INTRODUCTION

ITB #26017-B: Traffic Signal - Hwy 85 @ Hwy 85 Connector Construction

This project is for the installation of a traffic signal with pedestrian facilities, new turn lanes, and guardrail at the intersection of Hwy 85 and Hwy 85 Connector. The purpose of this project is to alleviate congestion on Hwy 85 and Hwy 85 Connector during the AM and PM peak hours and reduce crashes. Hwy 85 is owned and operated by the Georgia Department of Transportation. Hwy 85 Connector is owned and operated by Fayette County.

Fayette County has acquired all the necessary fee-simple right-of-way and easements for the construction of this project. All work is to be performed within these areas as shown in the project plans. This project is fully funded through Fayette County's 2004 Special Purpose Local Options Sales Tax (SPLOST).

This project has two important components:

Conflict with GDOT's SR 85 @ WHITEWATER CREEK Bridge Replacement Project (PI No. 0013734). Because of a current conflict with GDOT's Bridge Replacement Project, the scope for this Bid is split into two Phases. Phase 1 includes installation of the traffic signal, and all work not identified as Phase 2. Phase 1 work may be completed independent of the Bridge project.

Phase 1 will incorporate the use of GDOT's borrowed radar detection equipment for the southbound leg on Hwy 85 to be installed in conjunction with the setback loops on the remaining approaches. Once Phase 2 commences, the contractor shall remove the radar detection equipment and install the setback loop on the southbound leg, as specified on the construction plans.

Phase 2 also includes the proposed northbound right turn lane, the proposed guardrail, the west pedestrian refuge concrete median with tie bars, type 2 curb, signs and markings along the proposed northbound right turn, and all associated work required for completion of these items. These work items along with the setback detection loop conflict with the current on-site detour for GDOT's bridge replacement project and can't be started until the bridge detour is removed and/or authorization is given by GDOT and Fayette County. A second NTP for Phase 2 will be issued by Fayette County.

It is likely that the bridge detour will remain in place beyond the schedule completion requirements for Phase 1. As such, a second mobilization may be required to complete the Phase 2 work. All costs associated with a possible second mobilization should be included in the bid.

As of August 2025, the bridge replacement project (GDOT PI 0013734) is expected to have the new bridge open for traffic around Spring of 2026. This is subject to change. Bid prices for Phase 2 shall be held for a minimum of nine (9) months from the date the Notice to Proceed is issued.

The project will be awarded based on the combined fee for Phases 1 and 2.

2. **Traffic Signal Equipment**. GDOT is providing the materials listed on Exhibit 2. The Contractor shall exclude these materials from line item 647-1000 TRAFFIC SIGNAL INSTALLATION NO. 1 and coordinate with GDOT's Signal Shop Supervisor for equipment pickup in Thomaston, GA. The Contractor is responsible for transportation of the equipment.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS ITB #26017-B: Traffic Signal - Hwy 85 @ Hwy 85 Connector Construction

1. Definitions:

- a. **Bidder**: A company or individual who submits a bid in response to this Invitation to Bid.
- b. Successful Bidder: The company or individual that is awarded a contract.
- c. **Contractor**: The Successful Bidder, upon execution of the contract.
- d. County: Fayette County, Georgia.
- 2. Bid is Offer to Contract: Each bid constitutes an offer to become legally bound to a contract with the County, incorporating the Invitation to Bid and the bidder's bid. The binding offer includes compliance with all terms, conditions, special conditions, specifications, and requirements stated in the Invitation to Bid, except to the extent that a bidder takes written exception to such provisions, and the County agrees to the exception. All such terms, conditions, special conditions, specifications, and requirements will form the basis of the contract. The bidder should take care to answer all questions and provide all requested information, and to note any exceptions in the bid submission. Failure to observe any of the instructions or conditions in this Invitation to Bid may result in rejection of the bid.
- **3. Binding Offer:** To allow sufficient time for a contract to be awarded, each bid shall constitute a firm offer that is binding for sixty (60) days from the date of the bid opening to the date of award.
- **4. Bidder's Questions**: As appropriate, the County will post answers to questions and/or other information concerning the Invitation to Bid in the form of an addendum on the County's website at www.fayettecountyga.gov. It is the responsibility of the prospective bidder to check the website for any addenda issued for this Invitation to Bid.
- 5. References: Include with your bid a list of three (3) jobs that your company has done that are of the same or similar nature to the work described in this Invitation to Bid, on the form provided. Include all information as requested on the form.
- **6. Bid Submission**: Submit your bid, along with any addenda issued by the County, in a *sealed* opaque envelope. Mail or deliver one (1) original bid, signed in ink by a company official authorized to make a legal and binding offer, and one (1) copy on a flash drive, to:

Also show your company name on the envelope. You may submit sealed bids in person, by U.S. mail, or by a commercial carrier. Do not submit bids by facsimile, e-mail, or other electronic means. Once submitted, all bids become the property of Fayette County.

- 7. Bid Preparation Costs: The bidder shall bear all costs associated with preparing the bid.
- **8.** Late Bids: Bids not received in the Purchasing Department by the time and date of the scheduled bid opening will not be considered.
- **9. More than One Bid**: Do not submit alternate bids or options, unless requested or authorized by the County in the Invitation to Bid. If a responder submits more than one bid without being requested or authorized to do so, the County may disqualify the bids from that responder, at the County's option.
- **10. Bid Corrections or Withdrawals**: The bidder may correct a mistake, or withdraw a bid, before the bid opening by sending written notification to the Director of Purchasing. Bids may be withdrawn after the bid opening only with written authorization from the Director of Purchasing.
- 11. Defects or Irregularities in Bids: The County reserves the right to waive any defect or irregularity in any bid received. In case of a discrepancy between unit prices and extended prices, the unit price will govern unless the facts or other considerations indicate another basis for correction of the discrepancy.
- **12. Prices Held Firm**: Prices bid shall be firm for the period of the contract, unless otherwise specified in the contract. All prices bid for commodities, supplies, equipment, or other products shall be quoted FOB Destination, Fayette County or job site.
- **13. Method of Payment:** The county shall pay the contractor for the actual quantities of materials furnished and used in completing the work of the contract, at the unity prices set forth in the contract. Total compensation under the contract shall not exceed the not-to-exceed amount stipulated in the contract document, unless an increase is authorized in writing by an executed change order or other written contract modification.
- **14. Non-Collusion**: By responding to this Invitation to Bid, the bidder represents that the bid is not made in connection with any competing bidder, supplier, or service provider submitting a separate response to this Invitation to Bid and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud.
- 15. Bid Evaluation: Award will be made to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, taking into consideration payment terms, vendor qualifications and experience, quality, references, any exceptions listed, and/or other factors deemed relevant in making the award. The County may make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform, and the bidder shall furnish to the County all information and data for this purpose as the County may request. The County reserves the right to reject any bid item, any bid, or all bids, and to readvertise for bids.
- **16. Unbalanced bid**: If the County determines that the apparent low bid is unbalanced, the County retains the right to negotiate with the apparent low bidder for the purpose of correcting the bid imbalance without changing the overall bid amount. If the apparent low bidder and the County cannot reach agreement, the County may deem the apparent low bid non-responsive. In such case, the County reserves the right to award to the next-lowest bidder, or to reject any and all bids and re-advertise the project.

- 17. Payment Terms and Discounts: The County's standard payment terms are Net 30. Any deviation from standard payment terms must be specified in the resulting contract, and both parties must agree on such deviation. Cash discounts offered will be a consideration in awarding the bid, but only if they give the County at least 15 days from receipt of invoice to pay. For taking discounts, time will be computed from the date of invoice acceptance by the County, or the date a correct invoice is received, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed made, for the purpose of earning the discount, on the date of the check.
- 18. Trade Secrets Confidentiality: If any person or entity submits a bid or proposal that contains trade secrets, an affidavit shall be included with the bid or proposal. The affidavit shall declare the specific included information which constitutes trade secrets. Any trade secrets must be either (1) placed in a separate envelope, clearly identified and marked as such, or (2) at a minimum, marked in the affidavit or an attached document explaining exactly where such information is, and otherwise marked, highlighted, or made plainly visible. See O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72 (A)(34).
- 19. Trade Secrets Internal Use: In submitting a bid, the bidder agrees that the County may reveal any trade secret materials contained in the bid to all County staff and officials involved in the selection process, and to any outside consultant or other third parties who may assist in the selection process. The bidder agrees to hold harmless the County and each of its officers, employees, and agents from all costs, damages, and expenses incurred in connection with refusing to disclose any material which the bidder has designated as a trade secret.
- 20. Ethics Disclosure of Relationships: Before a proposed contract in excess of \$10,000.00 is recommended for award to the Board of Commissioners or the County Administrator, or before the County renews, extends, or otherwise modifies a contract after it has been awarded, the Contractor must disclose certain relationships with any County Commissioner or County Official, or their spouse, mother, father, grandparent, brother, sister, son or daughter related by blood, adoption, or marriage (including in-laws). A relationship that must be reported exists if any of these individuals is a director, officer, partner, or employee, or has a substantial financial interest the business, as described in Fayette County Ordinance Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 3 (Code of Ethics).

If such relationship exists between your company and any individual mentioned above, relevant information must be presented in the form of a written letter to the Director of Purchasing. You must include the letter with any bid, proposal, or price quote you submit to the Purchasing Department.

In the event that a Contractor fails to comply with this requirement, the County will take action as appropriate to the situation, which may include actions up to and including rejection of the bid or offer, cancellation of the contract in question, or debarment or suspension from award of a County contract for a period of up to three years.

21. Contract Execution & Notice to Proceed: After the Board of Commissioners makes an award, all required documents are received by the County, and the contract is fully executed with signature of both parties, the County will issue a written Notice to Proceed. The County shall not be liable for payment of any work done or any costs incurred by any bidder prior to the County issuing the Notice to Proceed.

As explained in the Introduction, two NTPs will be issued for this project. One for Phase 1 and a

second for Phase 2. The NTP for Phase 2 shall be dependent upon completion of the GDOT Bridge Replacement Project on SR 85 over Whitewater Creek.

- **22. Unavailability of Funds**: This contract will terminate immediately and absolutely at such time as appropriated and otherwise unobligated funds are no longer available to satisfy the obligations of the County under the contract.
- **23. Insurance**: The Successful Bidder shall procure and maintain the following insurance, to be in effect throughout the term of the contract, in at least the amounts and limits as follows:
 - General Liability Insurance: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence, including bodily and personal injury, destruction of property, and contractual liability.
 - b. **Automobile Liability Insurance**: \$1,000,000 combined single limit each occurrence, including bodily injury and property damage liability.
 - c. **Worker's Compensation & Employer's Liability Insurance**: Workers Compensation as required by Georgia statute.

Before a contract with the Successful Bidder is executed, the Successful Bidder shall provide Certificates of Insurance for all required coverage. The Successful Bidder can provide the Certificate of Insurance after award of the contract but must be provided prior to execution of the contract document by both parties. The certificate shall list an additional insured as follows:

- **24. Bid Bond**: Bidder shall include a bid bond with your bid, equal to five percent (5%) of the total amount bid. Bid bonds shall be provided by a surety which appears on the U.S. Treasury's list of approved bond sureties (Circular 570).
- **25. Performance and Payment Bonds**: Prior to execution of a contract, the Successful Bidder shall submit performance, and payment bonds each equal to 100 percent of the contract value, provided by a surety which appears or the U.S. Treasury's list of approved bond sureties (Circular 570).
- **26. Building Permits**: Work performed for the County requiring building permits by licensed Contractors will not have permit fees assessed, although any re-inspection fees for disapproved inspections will be the responsibility of the Contractor prior to final inspections and the Certificate of Occupancy or Certificate of Completion being issued.
- **27. Unauthorized Performance**: The County will not compensate the Contractor for work performed unless the work is authorized under the contract, as initially executed, or as amended.
- **28. Assignment of Contract**: Assignment of any contract resulting from this Invitation to Bid will not be authorized, except with express written authorization from the County.

- **29. Indemnification**: The Contractor shall indemnify and save the County and all its officers, agents and employees harmless from all suits, actions, or other claims of any character, name and description brought for or on account of any damages, losses, or expenses to the extent caused by or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, or intentionally wrongful conduct of the Contractor or other persons employed or utilized by the Contractor in the performance of the contract. The Contractor shall pay any judgment with cost which may be obtained against the County growing out of such damages, losses, or expenses.
- 30. Severability: The invalidity of one or more of the phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in the contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the contract. If any provision of the contract is held to be unenforceable, then both parties shall be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision to the extent that the provision is unenforceable. In such case, the contract shall be deemed amended to the extent necessary to make it enforceable while preserving its intent.
- **31. Delivery Failures**: If the Contractor fails to deliver contracted goods or services within the time specified in the contract or fails to replace rejected items in a timely manner, the County shall have authority to make open-market purchases of comparable goods or services. The County shall have the right to invoice the Contractor for any excess expenses incurred or deduct such amount from monies owed the Contractor. Such purchases shall be deducted from contracted quantities.
- **32. Substitution of Contracted Items**: The Contractor shall be obligated to deliver products awarded in this contract in accordance with terms and conditions specified herein. If-the Contractor is unable to deliver the products under the contract, it shall be the Contractor's responsibility to obtain prior approval of the ordering agency to deliver an acceptable substitute at the same price quoted in the Contractor's original bid. In the event the Contractor consistently needs to substitute or refuses to substitute products, the County reserves the right to terminate the contract or invoke the "Delivery Failures" clause stated herein.
- **33. Inspection and Acceptance of Deliveries**: The County reserves the right to inspect all goods and products delivered. The County will decide whether to accept or reject items delivered. The inspection shall be conclusive except with respect to latent defects, fraud, or such gross mistakes as shall amount to fraud. Final inspection resulting in acceptance or rejection of the products will be made as soon as practicable, but failure to inspect shall not be construed as a waiver by the County to claim reimbursement or damages for such products which are later found to be in nonconformance with specifications. Should public necessity demand it, the County reserves the right to use or consume articles delivered which are substandard in quality, subject to an adjustment in price to be determined by the Purchasing Director.
- **34. Termination for Cause**: The County may terminate the contract for cause by sending written notice to the Contractor of the Contractor's default in the performance of any term of this agreement. As appropriate, the County will compensate the Contractor for completed performance, and for any partially completed performance as determined by the County to be adequately performed. Termination shall be without prejudice to any of the County's rights or remedies by law.
- **35. Termination for Convenience**: The County may terminate the contract for its convenience at any time with 10 days' written notice to the Contractor. In the event of termination for convenience, the County will pay the Contractor for services performed. The County will compensate partially

- completed performance based upon a signed statement of completion submitted by the Contractor, which shall itemize each element of performance completed.
- **36. Force Majeure**: Neither party shall be deemed to be in breach of the contract to the extent that performance of its obligations is delayed, restricted, or prevented by reason of any act of God, natural disaster, act of government, or any other act or condition beyond the reasonable control of the party in question.
- **37. Governing Law**: This agreement shall be governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia. The parties agree to submit to the jurisdiction in Georgia, and further agree that any cause of action arising under this agreement shall be required to be brought in the appropriate venue in Fayette County, Georgia.

PROJECT SPECIFIC TERMS AND CONDITIONS ITB #26017-B: TRAFFIC SIGNAL - HWY 85 @ HWY 85 CONNECTOR

A. Reference and Incorporation of GDOT Specifications - Unless noted otherwise in this Invitation to Bid (ITB), the Georgia Department of Transportation's Standard Specifications Construction of Transportation Systems, most recent edition, are incorporated by reference into the Project Manual and contract documents. All work shall be performed in accordance with the GDOT specifications, and all pay items shall be measured and evaluated in accordance with the specifications. They shall supersede all other specifications unless more stringent requirements are listed.

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to be familiar with these specifications before bidding and to adhere to them during construction. Fayette County is the owner of the project and shall serve as the administrator of the contract in lieu of "The County". Copies of the documents can be obtained from the GDOT website.

B. Contract Time – All work associated with Phase 1 shall be substantially complete within one hundred and twenty (120) calendar days of the NTP. Substantially complete means the signal is operational and all new lane work (excluding Phase 2) is open for traffic.

Phase 2 shall be substantially complete within **sixty (60)** calendar days of the Phase 2 NTP. Substantially complete means the northbound right turn lane is open for use, all concrete work is complete, and the pedestrian crosswalks are operational.

Examples of items not associated with substantial completion include thermoplastic striping.

Examples of items not associated with substantial completion include thermoplastic striping, removal of ESCP BMPs, final stabilization, etc.

All project work shall be complete within **ninety (90)** calendar days of the Phase 2 NTP. Contract time is measured on a Calendar Day basis and includes County Holidays and weekends.

If the bidder feels this schedule is not achievable due to material lead times or other reasons, they should state so, in writing, during the Bidder's Question period. Fayette County will evaluate any information provided and adjust the schedule as appropriate.

- C. County Holidays The Contractor shall not work on a County Holiday unless written approval is provided by Fayette County at least three days prior to the Holiday. The County Holiday Schedule is available on the County's website: https://fayettecountyga.gov/information/county holidays.htm
- **D.** Work Hours Unless pre-approved otherwise by Fayette County, all work shall be performed Monday thru Friday and between the hours of 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM.
- **E.** Prequalification of Bidders The Prime Contractor and/or subcontractor(s) shall be GDOT prequalified in Work Class 150, 310, 400, and 647 and provide at least two (2) successfully completed projects of similar scope and size within the past five (5) years. Fayette County reserves the right to consider a contractor's GDOT prequalification's and past performance

when determining if a bid is responsive and responsible.

The bid package shall include the required documentation demonstrating the above items are satisfied. Failure to provide the documentation may result in the bid being disqualified.

- **F. OSHA** Adhere to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) excavation standards, 29 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 1926, Subpart P for excavation and trenching operations.
- **G. Contractor Staging** No staging area is provided by Fayette County for the project beyond the acquired right-of-way and easements for the project. Contractor staging shall not interfere with traffic on County or State roads.
- H. Contractor Supervision and Work Coordination The Contractor shall supervise and direct the work. He/she shall be solely responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction, including traffic control. The Contractor shall employ and maintain onsite a qualified supervisor or superintendent who will be designated in writing by the Contractor as the Contractor's site representative. The supervisor shall have full authority to act on behalf of the Contractor and all communications given to the supervisor shall be as binding as if given to the Contractor. The supervisor shall always be present on the site as required to perform adequate supervision and coordination of the work.
- I. Workmanship Guarantee The Contractor shall warranty and guarantee all materials supplied, equipment furnished, and work performed to be free from defects (resulting from faulty materials supplied or workmanship) for a period of twelve (12) months from the date of Substantial Completion.

The Owner shall give notice of observed defects with reasonable promptness and the Contractor shall have 45 calendar days to address the issue(s). If the Contractor fails to make such repairs, adjustments, or other work that may be made necessary by such defects, the Owner may do so and charge the Contractor the cost thereby incurred. If different guarantees or warranties are required in the technical specifications for specific items, then the more stringent (i.e., longer) apply.

- J. Special Allowance Due to the nature of the project and the potential for unforeseen conditions, it is possible that some additional work or modification to the scope may be required. A \$25,000 Allowance is to be included in the Base Bid, to be used to cover Claims (Section 105.13) or Extra Work (Section 109.05) with prior written approval from Fayette County. The procedures for submitting such requests are documented in the referenced Sections. If approved, the amount of the Claim or Extra Work will be deducted from the Allowance. Requests greater than the amount available in the Allowance category may require approval from the Fayette County Board of Commissioners.
- **K. Section 102 Bidding Requirements and Conditions** This section of the GDOT Specifications is removed in its entirety from this ITB.

- **L. Section 103 Award and Execution of Contract** This section of the GDOT Specifications is removed in its entirety from this ITB.
- M. Section 105.06 Cooperation with Utilities The County will notify all utility companies or other parties affected of Award of the Contract and will assist the Contractor in arranging for all necessary adjustment or relocation within or adjacent to the limits of construction. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to plan with each utility owner a schedule of operations which will clearly set forth at which stage of the Contractor's operations the utility owner will be required to perform adjustment and relocation work.

Before beginning any mechanized boring, trenching, or digging the contractor shall call Georgia 811 at least 72-hours in advance excluding weekends and holidays. Calls made after 4:30pm count as the next day.

- N. Section 105.09 Authority and Duties of the Resident Engineer The Resident Engineer shall be designated by Fayette County.
- **O. Section 105.10 Duties of the Inspector** Inspectors may be employed by Fayette County or Fayette County's designated Engineer.
- P. Section 106 Control of Materials The materials used in the work shall meet all quality requirements of the contract. All materials shall be inspected, sampled, and tested by the Contractor's third-party Quality Control Technician before incorporation into the Work. Sampling and testing shall be performed in accordance with GDOT's Sampling, Testing and Inspection Manual. Quality control tests shall be furnished to the County and may be used as acceptance tests at the discretion of the County or Engineer. Testing will be paid for from the Testing line item; the Contractor shall furnish formal written invoices showing the date shipped, the quantities, and the unit prices.
- **Q.** Section 106.11 Field Laboratory A field laboratory is not required.

SPECIAL PROVISION

SECTION 150 – TRAFFIC CONTROL

150.1 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This section, as supplemented by the Plans, Specifications, and Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) shall be considered the Temporary Traffic Control (TTC) Plan. Activities shall consist of furnishing, installing, maintaining, and removing necessary traffic signs, pedestrian signs, barricades, lights, signals, cones, pavement markings and other traffic control devices and shall include flagging and other means for guidance and protection of vehicular and pedestrian traffic through the Work Zone. This Work shall include both maintaining existing devices and installing additional devices as necessary in construction work zones.

All traffic control devices used during the construction of the project shall meet the standards utilized in the MUTCD, and shall comply with the requirements of these Specifications, Georgia Construction Standards and Details, Project Plans, Design Manuals, and Special Provisions. When any provisions of this Specification or the Plans do not meet the minimum requirements of the MUTCD, the MUTCD shall control. The current edition of the MUTCD shall be in effect for the duration of the project.

No work shall be started on any project phase until the appropriate traffic control devices have been placed in accordance with the Project requirements. Changes to traffic flow shall not commence unless all labor, materials, and equipment necessary to make the changes are available on the Project.

When any shift or change is made to the location of traffic or to the flow patterns of traffic, the permanent safety features shall be installed and fully operational before making the change. The cost of performing this work shall be included in Traffic Control-Lump Sum.

The Contractor shall prepare and submit a Temporary Traffic Control Plan for review and approval by Fayette County at least seven (7) calendar days prior to mobilization. The Plan shall include information on lane closures, traffic phasing, access to private property, etc. At least one 12-foot travel lane shall always remain open for traffic and access to properties. All signs, pavement markings, flagging operations, etc. shall be in accordance with the MUTCD.

150.2 WORK ZONE RESTRICTIONS

There shall be no off-site detour for the work and no full road closures.

The Engineer may restrict construction operations if the Work would seriously disrupt traffic flow when unusual traffic conditions exist, such as during holidays or bad weather.

Intermittent and/or daily single-lane closures shall be subject to the approval of the Engineer. Each lane closure request shall be made at least 48 hours in advance of the time the lane closure is to be implemented. Lane closures will not be allowed to remain unless being utilized continuously for the purpose for which they were set up. No lane closures shall be permitted on school days between the hours of 7:00 am to 8:30 am and 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm without prior approval by the Engineer.

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to verify that these minimum requirements have been met before proceeding with any phase of the Work. The Worksite Traffic Control Supervisor (WTCS) shall monitor the work to ensure that all the rocks, boulders, construction debris, stockpiled materials, equipment, tools and other potential hazards are kept clear of the travel lane.

150.3 SUBMITTALS / PRECONSTRUCTION

A. Contractor Responsibilities

The Contractor will select the appropriate traffic control means and methods for the work in accordance with Part 6 of the current edition of the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and the Georgia Department of Transportation Standards, Specifications, and

Special Provisions (Section 150). Variation(s) from these documents or special conditions or operations will require approval of the Engineer.

The contractor shall coordinate with GDOT's SR 85 @ WHITEWATER CREEK Bridge Project (P.I. No. 0013734) to ensure traffic control will not be affected for either project.

The Contractor shall develop detailed staging and temporary traffic control plans for performing specific areas of the Work including but not limited to all traffic shifts, detours, paces, or other activities that disrupt traffic flow. The Engineer may require detailed staging and TTC plans for lane closures. These plans shall be submitted for approval at least two (2) weeks prior to the scheduled date of the activity. Activities that have not been approved at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled date shall be rescheduled.

B. Sequence of Operations

Any Sequence of Operations provided in this Contract in conjunction with any staging details which may be shown in the plans, is a suggested sequence for performing the Work. It is intended as a general staging plan for the orderly execution of the work while minimizing the impact on mainline, cross-streets, and side streets. The Contractor shall develop detailed staging and temporary traffic control plans for performing specific areas of the Work including but not limited to all traffic shifts, detours, paces, or other activities that disrupt traffic flow. These plans shall be submitted for approval at least two (2) weeks prior to the scheduled date

of the activity. Activities that have not been approved at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled date shall be rescheduled.

Where traffic is permitted through the work area under stage construction, the Contractor may choose to construct, at no additional expense to the County, temporary on-site bypasses or detours in order to expedite the work. Plans for such temporary bypasses or detours shall be submitted to the Engineer for review and approval thirty at least (30) calendar days prior to the proposed construction. Such bypasses or detours shall be removed promptly when in the opinion of the Engineer, they are no longer necessary for the satisfactory progress of the Work.

The County will not pay, or in any way, reimburse the Contractor for claims arising from the Contractor's inability to perform the Work in accordance with the Sequence of Operations provided in the Contract or from an approved Contractor alternate.

The Contractor shall secure the Engineer's approval of the Contractor's proposed plan of operation, sequence of work and methods of providing for the safe passage of vehicular traffic before it is placed in operation. The proposed plan of operation shall supplement the approved traffic control plan. Any major changes to the approved TTC plan, proposed by the Contractor, shall be submitted to the Engineer for approval.

The above details shall be submitted to the Engineer for approval at least fourteen (14) days prior to the anticipated traffic shift. The Contractor shall have traffic control details for a traffic shift which has been approved by the Engineer prior to commencement of the physical shift. All preparatory work relative to the traffic shift, which does not interfere with traffic, shall be accomplished prior to the designated starting time. The Engineer and the Contractor's representative will verify that all conditions have been met prior to the Contractor obtaining materials for the actual traffic shift.

150.4 ENFORCEMENT AND ADJUSTMENTS

The safe passage of traffic through and around the temporary traffic control zone, while minimizing confusion and disruption to traffic flow, shall have priority over all other Contractor activities. Continued failure of the Contractor to comply with the requirements of Section 150 - Traffic Control will result in non-refundable deductions of monies from the Contract as shown in this Subsection for non-performance of Work.

Failure of the Contractor to comply with this Specification shall be reason for the Engineer suspending all other work on the Project, except erosion control and traffic control, taking corrective action as specified in Section 105, and/or withholding payment of monies due to the Contractor for any work on the Project until traffic control deficiencies are corrected. These other actions shall be in addition to the deductions for non-performance of traffic control.

150.5 MEASURMENT AND PAYMENT

Payments will be made as a percent complete (as measured by schedule unless approved otherwise by Fayette County) of the lump sum price bid, which shall include all traffic control not paid for separately.

All of the requirements of Section 150 shall be in full force and effect. The cost of complying with these requirements will not be paid for separately but shall be included in the overall lump sum price.
