#### APPLICANT'S COVENANT

As the applicant for a Sign Permit on the property hereon described, I do hereby covenant that the information supplied with this application is true and correct and I do hereby agree to comply with the ordinances of Fayette County pertaining to zoning, signs, and subdivisions. It is understood and agreed by me that any error, misstatement, or misrepresentation of fact, either with or without intention on my part, such as might, if known, cause a refusal of this application or any alteration or change in plans made without approval of the Zoning Administrator subsequent to the issuance of a Sign Permit, shall constitute sufficient grounds for revocation of said Sign Permit and any Electrical Permit resulting therefrom. I am aware that approval by Fayette County does not relieve me from applicable State regulations for any sign placed on a State Highway and said sign placement/location must also be permitted by Georgia DOT, Thomaston, Georgia if site fronts a State Road.

### SIGNS ALLOWED IN NONRESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS:

### Free-Standing (Section 5-32. Freestanding Signs)

Unless otherwise provided herein, lots located in a nonresidential zoning district containing a single busines shall be allowed no more than one (1) permanent freestanding sign. The sign face shall not exceed 50 square feet in area or six (6) feet in height. Sign structures shall not exceed seven (7) feet in height. Such sign may be internally of externally illuminated. A permit shall be required.
Unless otherwise provided herein, lots located in a nonresidential zoning district containing a multibusinesses shall be allowed no more than one (1) permanent freestanding sign. The sign face shall not exceed 60 square feet in area or seven (7) feet in height. Sign structures shall not exceed eight (8) feet in height. Individua business names are included in the total square footage. Such signs may be internally or externally illuminated. A permit shall be required.
Unless otherwise provided herein, no more than two (2) signs shall be allowed to be placed at each entrance of a non-residential subdivision. These signs must be placed on common property under the ownership of the Property Owners Association (POA) and shall not be allowed to be on private property. The sign face shall no exceed thirty-five (35) square feet in area or five (5) feet in height. Sign structures shall not exceed six (6) feet in height. If the sign or sign structure is attached to a Decorate Wall or fence, the Decorate Wall or fence shall not exceed four (4) feet in height. The post and/or columns of the Decorative Wall or fence shall not exceed six (6) feet in height. A permit shall be required. Said signs may be internally or externally illuminated.

## Wall Signs (Section 5-33. Wall Signs)

Wall signs shall be placed on the principal structure only, and may be internally and externally illuminated. A permit shall be required. Number. Each parcel containing a single business shall be allowed not more than one (1) wall sign. On parcels containing multiple businesses, each business shall be allowed a wall sign. Location. No wall sign shall be placed on any roof or on top of any structure. In addition, no part of a wall sign shall be at an elevation higher than twenty-five (25) feet above the average ground level elevation along the side of the building on which the wall sign is installed. If a building has two (2) or more stories, no signs shall be installed at a level above the bottom of the second floor windows, unless the building is a multi-tenant office or multi-tenant commercial structure wherein tenants have primary, direct access from their space to the outside. This access must include outside walkways and stairways properly designed for public use. Erection. All wall signs shall be safely and securely attached to the building wall, subject to the approval of the Building Official. Size/calculation. The allowable front wall sign area for each building shall not exceed two (2) square feet per linear foot of the front length of the building or portion thereof occupied. If the sign is a panel or box, the total area including background is included. If a sign consists of individual letters, each attached directly to a building or structure, the area of the sign shall be measured by the area of the smallest rectangle or series of contiguous rectangles which enclose all the letters. Mural graphics shall be permitted. Such signs may not be internally illuminated. Murals are allowed in lieu of wall signage but cannot cover more area than would be allowed in Section 5-33(4). A permit shall be required.

# **Banners** (Section 5-35. Banners)

Banners shall be allowed for a period not exceeding fourteen (14) days with not more than three (3) such fourteen (14) day periods being permitted per calendar year per lot. In the case of lots which contain multiple businesses, each business will get a Banner. Banners shall not be more than thirty-two (32) square feet. A permit shall be required.

No banner shall be mounted so as to extend above the horizontal plane of the roof where the building wall and roof meet or shall not extend more than five (5) feet above grade when on the ground.

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One (1) additional sign shall be allowed during construction. Said sign shall not be internally illuminated. <u>A permit shall be required</u>. <u>Duration</u>. Said sign shall be allowed beginning with the issuance of a Land Disturbance Permit and ending with the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy or installation of a permanent sign, whichever occurs first. <u>Size</u>. Said sign shall not exceed twenty (20) square feet in area nor five (5) feet in height. No sign may be located any closer than twenty (20) feet from an intersection as measured from the intersection of the two (2) rights of-way. This sign is in addition to the number of signs allowed in Section 5-32.

# \_\_\_ Suspended Signs (Section 5-39 Suspended Signs)

In a multi-tenant commercial or office building, in addition to all other permitted signs, one (1) projecting non-illuminated sign per entrance used shall be allowed to identify the location of each tenant's premises. A permit shall be required. Suspended signs shall adhere to the following: Does not exceed three (3) square feet in area; Is uniform in size, material, color and shape and is placed in an equivalent location to other such signs located on the same building; Is suspended from the eave or soffit of the building; and, Maintains a minimum of seven (7) feet clearance between the bottom of the sign and the walkway below.

### SIGNS ALLOWED IN RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICTS:

### Residential Freestanding Signs (Section 5-22. Residential Freestanding Signs)

One (1) additional sign shall be allowed during construction. Said sign shall not be internally illuminated. Apermit shall be required. Duration. Said sign shall be allowed beginning with the issuance of a Land Disturbance Permit and ending with the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy or installation of a permanent sign, whichever occurs first. Size. Said sign shall not exceed twelve (12) square feet in area nor five (5) feet in height. No sign may be located any closer than twenty (20) feet from an intersection as measured from the intersection of the two (2) rights-of-way. This sign is in addition to the number of signs allowed in Section 5-22.
