O.C.G.A. 50-14-1(3)(B) reads: The regular minutes of a meeting subject to this chapter shall be promptly recorded and such records shall be open to public inspection once approved as official by the agency or its committee, but in no case later than immediately following its next regular meeting; provided, however, that nothing contained in this chapter shall prohibit the earlier release of minutes, whether approved by the agency or not. Such minutes shall, at a minimum, include the names of the members present at the meeting, a description of each motion or other proposal made, the identity of the person making and seconding the motion or other proposal, and a record of all votes. The name of each person voting for or against a proposal shall be recorded. It shall be presumed that the action taken was approved by each person in attendance unless the minutes reflect the name of the persons voting against the proposal or abstaining.

MINUTES

May 25, 2018
 5:00 p.m.

Welcome to the meeting of your Fayette County Board of Elections. Your participation is appreciated. All regularly scheduled Board meetings are open to the public and are generally held on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 5:00 p.m.

Chairman to Call the Meeting to Order

Chairman Lester called the May 25, 2018 Board of Elections Meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. It was noted that Mr. Hicks would not be in attendance at the meeting since he would be at his son's graduation ceremony.

Approval of the Agenda

Mr. Wright moved to approve the Agenda as published. Chairman Lester seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not present for the vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

No one spoke during Public Comments.

CERTIFICATION:**1. Certification of the May 22, 2018 General Primary Election Results.**

County Registrar Brian Hill presented seven provisional ballots for recommended rejection. Two of the rejected ballots were for failure to provide identification. Three of the rejected ballots were based on the voter not registered to vote in Fayette County and / or the State of Georgia. One voter with a rejected provisional ballot was registered to vote in Fulton County. The remaining voter with a rejected provisional ballot was registered to vote in Lamar County.

Mr. Wright moved to approve staff's recommendation to reject the seven provisional ballots. Chairman Lester seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not present for the vote.

Mr. Hill presented sixteen provisional ballots with recommendation for approval. He noted that ten of the provisional ballots were partially counted since the voters voted out of their assigned precincts and the remaining six ballots were fully counted since they voted within their assigned precincts.

Mr. Hill stated that due to a poll worker error at Precinct #28, a voter's son was allowed to vote under his mom's voter registration number. The son, whose name is Jalen Ridges, is not registered to vote. The mother, Jarvis Ridges, is a registered voter but her son was allowed to vote under her name. Mr. Hill reported that he contacted the state once this error was discovered after the vote was cast electronically. Mr. Mark Ridges and Jarvis Ridges came to vote after their son had cast an electronic ballot, and

they desired to vote. It was then that the error was discovered as the record showed Mrs. Ridges had already voted. Mr. Hill explained that the state's liaison recommended to staff that since this was a polling error, to cast a provisional ballot, and upon approval by the Board then the ballot would be run but not entered into E-Net as a provisional or counted ballot. Mr. Hill explained that if the provisional ballot is entered into E-Net then it would count as two votes coming from Mrs. Ridges. Discussion followed concerning poll worker training issues and this voter issue.

Mr. Hill stated that Mr. Mark Ridges called him and was upset about the situation. Mr. Ridges stated that his son registered to vote through the Department of Drivers Services (DDS) at age sixteen, but it is known that voter registration cannot occur until the voter will be 18 years old at the time of the election, so there was some voter error in getting registered. It was concluded that there was error both on the sides of the voter who had not actually registered to vote and on the poll worker. Mr. Wright stated that the provisional ballot should not be counted since a vote was already in the system; although in a perfect world the vote could be cancelled and redone. Discussion continued on what would occur if the provisional ballot was rejected.

Mr. Wright made a recommendation to decline the provisional ballot since the voter's profile showed she had already voted. He stated that it would be better to have one vote per profile. Chairman Lester leaned toward approving the provisional ballot as recommended by the state. Discussion continued about the conversation between Mr. Hill and Mr. Ridges and whether Mr. Ridges would involve the state on this matter. Mr. Hill advised that Mr. Ridges encouraged his son to register to vote. Chairman Lester asked how a response to the Ridges would be crafted. It was agreed that a reply would have to be sent to the Ridges giving them an opportunity for a hearing.

Mr. Wright stated there was fault both with the poll manager as well as with the person who did not register to vote. Chairman Lester agreed and recommended that the provisional ballot be rejected. Mr. Hill stated that there may be backlash from the Ridge's family when and if there is a response. It was further agreed that a brief synopsis be provided to Mr. Hicks so he could be made aware of the situation should there be a response from the Ridge's family.

Mr. Wright moved to accept staff's recommendation to approve the presented provisional ballots as approved and further to reject the Ridge's provisional ballot. Chairman Lester seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not being present for the vote.

Mr. Hill was dismissed from the meeting in order to process the provisional ballots for the certification of the May 22, 2018 General Primary Election. Mr. Hill remained out of the meeting for the remainder of its duration.

After the Board member report occurred toward the end of the meeting, the Board waited for approximately 50 minutes as the election results were tabulated and printed from the GEMS Server.

Chairman Lester moved to certify the election results as presented with the counted provisional ballots. Mr. Wright seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not present for the vote.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2. Consideration of staff's request to approve the April 24, 2018 Board of Elections' Meeting Minutes.

Mr. Wright moved to approve the minutes as presented. Chairman Lester seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not present for the vote.

PUBLIC HEARING:

3. Public Hearing of staff's recommendation to remove registered Fayette County voters from the Electors List who are registered in the State of Georgia's Secretary of State Voter Registration System as deceased.

No one spoke in favor of or in opposition to staff's recommendation.

Chairman Lester moved to approve staff's recommendation to remove registered Fayette County voters from the Electors List who are registered in the State of Georgia's Secretary of State Voter Registration System as deceased, as presented. Mr. Wright seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not being present for the vote. A copy of the request, identified as "Attachment 1," follows these minutes and is made an official part hereof.

Director Jones pointed out that there were no felons to consider for removal on this Agenda.

CONSENT AGENDA:

There was no Consent Agenda Item.

OLD BUSINESS:

4. Continued discussion regarding the daily / hourly pay of Absentee staff. This topic was last discussed at the April 24, 2018 Board of Election Meeting.

Director Jones stated that this item was discussed at the previous meeting. Since that time, County Administrator Steve Rapson emailed County Attorney Dennis Davenport asking if the seasonal, temporary workers could be made contractual employees. He added that the effort would help to address how those workers would be paid. Mr. Davenport provided four different memos mostly from the year 2002 stating that the seasonal, temporary workers could not be made contractual. Mr. Rapson then asked for feedback from Human Resources Director Lewis Patterson, Chief Financial Officer Mary Parrott, and from Elections. Mr. Jones reported that Human Resources and Finance agreed with Mr. Davenport, but that he wrote a lengthy reply.

Mr. Jones found it interesting that Coweta County could get their workers into a contractual status based on a lawsuit, but that Fayette County could not. He suspected the laws of Fayette County and Coweta County are the same on this matter.

Mr. Wright and Chairman Lester thought the workers could not be contractual. Mr. Jones replied that if the workers were considered actual employees then that would bring its own implications regarding raises, promotions, and benefits. He pointed out that this has apparently been considered for many years and that it was probably better to have a current answer rather than something that was reviewed in 2002. He stated that Mr. Rapson had, apparently, sent this matter back to Mr. Davenport for another review and that, apparently, Mr. Davenport was making that review.

Mr. Wright asked if Mr. Davenport had reviewed the legal contract from Coweta County. Mr. Jones replied that he was not sure what Mr. Davenport had reviewed, but that Mr. Davenport is aware of the contract and that it is the result of a Coweta County lawsuit.

The Board did not provide direction or take action on this item. A copy of the request, identified as "Attachment 2," follows these minutes and is made an official part hereof.

NEW BUSINESS:

5. Discussion concerning Senate Bill 19, commonly referred to as the "Brunch Bill."

Director Jones stated that Senate Bill 19 would expand the time for alcohol sales on Sundays, but in order to make that expansion counties and cities must have the matter approved by the voters in a referendum. He explained how the referendum would occur. He said the nightmare scenarios are that the cities and the county call for referendums at different times making the Elections Office run numerous elections. Another nightmare scenario is that this matter is another potential example of dual voting if the city ballots cannot be placed on the November ballot. He stated that he called the state about the potential of a dual voting in November and that the state has not provided explanation on how the concern could be handled. He concluded that this was a matter on the horizon and could be coming up in the future.

The Board did not provide direction or make an action on this matter. A copy of the request, identified as "Attachment 3," follows these minutes and is made an official part hereof.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Early Voting Location: Director Jones stated that he had talked to staff and the Tech Team and there was a question about how many sites to open during the Advanced In-Person Runoff Election for all three weeks. It was noted that Advanced In-Person for the Runoff Election would begin on July 2, would not occur on the July 4th holiday, and would not involve Saturday voting. It was further understood that the runoff election would occur over the 4th of July holiday week and that the State's liaison had reported that the state anticipated a 5% turnout across the state- which is approximately half of the statewide turnout for the May 22, 2018 General Primary. Director Jones recommended keeping the Fayette County location open for all three weeks, the Peachtree City location would be opened for weeks two and three, and the Tyrone location would be opened for only week three. Chairman Lester agreed to the recommendation as presented so long as signage is posted for all three weeks. He said if anyone questioned the decision then it could be explained that voter turnout is anticipated to be low and that the county is trying to be a good steward of the county funds. It was further decided to keep staffing to as minimal as possible.

Signage: Director Jones stated that Elections Supervisor April Crosby and he are looking at purchasing new signs. He said that it would require a bulk order of signs, but that the replacement of signs on a go-forward basis should be relatively inexpensive.

Team Meeting: Director Jones stated that a team meeting would occur on Wednesday, May 30, 2018 in order to prepare everyone for the runoff that is being held on July 24, 2018.

ADA Compliance: Director Jones stated that about three weeks ago he contacted the Fayette County Fire Marshal Jimmy Hall who is in charge of inspecting buildings for ADA Compliance in the county. He said he spoke to the Fire Marshal about making sure that the polling places are in ADA Compliance. Fire Marshal Hall asked for a listing of the polling places and they were provided to him. Mr. Jones stated that some places are within municipal boundaries, so Fire Marshal Hall communicated with his counterparts in the cities. The results are that all of the polling places have been found to be in compliance with ADA standards. The only questionable location was Berachah Bible Church since the sanctuary is not ADA compliant but the secondary building, where the voting is held, is compliant.

Issues on Election Day:

- a) Director Jones stated that an elderly lady, who is a former poll manager, was wearing high heels walked into a church and tripped on the church's threshold. She obtained a bloody mouth. EMT was called to check on her and she was found to be okay. The lady sat at the church for a moment before proceeding to vote and leave. There has been no other report since.
- b) Director Jones reported there was a complaint about Holy Trinity Church stating that the church does not have a big enough sign so that people drive by and do not know they are at the church. He said anyone driving by the church would be able to tell it is a church despite there being a small sign stating its name. He added that the voter went to a back door to vote since she claimed not to see appropriate signage. Mr. Jones stated that additional signage would be placed at the location in the future to avoid this confusion.
- c) Director Jones stated there was a complaint from a voter who was upset about a split precinct. She votes at Braelinn Elementary for city matters and Rising Starr for other matters. She has been a voter since 2002. She has never voted in a city election but only in county, state, and federal matters. Director Jones stated that he wrote her in reply yesterday stating that the county is aware of the split precinct issues and is working to resolve them. He offered to talk to her, and she has not yet replied.

- d) Director Jones stated that another person made a complaint about a poll worker in the Fayette County Library. She claimed that she has an eighteen year old disabled daughter and she was trying to show her daughter about the vote. She claimed a poll worker yelled at her, snatched the yellow voter card out of her hand, and shoved a sticker in her hand. Director Jones reported that he spoke to the poll manager who had a different version of what occurred and who was surprised anyone made a complaint. He stated he replied to the lady who made the complaint and has not heard back from her.

Opinions about the Department: Director Jones stated that he is hearing numerous compliments about the department. For instance, the State Liaison is saying she deals with troublesome counties but Fayette County is not one of them, Commissioner Steve Brown is making compliments, and Commissioner Rousseau has written an email providing compliments.

Comp Time Matter: Director Jones stated that County Registrar Brian Hill and Elections Supervisor April Crosby both have comp time issues from different stand points. He explained that Mrs. Crosby has an abundance of comp time that needs to be reduced and that efforts have been underway for some while to reduce her comp time. The effort includes not allowing anyone in the department to accrue comp time by actually paying overtime. This matters to Mr. Hill who is actually looking to accrue comp time in order to go to a conference in Los Angeles later this year. Mr. Jones said he reached out to Human Resources Director Lewis Patterson to determine if he could allow Mr. Hill to accrue comp time while still paying Mrs. Crosby for her overtime and not allowing her to accrue comp time. He stated that Mr. Patterson said that the department could handle the matter as suggested so long as the Board was informed. The Board agreed to the recommendation to allow Mr. Hill to accrue comp time and to continue to draw down Mrs. Crosby's comp time. Mr. Jones stated that he had already had this discussion with Mr. Hill and Mrs. Crosby and all were good with this solution.

ATTORNEY'S REPORTS:

There was no Attorney's Report.

BOARD MEMBERS REPORTS:

Chairman Lester: Chairman Lester stated that he received a complaint from a citizen to get out of the schools due to school safety and for the protection of the children. He thanked the man for his opinion and that it would be addressed through the reduction of precincts. He said the man said he could buy the logic and was glad there was a plan to address it.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

There was no Executive Session.

ADJOURNMENT:

Mr. Wright moved to adjourn the May 25, 2018 Board of Elections Meeting. Chairman Lester seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0-1 with Mr. Hicks not present for the vote.

The May 25, 2018 Board of Elections Meeting adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

Any governing authority desiring to permit and regulate Sunday sales pursuant shall so provide by proper resolution or ordinance conditioned on approval in a referendum election. Details of the referendum election proceedings are provided on lines 63-73.

RE: SENATE BILL 17 ("Brunch Bill")

On May 8, 2018, Governor Deal signed Senate Bill 17 into law. Senate Bill 17 (SB 17) provides that governing authorities of counties and municipalities may authorize sales of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises during certain times on Sunday subject to the passage of a referendum (See attachment- Senate Bill 17).

Section (j)(2) reads, in part: Any governing authority desiring to permit and regulate Sunday sales pursuant to this subsection, but only after a referendum election, shall so provide by proper resolution or ordinance conditioned on a referendum. Not less than ten nor more than 60 days after the date of approval of such resolution or ordinance, it shall be the duty of the election superintendent of the county or municipality to issue the call for an election for the purpose of submitting the question of Sunday sales to the electors of the county or municipality for approval or rejection. The superintendent shall set the date of the election for a day not less than 30 nor more than 60 days after the date of the issuance of the call. The superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to be published in the official organ of the county once a week for two weeks immediately preceding date thereof.

O.C.G.A. 21-2-540 (b) reads, in part: Special elections which are to be held in conjunction with the presidential preference primary, a state-wide general primary, or state-wide general election shall be called at least 90 days prior to the date of such presidential preference primary, state-wide general primary, or state-side general primary, or state-wide general election.

Fayette County will hold a state-wide general election on November 6.

Based on communication from the Georgia Secretary of State's Office, cities and counties are asked to adopt a proper resolution or ordinance before August 8, 2018, thus meeting the 90 day requirement in O.C.G.A. 21-2-540(b), if they desire to have this matter placed on the November 6 General Election ballot.

Cities and counties that adopt a resolution or ordinance after August 8 but who desire for an election on November 6 will create a dual-voting situation that may cost more money, may cause numbers of citizens to vote in two separate polling locations, and will enhance voter confusion.

Fayette County and its municipalities are requested to consult with their respective attorneys on this matter. The Fayette County Elections Office is available to assist as able.

Hi, Floyd – apparently the Governor signed the “Brunch Bill” (SB 17) on Tuesday, May 8, which makes it effective on that date. This is important because the legislation requires a local referendum to enact – it also stipulates the call for the referendum must be made within 10 – 60 days after the bill’s enactment, and the subsequent referendum must be held between 30-60 days after the call. So the date of signature is important because it makes it impossible to hold it with the Primary, but also impossible to hold it with the General Election. Could this be added to the July 24 Runoff?

RE: Recent Supreme Court Decision in Elections Regarding Political Clothing in Polling Places

As many of you know, the US Supreme Court issued an order on June 14, 2018, declaring unconstitutional Minnesota's law that prohibited people from wearing political badges, buttons, or other insignia inside a polling place on election day. The Court in its opinion said that states have the right to set polling places apart as areas free of partisan discord, but that a "more discernible approach than the one in Minnesota" should be taken. The court approvingly pointed to laws in California and Texas that, like here in Georgia, prohibit wearing apparel that references what is on the specific ballot in the polling place. Therefore, we do not believe this opinion has any impact on our statute in Georgia.

As a reminder, O.C.G.A. § 21-2-413(a) prohibits the distribution or display of campaign material within 150 feet of the polling place building. Campaign material is defined in O.C.G.A. § 21-2-2 as "any newspaper, booklet, pamphlet, card, sign, paraphernalia, or any other written or printed matter referring to:

- (A) A candidate whose name appears on the ballot in a primary or election;
- (B) A referendum which appears on the ballot in a primary or election; or
- (C) A political party or body which has a nominee or nominees on the ballot in a primary or election."

The statute says that written or printed matter (like a sample ballot) used exclusively by the elector to aid in voting is not considered campaign material.

First, keep in mind that the election code does *not* declare that a person wearing campaign apparel or otherwise displaying campaign material may not vote. The person in violation of this law can be asked to remove or cover the campaign material. If they refuse, his or her information should be recorded and provided to the State Election Board through the election division for civil prosecution.

Second, Georgia's definition of campaign material is narrow and only means references to candidates, questions, and political parties/bodies on the ballot in that jurisdiction. All details in any case must be considered in the totality of the circumstances at hand in any specific situation. References to political issues not on the ballot as a question/referendum are permitted. References to political parties or bodies that do not have a candidate on the ballot that day are permitted. It is important to enforce this law as written and not expand its meaning. Such an expansive interpretation is what caused Minnesota's law to be struck down.

As always, I recommend reviewing any poll worker training and policies you have with your county board and/or legal authority if you are unsure of how to direct poll workers in these circumstances. You may contact our office to get guidance as you develop these practices; however, given the many possible scenarios that your poll workers may face, you must develop sound practices and good training and communication to minimize and avoid legal danger.

RE: Update to Felon Process in GVRS

The Department of Corrections sends reports to the Secretary of State's office for people serving felony sentences in custody. As reported last year, the Department of Community Supervision now sends separate felon lists for people serving felony sentences on probation and parole. This recent change is a result of broader legislative efforts spearheaded by Governor Nathan Deal for criminal justice reform in Georgia.

With this new change in effect, the Secretary of State's office found that the Department of Community Supervision's data included individuals with special statuses of First Offender, *Nolo Contendere*, and Conditional Discharge. People with statuses for First Offender, *Nolo Contendere*, and Conditional Discharge are eligible to register to vote and cast a ballot.

We have worked diligently with the Department of Community Supervision and the Georgia Crime Information Center to refine the transmission of their data to reflect the appropriate parameters and exclude individuals under special sentencing status. Going forward, you should no longer see any person under one of these special statuses on your GVRS dashboard when our office receives the data and forwards it to you for processing.

You will see an increase in volume on your dashboards as we resume this data transmission. You should continue to process all felon notices in accordance with standard procedures.

July 24 Runoff Election- Overview

There are no federal or local offices under considering in this runoff for Fayette County's consideration (See Exhibit A- Sample Ballots).

What about the Budget?

First, the Runoff Election is budgeted in the proposed Fiscal Year 2019 budget. The budget request called for all three Absentee In-Person locations (Fayette County Public Meeting Room, Peachtree City Library, and Tyrone Town Hall) to be opened and staffed for three weeks each. Based on staff recommendation and Board approval at the May 25, 2018 Board of Elections Meeting, the Absentee In-Person sites will open in the following order:

Fayette County Public Meeting Room: Monday, July 2 through Friday, July 20; 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Peachtree City Library: Monday, July 9 through Friday, July 20; 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Tyrone Town Hall: Monday, July 16 through Friday, July 20; 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

By staggering the openings as described, staff projects Fayette County will realize approximately \$11,000 in savings for Absentee In-Person elections.

Second, the proposed Fiscal Year 2019 budget calls for three clerks for each precinct for the runoff election. Staff, in cooperation with the poll managers, have reduced the numbers of clerks for each precinct. The number of clerks per precinct are:

27 Precincts will have only one clerk each.

7 Precincts will have two clerks each.

2 Precincts will have no clerks at all- strictly managers and assistant managers

No precincts have three or more clerks.

By reducing the numbers of clerks, staff projects a savings to Fayette County of approximately \$8,700.

Third, the proposed Fiscal Year 2019 budget requested funding for two workers to help with Absentee-by Mail matters for the Runoff Election at a projected cost of \$5,684.00. However, at the Runoff Election approaches it is becoming clear this amount of help is not needed- resulting in additional cost savings.

In summary, the anticipated aggregate savings to be realized for the Runoff Election is just about \$24,384.00.

Getting the Word Out:

The one stipulation given by the Board in regard to opening Absentee In-Person sites on a staggered basis was that signage would be provided at each site notifying the electors. To that end, signage was produced by Gunnin Graphics and will be on site at all three locations on throughout Early Voting (*See Exhibit B for Signage*).

Additionally, information has been provided and updated on the County's website, referenced through the Facebook page, and provided to the media via a press release. The *Fayette News* has responded that it will run the press release in its publication in the coming days / weeks (*See Exhibit C for the Press Release*).

WAYS TO PARTICIPATE IN FAYETTE COUNTY'S RUNOFF ELECTION

Fayette County, along with all 159 counties in Georgia, will hold a General Primary Runoff Election on Tuesday, July 24, 2018. This Runoff Election will determine three Republican Candidates for the offices of Governor, Lt. Governor, and Secretary of State. It will also determine one Democratic Candidate for the office of State School Superintendent. Each of the offices are state offices. There are no federal or local offices in the Runoff Election for Fayette County.

Citizens who were eligible to vote during the May 22, 2018 Primary Election are able to vote in the Runoff Election.

There are three ways to participate in this Runoff Election:

First, registered voters may request an Absentee-by-Mail ballot by contacting the Fayette County Elections Office at (770) 305-5408. Ballots will not be mailed after 5:00 pm on Friday, July 20. All mailed ballots must be physically present in the Elections Office by 7:00 pm on Election Day, July 24, 2018 to be counted.

Second, registered voters can participate in three weeks of Early In-Person Elections, also known as Absentee In-Person Elections, beginning on Monday, July 2 and concluding on Friday, July 20, 2018. Due to an anticipated low voter turnout, the following locations will be opened on the following dates:

Fayette County Administrative Complex: July 2 – July 20, Monday through Friday, 8 am – 5 pm.

Peachtree City Library: July 9 – July 20, Monday through Friday, 8 am – 5 pm.

Tyrone Town Hall: July 16-20, Monday through Friday, 8 am – 5 pm.

There will be no Early In-Person voting on Wednesday, July 4 or on Saturdays. There will also be no voting on Monday, July 23, 2018.

Third, registered voters may cast their ballots on Election Day on Tuesday, July 24, 2018. All 36 Fayette County precincts will be opened county-wide from 7 am until 7 pm to receive voters. Citizens desiring to vote on Election Day must cast their ballots at their assigned precincts.
