# AN ACT

To create a board of elections and registration for Fayette County and to provide for its powers and duties; to define certain terms; to relieve a certain board and officers of certain powers and duties and provide for the transfer of certain items to the newly created board; to abolish a certain board and officers and to provide for the repeal of the local act related thereto; to provide for the composition of the board and the selection, qualification and terms of its members; to provide for oaths and privileges; to provide for meetings, procedures and vacancies; to provide for expenditures of public funds for certain purposes; to provide for an elections supervisor and the powers and duties of such elections supervisor; to provide for compensation of members of the board and personnel; to provide for offices and equipment; to provide for contracts; to provide for related matters; to provide for effective dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

# **SECTION 1.**

As used in this Act, the term:

- (1) "Board" shall mean the Fayette County Board of Elections and Registration.
- (2) "County" shall mean Fayette County, Georgia.

- (3) "Election," "elector," "primary," "public office," "special election" and "special primary" shall have the same meanings as ascribed to those terms by Code Section 21-2-2 of the O.C.G.A., as amended, unless otherwise clearly apparent from the text of this Act.
- (4) "Governing authority of the county" shall mean the Board of Commissioners for Fayette County, Georgia.

# **SECTION 2.**

Pursuant to subsection (b) of Code Section 21-2-40 of the O.C.G.A., there is created a board of elections and registration for Fayette County which shall have jurisdiction over the conduct of primaries and elections and the registration of electors in such county in accordance with the provisions of this Act. Such Board shall be known as the Fayette County Board of Elections and Registration. The Board shall have the powers, duties and responsibilities of the superintendent of elections of Fayette County under Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A., the "Georgia Election Code," currently being exercised by the board of elections of Fayette County, and the powers, duties and responsibilities of the board of registrars of Fayette County under Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the O.C.G.A., the "Georgia Election Code," also currently being exercised by the board of elections of Fayette County.

#### **SECTION 3.**

On July 1, 2026, the board of elections of Fayette County shall be relieved of all powers and duties to which the Board succeeds by the provisions of this Act. They shall deliver thereafter

to the chairperson of the Board, upon his or her written request, custody of all equipment, supplies, materials, books, papers, records and facilities of every kind pertaining to such powers and duties. At such time, the board of elections of Fayette County shall stand abolished, and an Act providing a board of elections for Fayette County, as approved March 24, 1994, (Ga. L. 1994, p. 3712), shall stand repealed.

# **SECTION 4.**

- (a) The Board shall be composed of five members, each of whom shall be an elector of the county and who shall be appointed by the governing authority of the county.
- (b) The three members of the board of elections of Fayette County holding office on the effective date of this Act shall be appointed by the governing authority of the county to serve terms on the Board beginning July 1, 2026, and ending December 31, 2026, or until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. Their successors shall be appointed by the governing authority of the county to serve terms beginning January 1, 2027, and ending December 31, 2030. For the remaining two positions on the Board, the governing authority shall appoint members to serve terms beginning July 1, 2026, and ending December 31, 2028, or until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. The subsequent terms for all positions on the Board shall be for a four-year period, or until successors are appointed and qualified.
- (c) No person who holds or qualifies as a candidate for elective public office shall be eligible to serve as a member of the Board during their term of such office, and the

position of any member of the Board shall be deemed vacant upon such member's qualifying as a candidate for elective public office.

# **SECTION 5.**

The appointment of each member shall be made by the governing authority of the county filing an affidavit with the clerk of the superior court stating the name and residential address of the person appointed and certifying that such member has been duly appointed as provided in this Act. The clerk of the superior court shall record each such certification on the minutes of the superior court and shall certify the name of each such appointed member to the Secretary of State and provide for the issuance of appropriate commissions to the members within the same time and in the same manner as provided by law for registrars.

# **SECTION 6.**

Each member of the Board shall be eligible to succeed himself or herself without limitation and shall have the right to resign at any time by giving written notice of his or her resignation to the governing authority of the county. Each member shall be subject to removal from the Board at any time, for cause after notice and hearing, in the same manner and by the same authority as provided for removal of registrars.

#### **SECTION 7.**

In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of any appointed member before the expiration of his or her term by removal, death, resignation, or otherwise, the governing authority of the county

shall appoint a successor to serve the remainder of the unexpired term as provided for in Section 4 of this Act. The clerk of the superior court shall be notified of interim appointments and record and certify such appointments in the same manner as the regular appointment of members.

# **SECTION 8.**

Before entering upon his or her duties, each member of the Board shall take substantially the same oath as required by law for members of a board of elections and registration. Each member of the Board shall have the same privileges from arrest as registrars.

# **SECTION 9.**

The Board shall be authorized and empowered to organize itself, elect its officers, determine its procedural rules and regulations, adopt bylaws and otherwise take such action as is appropriate to the management of the affairs committed to its supervision; provided, however, that no such action shall conflict with state law. Action and decision by the Board shall be by a majority of the members of the Board present at any meeting at which there is a quorum. The Board shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson at the pleasure of the Board.

# SECTION 10.

The Board may hold regular meetings at such location as the Board may prescribe. All meetings of the Board of whatever kind shall be conducted pursuant to Chapter 14 of Title 50 of the O.C.G.A., relating to open meetings.

#### **SECTION 11.**

With the consent of the governing authority of the county, the Board shall be authorized to expend public funds for the purpose of distributing sample ballots, voter information booklets and other material designed to inform and adequately instruct the electors of the county with regard to elections. No material distributed by the Board shall contain or express, in any manner or form, any commentary or expression of opinion or request for support with respect to any political issue or matter of political concern.

# **SECTION 12.**

- (a) The county administrator shall hire a full-time elections supervisor to administer and supervise the conduct of elections and primaries and the registration of electors of the county. The elections supervisor shall not be eligible to serve as a member of the Board. The elections supervisor shall be considered a county employee for purposes of pay, benefits, sick leave, vacation, termination of employment and other purposes. The elections supervisor shall be subject to direction, evaluation and corrective action by the county administrator.
- (b) The elections supervisor shall be the chief executive officer and shall generally supervise, direct and control the administration of the affairs of the Board pursuant to law and duly adopted resolutions of the Board. The Board shall fix and establish, by appropriate resolution entered on its minutes, directives governing the execution of matters within its jurisdiction.
- (c) The elections supervisor may recommend to the county administrator for employment such full-time and part-time employees as may be deemed necessary by the elections supervisor

and as are approved in the annual budget adopted by the governing authority of the county. All such employees shall be considered county employees for purposes of pay, benefits, sick leave, vacation and other purposes in accordance with policies adopted by the governing authority of the county.

# **SECTION 13.**

The compensation of the chairperson and other members of the Board, the elections supervisor, clerical assistants and other employees shall be as fixed by the governing authority of the county. Such compensation shall be paid from county funds.

# **SECTION 14.**

The governing authority of the county shall provide the Board and the elections supervisor with proper and suitable offices and equipment.

# **SECTION 15.**

The Board shall have the authority to contract with any municipality located within the county for the holding by the Board of any primary or election to be conducted within the municipality and to contract as otherwise necessary for conduct of an election; provided, however, that any such contract shall be approved and ratified by the governing authority of the county.

## **SECTION 16.**

- (a) For the purpose of making initial appointments to the Board, this Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
- (b) For all other purposes, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2026.

## **SECTION 17.**

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners for Fayette County (the "County") is the duly elected governing authority for the County; and

WHEREAS, O.C.G.A. § 1-3-12(a) provides that any local law in effect as of July 1, 2025, that provides for a salary, supplement, or other compensation to be paid to a state, county, or local officer, official, or employee based on a percentage of, total compensation for, or similar mathematical relationship to any superior court judge's salary, supplement, or other compensation shall be suspended as a matter of law with respect to any increase in the salary, supplement, or other compensation paid to a superior court judge during the term of such

suspension; and

WHEREAS, O.C.G.A. § 1-3-12(c) provides that the General Assembly may repeal or amend, in whole or in part, any local law that is suspended pursuant to subsection (a) described above, and any such repeal or amendment shall become effective in the time and manner stated in the law implementing such repeal or amendment, without regard to the suspension provided for in said subsection (a); and

WHEREAS, the local law creating the State Court of Fayette County (Ga. L. 1994, p. 4980, as amended, particularly by Ga. L. 2022, p. 5856), establishes the compensation for the judge and the solicitor of the State Court of Fayette County as a percentage of a superior court judge's salary; and

**WHEREAS**, the compensation provisions of the local law creating the State Court of Fayette County are suspended as of July 1, 2025, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 1-3-12(a); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners requests that the General Assembly adopt a local law amending the compensation provisions of the local law creating the State Court of Fayette County, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 1-3-12(c); and

**WHEREAS**, a draft of the local legislation requested by the Board of Commissioners is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof by this reference.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Commissioners for Fayette County, Georgia, hereby requests that the General Assembly adopt local legislation amending the compensation for the judge and the solicitor of the State Court of Fayette County as follows:

The additional compensation provided for in this subsection shall be effective for a particular judge on the first day of January following the completion of each such four-year term of office.

- (a) The solicitor of the State Court of Fayette County shall receive a base salary in an amount equal to \$154,605.20. Such base salary may be supplemented as provided by general and/or local law. Such compensation shall be paid in equal monthly installments from the funds of Fayette County.
- (b) In addition to the compensation provided for in subsection (a) of this section, the solicitor shall receive additional compensation in an amount equal to 5 percent of the amount provided for in subsection (a) of this section multiplied by the number of completed four-year terms of office served by the solicitor, provided that such terms have been completed after July 1, 2022. The additional compensation provided for in this subsection shall be effective for a particular solicitor on the first day of January following the completion of each such four-year term of office.

Pond & Company (Pond) is pleased to submit this proposal for transportation engineering services for the above project. The paragraphs below describe the professional services and fees to accomplish this work.

### **PROJECT UNDERSTANDING:**

As part of the Fayette County Engineer of Record contract, Fayette County is seeking services to evaluate the intersection of Sandy Creek Road at Ellison Road to determine any environmental resources, existing and proposed operations, and intersection control and configuration. This project will consist of a traffic engineering report, environmental services, and concept design. Two intersection alternatives will be evaluated – a Roundabout and a Realignment of Ellison Road. The realignment alternative will determine the need for turn lane improvements as well as if signalized control is warranted.

### PROFESSIONAL SERVICES:

The work in this proposal will consist of environmental services, traffic analysis, and concept design. Pond, along with our subconsultants (if applicable), will provide the design services necessary in completing the tasks as described herein for Fayette County.

### Scope of Work

### Task 1: Environmental Screening

Task 1A. Environmental Services – Pond will complete a preliminary Desktop Environmental Screening to identify potential resources or constraints within the project area. More specifically, Pond will conduct a thorough review of publicly available online data sources including, at a minimum:

 Environmental Screening Report (recommendations section will include any next steps required to satisfy NEPA requirements, if Federal Aid is received for any phase of the project)

### Task 2: Traffic Analysis

Task 2A. Traffic Data Collection – Traffic data collection will be conducted by a traffic counting firm as a subconsultant to Pond. Please note that all traffic data collection will be performed when schools are in session, avoiding holidays. The following data collection program is proposed based on engineering judgement:

- 24-Hour Bi-Directional Volume and Classification Counts
  - o Sandy Creek Road, e/o Ellison Road
  - o Ellison Road, s/o Sandy Creek Road
- 13-Hour Turning Movement Count (TMC)
  - o Sandy Creek Road at Ellison Road

Task 2B. Field Visit to Document Existing Conditions – Pond will complete a field visit to the intersection of Sandy Creek Road at Ellison Road to observe existing field conditions. Pictures will be taken to properly document the existing conditions, including geometry, sight distance, vehicle queuing, and speed limits. The intersection will also be reviewed to identify current deficiencies.

Task 2C. Traffic Analysis – Pond will analyze the traffic at the intersection of Sandy Creek Road at Ellison Road. A review of crash history will be completed utilizing GDOT's Numetric databases. Capacity analysis will be performed for the intersection using Synchro Software. This analysis will be performed for the AM and PM peak hours of the existing year, opening year, and design year. Analysis of the opening and design years will include a build (both alternatives – roundabout and turn lane improvement with/without traffic signal) and no-build condition. The Georgia Department of Transportation's (GDOT) Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) Tool will be utilized to determine the potential improvements at the intersection stated above, as/if needed. Both Stage 1 and Stage 2 evaluation will be required. These alternatives will then be analyzed to determine recommendations.

PC Warrants will be utilized to complete a signal warrant analysis and evaluation for the intersection of Sandy Creek Road at Ellison Road. This will determine which warrants within the MUTCD are met, as well as consider the GDOT requirements for Peak Hour, 4-Hour, and 8-Hour warrant criteria.



*Task 2D.* Traffic Engineering Report – Pond will document the analysis results and recommendations in a Traffic Engineering Report.

- Pond will submit the TE Report to Fayette County for comment/approval. This task includes one meeting
  with the county to discuss the plans. We will respond to (1) round of comments and incorporate
  appropriate comments into the report.

### Task 3: Concept Design

Task 3A. Base Mapping Setup – Pond will utilize available GIS information and aerial imagery to prepare the base mapping. This includes parcel data, roadway data, utility data, and contour/lidar information. This information will be overlayed on high-resolution aerial imagery.

Task 3B. Property Research and Resolution – Property research and resolution services will be performed by a sub-consultant and provided to Pond. The limits include approximately 1,000 LF along Sandy Creek Road (centered at the intersection), as well as approximately 600 LF along Ellison Road (centered at the intersection). These limits will be verified at field level accuracy to ensure accurate property and right-of-way data.

Concept Design – Pond will prepare (2) concept layouts to show the general improvement geometrics of the intersection alternatives (identified during Task 2) on available GIS data and aerial imagery (Task 3A). The concept layout will indicate the proposed improvements and potential impacts, including estimated property/right-of-way, utilities, etc. The alternative will consist of the following:

- Alternative 1 Roundabout

Pond appreciates the opportunity to assist you with conducting and environmental assessment, producing erosion and sediment control plans, and permitting for the fill material stockpile at the Fayette County Public Works facility at 1<sup>st</sup> Manassas Mile.

### **PROJECT UNDERSTANDING AND APPROACH**

We understand that Fayette County has cleared an area at the Public Works Facility at 328 1st Manassas Mile and currently using it to stockpile fill dirt to be used on County projects (See Stockpile Area **Figure 1**). The County is requesting that Pond prepare Erosion & Sedimentation Control Plans for the disturbed area that is approximately 4 acres. Pond conducted a site visit with County personnel on Tuesday July 1st, 2025. Based on the observations during that site visit Pond is also recommending an Environmental Assessment, limited topographic survey, and permitting of the facility as further described in the detailed scope of services below.

The following describes the detailed scope of services.

### **DETAILED SCOPE OF SERVICES**

#### I. ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT AND PERMITING

### A. Water Resource Delineation & Reporting

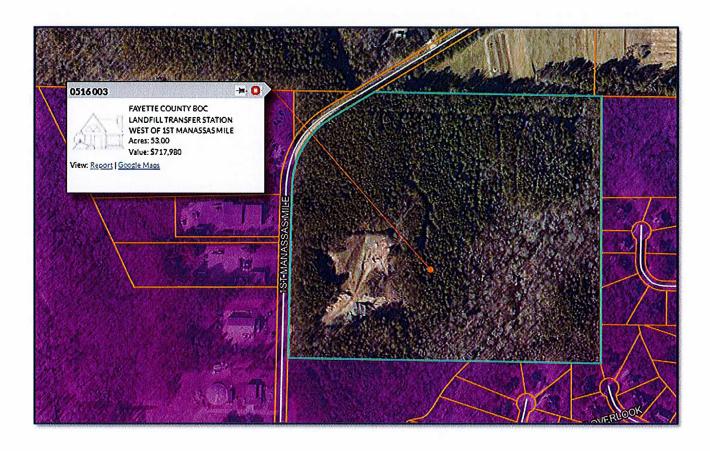


Figure 2 - Environmental Survey Boundary

Pond scientists will complete an on-site identification of potential waters of the United States (WOTUS) within the ~53-acre Environmental Survey Boundary (ESB; Figure 2) that may be subject to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) regulation. The ESB is entirely located on Parcel ID 0516 003, owned by Fayette County. The on-site delineation of WOTUS will be conducted in accordance with the 1987 Corps of Engineers Wetlands Delineation Manual and the Regional Supplement to the Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual: Eastern Mountains and Piedmont Region (Version 2.0). Additionally, state waters and their associated 25-foot warm water stream buffers, as regulated by the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (GA EPD), will be identified and documented. Delineated resources will be flagged in the field and mapped using a survey-grade GPS unit capable of sub-meter accuracy. Representative data for jurisdictional WOTUS will be captured using the USACE Wetland Determination Data Form — Eastern Mountains and Piedmont Region. A general pedestrian survey of the potentially suitable protected species habitat will be conducted to ascertain the probability of the occurrence of threatened and endangered species on the site. During the pedestrian survey, general observations of the borrow pit activities and any associated sediment will be documented to understand the extent of the sediment plume. Field-collected GPS data of state-regulated buffers, streams, and wetlands will be processed and added to GIS mapping for the project site. Following the completion of the on-site water resources delineation, findings will be summarized in an Environmental Survey Report.

Deliverables will include an Environmental Survey Report, GIS mapping of delineated resources, and photographs. USACE Wetland Determination data forms will be completed (as needed) for Task 2. The environmental survey report will include a review of environmental permitting constraints and potential compensatory mitigation requirements.

### B. USACE Jurisdictional Determination

Following client review of the Environmental Survey Report, either a Preliminary or Approved Jurisdictional Determination Request, or Aquatic Resource Delineation Review (PJD/AJD/ARDR) package will be prepared and submitted to the USACE Savannah District for review and concurrence of delineated resources. The AJD, if selected, will identify the limits of waters on the project site determined to be jurisdictional under the CWA and provide written confirmation that the jurisdictional determination is correct and can be relied upon to withstand legal challenges for a period of five (5) years. A PJD or ARDR may be prepared as an alternative to the AJD if the jurisdictional status of water resources does not require challenging as non-jurisdictional. Coordination will be completed with the client ahead of initiating the USACE determination deliverable to confirm the recommended approach. The request will include the following forms:

- USACE Savannah District Approved Jurisdictional Determination Form
- Appendix 1 Preliminary Jurisdictional Determination Form (if selected)
- GIS Mapping of Waters within the Review Area
- USACE Wetland Determination Data Forms
- Supplemental Figures and Data (Soils, USGS, FEMA, NHD/NWI)
- One (1) Site Visit with USACE Representative, if required

### C. GA EPD Surface Mining Permit Application

Any surface mining activity, including borrow pits exceeding 1.1 acres, requires a Surface Mining Permit from the GA EPD and the submission of supporting engineering documentation such as an erosion and sedimentation control plan and a reclamation plan. Pond will lead coordination with the GAEPD's Land Protection Branch to obtain the necessary permit. This effort includes compiling and documenting site-specific information, property ownership and land use consistency, applicable environmental permits, and the proposed mining and reclamation plans. Information collected during the Water Resource Delineation will inform the preparation of the permit application package. Pond will engage with GAEPD as needed to communicate the site's purpose and justification, facilitating an efficient review process. Please note that permitting timelines and approval requirements are determined solely at the discretion of the regulatory agency.

### II. LIMITED TOPOGRAPHIC AND RIGHT OF WAY SURVEY

A. Pond will utilize available GIS information to establish baseline conditions with limited field run topographic survey where supplementation is needed. The fee provided in this proposal is an estimate and may be modified based on the results of the environmental assessment and civil engineering site visit.

B. The topographic coverage will define the profile of the terrain using 2-foot contours, stream channel banks, streambed elevations, edge of water, and any other delineation locations determined in Task I.

### III. EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PLANS

- A. Pond will collect available GIS information and create an Existing Conditions Plan to be used as a basis for preparing the Erosion & Sediment Control (E&SC) Plans
- B. Pond Civil Engineers will visit the site to observe the existing conditions, evaluate drainage patterns, observe existing erosion impacts at the site, and evaluate the need for additional limited field topographic survev.
- C. Pond will prepare (E&SC) Plans to be used for permitting and implementation in the field. Pond will submit 65-, and 95- percent completion phases to the County for review and comment. The E&SC Comments will be addressed for each completed phase submittal that fits within the scope of this proposal.
- D. The following general plan sheet format will be used:
  - 1. Cover Sheet;
  - 2. Notes, Legend, and Abbreviations;
  - 3. Existing Conditions Plan;
  - 4. Erosion and sedimentation control plans and notes;
  - 5. Construction details.

### **Assumptions and Conditions of Service:**

- Pond understands that the current use of the property may have resulted in unintended impacts to downstream
  water resources. This scope of work does not include corrective action plans or any such coordination with
  regulatory agencies. Support through addressing any environmental regulatory violations may be completed
  via a contract change order. Pond will coordinate with the client ahead of submittal to any agency to discuss
  the implications of our water resources delineation findings.
- 2. Specific protected species surveys are not included. If potentially suitable protected species habitat is identified during the water resource delineation, species-specific surveys may be required. If protected species surveys are deemed necessary, they may be completed via a contract change order.
- 3. No property access coordination is included. It is assumed the client would provide reasonable access to the property for the completion of the water resource delineation.
- 4. Pond will complete the water resource delineation within 6-weeks of notice to proceed.
- 5. USACE/GA EPD has communicated that standard review periods for submittals can no longer be met due to reduced staffing and workload. Pond will coordinate closely with the project's USACE/ GA EPD project manager to ensure the efficient agency review, to the extent practicable.

911 is seeking an easy integration of technology into their quality assurance (QA), training, and evolution process. This technology will offer solutions to the QA teams, supervisors and trainers to focus on coaching and training rather than administrative tasks. There are upcoming revisions in APCO/NENA ANS 1.107.1.2015 - Standard for the Establishment of a Quality Assurance and Quality Improvement Program for Public Safety Answering Points, (Attachment 1), that will establish the requirements needed for quality assurance.

911 was able to find two companies that offer the specific product; however, the other company Prepared, does not integrate with our phone system (Carbyne). Peachtree City and Fayetteville police requested a product to allow officers to listen to 911 calls while they respond. Prepared is not currently capable of receiving our calls/recordings from the phone system due to the encryption Carbyne uses. Carbyne would be required to develop a way to reduce their encryption to work with Prepared in that capacity or for our current proposal. That development fee would be the responsibility of Fayette County, adding to any cost of the Prepared product.

911 recommends awarding to GovWorx. A Contractor Performance Evaluation is not available since this is the first time contracting with GovWorx. 911 checked their references, and the responses were favorable.

## GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS Contract 26037-S Radio Transcription and Coaching Software

- 1. **Definitions**: The term "contractor" as used herein and elsewhere in these Terms and Conditions shall be used synonymously with the term "GovWorx". The term "county" shall mean Fayette County, Georgia.
- 2. **Ethics Disclosure of Relationships**: Before a proposed contract in excess of \$10,000.00 is recommended for award to the Board of Commissioners or the County Administrator, or before the County renews, extends, or otherwise modifies a contract after it has been awarded, the contractor must disclose certain relationships with any County Commissioner or County Official, or their spouse, mother, father, grandparent, brother, sister, son or daughter related by blood, adoption, or marriage (including in-laws). A relationship that must be reported exists if any of these individuals is a director, officer, partner, or employee, or has a substantial financial interest the business, as described in Fayette County Ordinance Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 3 (Code of Ethics).

If such relationship exists between your company and any individual mentioned above, relevant information must be presented in the form of a written letter to the Director of Purchasing. You must include the letter with any bid, proposal, or price quote you submit to the Purchasing Department.

In the event that a contractor fails to comply with this requirement, the County will take action as appropriate to the situation, which may include actions up to and including rejection of the bid or offer, cancellation of the contract in question, or debarment or suspension from award of a County contract for a period of up to three years.

- 3. Payment Terms and Discounts: See GovWorx Terms of Service, Section 4.
- 4. Contract Execution & Notice to Proceed: After an award is made, and all required documents are received by the county, and the contract is fully executed with signature of both parties, the county will issue a written Notice to Proceed. The county shall not be liable for payment of any work done or any costs incurred by any responder prior to the county issuing the Notice to Proceed.
- 5. **Term of Contract**: See GovWorx Terms of Service Section 2b.
- 6. **Unavailability of Funds**: This contract will terminate immediately and absolutely at such time as appropriated and otherwise unobligated funds are no longer available to satisfy the obligations of the county under the contract.
- 7. **Unauthorized Performance:** The County will not compensate the contractor for work performed unless the work is authorized under the contract, as initially executed or as amended.
- 8. **Indemnification**: The contractor shall indemnify and save the county and all its officers, agents and employees harmless from all suits, actions, or other claims of any character, name and description brought for or on account of any damages, losses, or expenses to the

- extent caused by or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, or intentionally wrongful conduct of the contractor or other persons employed or utilized by the contractor in the performance of the contract. The contractor shall pay any judgment with cost which may be obtained against the county growing out of such damages, losses, or expenses.
- 9. **Severability**: The invalidity of one or more of the phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in the contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the contract. If any provision of the contract is held to be unenforceable, then both parties shall be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision to the extent that the provision is unenforceable. In such case, the contract shall be deemed amended to the extent necessary to make it enforceable while preserving its intent.
- 10. **Termination for Cause**: See GovWorx Terms of Service, Section 5b.
- 11. **Termination for Convenience**: The county may terminate the contract for its convenience at any time with 10 days' written notice to the contractor. In the event of termination for convenience, the county will pay the contractor for services performed. The county will compensate partially completed performance based upon a signed statement of completion.

- b) Subscription Term. Unless otherwise specified in an applicable Order Form, SaaS Subscriptions shall commence on the Effective Date and remain in effect for twelve (12) consecutive months, unless terminated earlier in accordance with this Agreement (the "Initial Term"). - Customer Responsibilities. Customer will not, and will ensure its Authorized Users do not (a) make any of the Services
  available to anyone other than Authorized Users or use any Services for the benefit of anyone other than Customer and its
  Authorized Users, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties, (b) sell, resell, license, sublicense, distribute, make

## 4. Payment Terms.

- Customer Data. - b) Obligations. The Receiving Party will: (i) use the same degree of care it uses to protect the confidentiality of its own confidential information of like kind (but not less than reasonable care); (ii) not use any Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party for any purpose outside the scope of this Agreement and (iii) except as otherwise authorized by the Disclosing Party in writing, limit access to Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party to those of its employees and contractors who need access for purposes consistent with this Agreement and who have signed confidentiality agreements with the Receiving Party containing protections not less protective of the Confidential Information than those herein.
- c) <u>Exceptions</u>. The Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party to the extent compelled by law to do so, provided the Receiving Party gives the Disclosing Party prior notice of the compelled disclosure (to the extent legally permitted) and reasonable assistance, at the Disclosing Party's cost, if the Disclosing Party wishes to contest the disclosure.

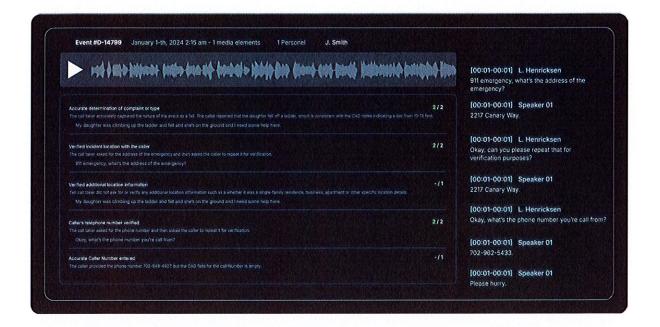

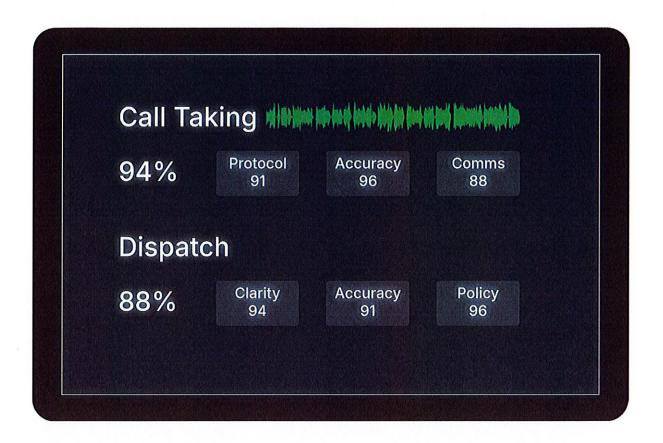
