5. Discussion concerning supply needs for conducting the 2020 Elections.

The Elections Director discussed the need for supplies in order to conduct the upcoming Elections and how those supplies would be additional impacts to the Fiscal Year 2020 budget. It was understood that these needs could not have been anticipated at the time when the Fiscal Year 2020 budget was prepared and ultimately approved. The Board provided direction on this matter. The Board did not vote on this matter. A copy of the request, identified as "Attachment 4," follows these minutes and is made an official part hereof.

6. Discussion concerning community outreach in preparation for the March 24, 2020 Presidential Preference Primary.

The Elections Director and the Board discussed opportunities to educate the voting public on the new elections machines. This effort would include scheduling time in the Public Meeting Room, visiting the political parties, and going to the Fayette Chamber of Commerce. The Board provided direction to staff. The Board did not vote on this matter. A copy of the request, identified as "Attachment 5," follows these minutes and is made an official part hereof.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

State Elections Board: The State Elections Board are set to vote on rules that will provide instructions on how to conduct elections. The rules include how to calculate deploying the machines to the polling locations. This discussion also addressed how municipal elections may be conducted in the future.

Dominion Equipment: Based on a phone call with Scott Tucker at Dominion Voting, Fayette is slated to have its remaining equipment within the next week or two.

Qualifying Packet: A qualifying packet and information has been drafted and is under legal review. There are some questions about some of the offices and how they qualify. Once the packet is completed, it will be placed on the website for the public.

Polling Places Reviewed: Three contractors visited every polling place and AIP voting location to inspect for electrical sufficiency and ADA compliance. A report of their findings if forthcoming.

Mandatory State Training: Key Elections staff will be in mandatory training on January 23, 2020 in North Atlanta. This training will focus on the EMS Server and Logic and Accuracy Testing of the equipment. This is an all-day training event and therefore staff will be out of office the entire day.

Regional Training: Key Elections staff will be in regional training with Elections staff from surrounding metro Atlanta counties in order to learn from each other as the Election approaches. This will mean that staff will be out of office for the majority of Friday, January 24, 2020.

Pallets versus Carts: There was discussion about whether pallets or carts should be used in transporting the equipment to the polls.

State Election Board Rules: There was discussion about when the revised State Election Board rules would be available and if there would be any legal review of the rules. The Director replied

BYLAWS

FAYETTE COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS AND VOTER REGISTRATION

ADOPTED IN SESSION JANUARY 22, 2008

AMENDED OCTOBER 24, 2017

I. NAME

The name of this Board shall be the Fayette County Board of Elections and Voter Registration, hereinafter referred to as the "Board."

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Board is:

- 1) To protect the integrity of all elections conducted by the Board.
- 2) To conduct elections in a legal, ethical, and non-partisan manner with an environment of honesty, openness, impartiality, and integrity, keeping in mind the public trust and interest of all voters in Fayette County. The Board or its members should avoid any action which might result in, or create the appearance of, affecting adversely the confidence of the public in the integrity of any election.

III. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

While conducting the duties of their office, board members should not engage in political activity such as campaigning for any candidate on a Fayette County ballot (whether as a volunteer or a paid position) or ballot question, writing letters to the editor, or participating in discussion or comments regarding candidates or candidates' activities. Board members should conduct themselves in an objective, detached and non-partisan manner while conducting the business of the Board. Board members may not speak at public meetings in support of or in opposition to an issue or candidate on a Fayette County ballot. The Code of Ethics for the Fayette County Government in effect as of the adoption and/or readoption of these Bylaws, as found in Division 3 of Article IV of Chapter 2 of the Fayette County Code of Ordinances and as attached hereto, governs the affairs and activities of the Board and is incorporated by reference into these Bylaws.

IV. ORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD

The Board is empowered to organize itself, determine its procedural rules and regulations, adopt bylaws, specify functions and duties of its employees, and otherwise take such actions as are appropriate to the management of the affairs committed to its supervision; provided, however, that no such action shall conflict with state law. The Chairman of the Board shall be the Chief Executive Officer and shall generally supervise, direct, and control the

administration of the affairs of the Board pursuant to law and duly adopted resolutions of the Board as prescribed by law. The Chairman will be elected among the Board members at the February meeting of each even numbered year to serve for a term of two years.

The Board shall enter into its minutes any directives governing the execution of matters within its jurisdiction. The Board shall hold regular monthly meetings at the Elections Office, unless cancelled for lack of business. Any special called meetings shall be held in accordance with the provisions of state law. The Board shall maintain a written record of policy decisions that shall be amended to include additions or deletions. Meetings shall be conducted, insofar as practicable, in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order and Minutes shall be kept of all meetings and shall reflect the votes of each member upon matters voted upon. The Board shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also store the Minutes of all meetings at the Elections Office. Individual Board members may not issue directives to administrative staff or poll workers. All directives to staff and poll workers must be at the behest of the Chairman of the Board and/or the entire Board, acting in its official capacity.

The Board shall be authorized to appoint an Elections Superintendent and to employ any other employees deemed appropriate to manage the matters of the elections and voter registration.

The Board shall be responsible for the selection, appointment and training of poll workers in elections.

V. INVESTIGATIONS

The Board may conduct investigations of irregularities in voting practices, voter registrations, and suspected violations of election laws. Any such investigation shall be conducted in strict compliance with Georgia law and the results shall be made available to the proper law enforcement agencies.

VI. CONFLICT WITH STATE ELECTIONS BOARD RULES

These Bylaws should not be in conflict with the rules of the State Election Board. In case of a conflict, the rules of the State Election Board shall control.

VII. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF BYLAWS

In its discretion, if the Board determines that there has been a violation of these Bylaws, it may impose penalties for said violations(s), including censure and revocation of monthly pay for the Board member. Additional penalties can be imposed by the Board at its discretion.

VIII. AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

These Bylaws may be amended by majority vote of the Board at any meeting of the Board, provided that seven (7) days' notice of the intention to amend said Bylaws has been received by Board members, said notice setting forth in detail the proposed amendment. Any

amendment to these Bylaws shall be effective upon adoption, unless otherwise provided for in the amendment.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FAYETTE COUNTY, GEORGIA; TO REWRITE THE CODE OF ETHICS FOR FAYETTE COUNTY, GEORGIA; TO PROMOTE THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FAYETTE
COUNTY, GEORGIA, AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED PURSUANT TO THE
AUTHORITY OF THE SAME THAT DIVISION 3 OF ARTICLE IV OF CHAPTER 2
OF THE CODE OF FAYETTE COUNTY GEORGIA BE DELETED IN ITS ENTIRETY
AND REPLACED WITH A NEW DIVISION 3 OF ARTICLE IV OF CHAPTER 2 OF
THE CODE OF FAYETTE COUNTY, GEORGIA TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. By deleting Sections 2-200 through 2-208 which comprise the Code of Ethics in their entirety and by enacting the following Code of Ethics to be numbered and to read as follows:

Sec. 2-200. Purpose.

The purpose of this Code of Ethics is to:

(a) Encourage high ethical standards in conduct by Fayette County officials ("County Officials");

- (b) Establish guidelines for ethical standards of conduct for all County Officials by setting forth those acts or actions that are incompatible with the best interests of Fayette County (the "County");
- (c) Maintain public trust through transparency by requiring disclosure by County

 Officials of private financial or other interests in matters affecting the County or in matters that

 affect their ability to act in the best interests of the County; and
 - (d) Serve as a basis for disciplining those who do not comply with its terms.

Sec. 2-201. Scope.

The provisions of this Code of Ethics shall be applicable to all County Officials.

Further, the County Purchasing Director shall develop procedures for individuals, corporations and other entities seeking to do business with the County to disclose financial, familial or other relationships with any person who comes within the scope of this Code of Ethics and who is also required to disclose such relationships. Such disclosures must be made prior to presenting a recommendation of award to the Fayette County Board of Commissioners (the "Board of Commissioners") or, if Board of Commissioners approval is not required, prior to execution of a contract in excess of \$10,000. The obligation for an individual, corporation or other entity seeking to do business with the County to disclose the aforementioned relationships is ongoing and shall be enforced as a prerequisite to any action by a County Official or other person covered by this Code of Ethics to renew, extend or otherwise modify a contract after award.

Sec. 2-202. Definitions.

The following words and phrases as used in this Code of Ethics shall, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, have the meanings as follows:

- (a) County means Fayette County, Georgia.
- (b) County Administrator means the individual who serves as County Administrator of Fayette County.
- (c) County Official includes County employees, members of the Board of
 Commissioners, the County Administrator, the County Clerk and the County Attorney. County
 Official also includes all individuals appointed by the County Administrator and the Board of
 Commissioners to County authorities, commissions, committees, boards, task forces, or other
 bodies.
- (d) *Gift* means the transfer of anything of economic value, regardless of form, without adequate and lawful consideration. "Gift" also means a subscription, membership, loan, forgiveness of debt, advance or deposit of money or anything of value, conveyed or transferred.
- (e) *Ethics*: the discipline dealing with what is good and bad and with moral duty and obligation Merriam Webster
- (f) *Immediate family* means the spouse, mother, father, grandparent, brother, sister, son or daughter of any County Official related by blood, adoption or marriage. The relationship by marriage shall include in-laws.
- (g) Person means an individual, a business entity, or other similar type organization.Sec. 2-203. Prohibitions.
- (a) No County Official shall use or secure confidential information for any purpose other than his/her official duties.
- (b) No County Official may participate or vote on any matter before the Board of Commissioners or other County body where such County Official has a substantial interest in the

outcome of such matter. For purposes of this Code of Ethics, a substantial interest is found where the County Official receives a pecuniary interest due to the outcome of the vote.

- (c) No County Official shall act as an agent or attorney for another in any matter before the Board of Commissioners or other County body.
- (d) No County Official shall enter into any contract with the County except as authorized by state law.
- (e) No County Official shall solicit or accept other employment to be performed, or compensation to be received, while still a County Official if the employment or compensation could reasonably be expected to impair such County Official's judgment or performance of County duties.
- (f) No County Official shall disseminate confidential information to someone other than another County Official, unless otherwise authorized by law.
- (g) No County Official shall solicit or accept gifts, loans, gratuities, discounts, favors, hospitality, or services from any person for himself/herself, or any member of his/her immediate family, under circumstances from which it could reasonably be inferred that a major purpose of the donor is to influence the performance of the County Official's duties.

Sec. 2-204. Conflict of Interest.

- (a) No County Official may participate in a vote or decision on a matter affecting an immediate family member or any person, entity, or property in which the County Official has a substantial interest.
- (b) A County Official who has a relationship with any entity which receives funding from the County shall disclose such relationship prior to participating in any action for such funding.

- (c) A County Official shall never discriminate by the dispensing of special favors or privileges to anyone, whether or not for remuneration.
- (d) No County Official shall engage in any business with the County, or allow any member of his/her immediate family to engage in any business with the County which is inconsistent with the conscientious performance of his/her governmental duties.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, a County Official shall disclose, prior to discussing or taking any action on any matter involving the donor, any gift or campaign contribution (cash or in kind) received by him/her, or any member of his/her immediate family, greater than \$100.00. Receipt of gifts and campaign contributions within the current election cycle valued at \$250.00 or more by a County Official, or member of his/her immediate family, will prohibit the County Official from participating or taking action on any matter involving the donor.

Sec. 2-205. Enforcement and administration.

- (a) All allegations of violations of the Code of Ethics must be filed with the County Clerk, in writing, signed by the complainant, no later than 45 days after the alleged act occurred unless the complainant, by exercising reasonable diligence, failed to discover the alleged violation of the Code of Ethics within such 45-day period. In such case, a complainant must file an Ethics Complaint with the County Clerk no later than 45 days after the complainant discovered the alleged violation.
- (b) In no event shall an Ethics Complaint be filed with the County Clerk more than six (6) months from the date of the alleged violation of the Code of Ethics.
 - (c) The complainant may withdraw the Ethics Complaint at any time in writing.

- (d) Within 30 days of receipt of an Ethics Complaint the Board of Commissioners will review the Ethics Complaint to determine whether same is on its face unjustified, frivolous, patently unfounded or fails to state facts sufficient to invoke disciplinary jurisdiction. A majority of the full Board of Commissioners must agree that a sufficient basis has been given to warrant a public hearing. Certain violations alleged against County Officials who are employees may be referred through the proper channels consistent with the Employee Handbook's disciplinary procedures. A majority of the full Board of Commissioners shall make the determination of whether or not a review board should be impaneled.
- (e) If a complaint is received by the Clerk which alleges a violation of the Code of Ethics by a member of the Board of Commissioners, a determination of sufficiency of the complaint will not be forwarded to the Board of Commissioners. The County Attorney of any county within the Griffin Judicial Circuit, or any circuit abutting the Griffin Judicial Circuit, other than the County Attorney for Fayette County, shall make the determination of whether or not a review board should be impaneled.
- Attorney for Fayette County, within reasonably close geographic proximity of the County will be requested to conduct a public hearing based upon the complaint. A majority vote based upon clear and convincing evidence will determine the existence of the violation or lack thereof.

 Should the review board find a violation has occurred, the review board will assess the commensurate penalty for the violation. A written decision shall be issued within 15 days of the conclusion of the public hearing. County Officials are subject to the following penalties and action for violations of the Code of Ethics:
 - (1) Written reprimand or public censure;

- (2) Recovery of value transferred from or received by the County;
- (3) Cancellation of the contract or rejection of the bid or offer;
- (4) A monetary fine not to exceed \$1,000.00; and
- (5) Demotion or termination.
- (g) Any County Official adversely affected by any final decision of the Board of Ethics may appeal as provided in this subsection.
- (h) An appeal by certiorari may be commenced in the Superior Court of FayetteCounty within 30 days after the decision becomes final.

Secs. 2-206 – 2-220. Reserved.

- SECTION 2. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the Fayette County Board of Commissioners.
- **SECTION 3.** All other ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- In the event any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall be declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall in no manner affect other sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect as if the section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not a part thereof.

 The Board of Commissioners hereby declares that it would have passed the remaining parts of this ordinance if it had known that such part or parts hereof would be declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.



Declaration of Intention to Accept Campaign Contributions:

- Must be filed <u>PRIOR</u> to accepting contributions.
- A candidate's personal funds expended for their campaign, except for payment of a qualifying fee, are considered campaign contributions.
- A new form must be filed if there is a break in office or if accepting contributions for a different office.
- County and municipal candidates file this form with their local filing officer. All other candidates file with the Georgia Government Transparency & Campaign Commission.

Registration Form for a Campaign Committee:

- This form registers a candidate's campaign committee.
- A committee is required only if a candidate designates someone to file reports, accept money, or expend money on behalf of the campaign.
- A Chairperson and Treasurer are required for a committee; however, they can be the same person and can be the candidate. If either position is vacant, the committee cannot accept contributions.
- The committee registration will remain in effect until the registration is cancelled by the committee or the candidate.
- Filed with the Georgia Government Transparency & Campaign Finance Commission.

Choosing the Option of Separate Accounting:

- Permits candidates to accept contributions for multiple elections within an election cycle. Thus, a candidate may accept contributions for the general election cycle even if the primary election has not occurred.
- A candidate must designate what election the contribution is accepted for on the applicable Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report (CCDR).
- Contributions received for a future election cannot be expended until the current election has occurred.
- If a candidate does not qualify or participate in a future election in an election cycle, the contributions received for the future election must be returned to contributors pro-rata.
- Filed with the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission.

Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report:

- A CCDR is a report filed by a candidate or campaign committee that discloses all
 contributions received and expenditures made during a reporting period.
- Six reports are due in an election year and two reports are due in a nonelection year. The filing schedule is located at O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(c).
- \$125.00 late fee is assessed when a report is filed late. However, there is a seven-day grace period.
- Local candidates may be exempt from filing CCDRs if they file an Affidavit of Exemption and meet certain criteria.
- Candidates for any state or state-wide office must file electronically with the
 Commission and candidates for county and municipal offices file with their
 local filing officer.

Final Report and Termination Statement:

- A Final Report and Termination Statement is submitted with the campaign's final Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report.
- The Statement must identify the termination date as well as the person responsible for maintaining campaign records as required by the Act.
- To qualify to file a Final Report and Termination Statement, the filer must have a zero net balance, zero debt, and not be seeking or holding the office.
- Candidates for any state or state-wide office must file electronically with the
 Commission and candidates for county and municipal offices file with their
 local filing officer.

Personal Financial Disclosure Statement:

- A Personal Financial Disclosure Statement is filed by a candidate or public official in which the filer discloses information about financial activity for the preceding calendar year.
- A statement must be filed each year, even if information does not change.
- If running for a state-wide position additional information is required to be reported.
- No grace period and a \$125.00 late fee is assessed when a statement is filed after the due date.
- Candidates for any state or state-wide office must file electronically with the
 Commission and candidates for county and municipal offices file with their
 local filing officer.
- Those holding the office of Georgia Soil and Water Conservation Commission
 District Supervisor need only file the Personal Financial Disclosure
 Statement per the filing schedule, and they file directly with the State.

Two Day Business Report:

- A Two Day Business Report is a report used to report individual contributions
 (including loans) of \$1,000.00 or more, received between the date of the
 last Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report (CCDR) due prior to the date
 the election for which the candidate has qualified and the date of such
 election.
- These contributions must be reported within two business days of receipt.
- This contribution must also be reported on the next scheduled CCDR.
- Candidates for any state or state-wide office must file electronically with the
 Commission and candidates for county and municipal offices filed with their
 local filing officer.
- No grace period and a \$125.00 late fee is assessed when a statement is filed after the due date.

Electronic Filing Access Code Application:

- Used for identification purposes for local and state candidates.
- Filed with the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission.

Good morning Scott and Leigh,

House Bill 316 requires that I provide one (1) BMD for every 250 voters or fraction thereof assigned to a precinct.

Using that calculation, I am in need of 384 BMDs and 192 UPSs. Currently, I have been provided 358 BMDs and 180 UPSs- so clearly there is a shortage.

I made a request in November 2019 for additional equipment. The last I've heard is that the request is still under evaluation.

Based on the lack of equipment, I am recalculating the number of machines that I am able to roll out to the precincts.

Even when I send out all 358 machines, I will be four (4) UPSs short to meet the need.

Is there any word on when additional BMDs and or UPSs will be sent? If so, how many of each will be sent?

Please also consider that if 384 BMDs and 192 UPSs are provided (as currently needed) that would involve all equipment going to the precincts with no room for a tablet or printer to fail. Those numbers are minimums that are needed given the current law. If more equipment can be sent, I will be glad to get them!
