FLINT RIVER REGIONAL BOARD REPORT:

February 8th is the Georgia Library Legislative Day. This is where staff, library board members, friends of library groups meets with the legislators to talk about what libraries do for the public, advocacy, support for the libraries and funding.

The governor has put in his budget one million dollars for both the general MRR grant and the technology MRR grant. The state libraries are requesting three million dollars for the general MRR and two million dollars for the technology MRR. There is nothing in the governor's budget for materials funding and the libraries are requesting 1 million dollars.

Barnesville-Lamar County Library will be breaking ground soon for revamping the interior and adding onto their library.
