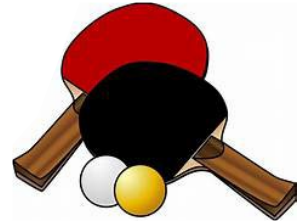


# LEISURE/LEARN PROGRAMS

## TABLE TENNIS

## AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE I – BEGINNER & BEYOND

The American Sign Language (ASL) Course provides an introduction to the language and culture of the Deaf Community. Students will learn the basics of ASL, including fingerspelling, vocabulary, and grammar. Emphasis will also be placed on developing conversational skills and understanding the cultural context in which ASL is used. This course is designed to be accessible to both beginners and those with some previous exposure to ASL.

## AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE III ADVANCED

This course sharpens skills acquired in prior courses by focusing on sentence structure and grammar, continuing to develop conceptually accurate signing, improving and using classifiers, descriptions and directions, sign vocabulary, and increasing confidence while socializing in the Deaf Community. You will continue to develop your knowledge of the Deaf Community, culture, and history. Prerequisite: Must have completed ASL III or equivalent, have a thorough knowledge of fingerspelling, and an intermediate sign vocabulary.

## TRICK OBEDIENCE

Trick Obedience is a sport in which dog and handler complete a course designed to demonstrate and reinforce obedience training. Improve communication with your dog while developing a sense of teamwork. Rally can be used as a dynamic, enjoyable way to practice obedience commands, or as a link between obedience and agility competition. Prerequisite: The dog should have successfully completed basic dog obedience and/or Canine Good Citizen (CGC) training. The class is six weeks. Please bring your dog to every class.
