# **MEETING MINUTES**

August 7, 2018 2:00 P.M.

#### 1. Call to Order by Chair Randy Ognio

Chairman Ognio called the August 7, 2018 Transportation Committee meeting to order at 2:01pm.

#### 2. Ascertainment of Quorum

Chairman Ognio acknowledged that a Quorum of the Transportation Committee was present.

#### 3. Acceptance of Meeting Agenda

Mrs. Robinson moved to accept the updated agenda. Mr. Christian second the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 4. Review and Approval of the July 10, 2018 Transportation Committee Meeting Minutes.

The motion to approve the July 10, 2018 meeting minutes with updates was made by Mrs. Robinson. Mr. Hindman second the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 5. Report of Committee Members

Mr. Hindman presented a request from Georgia Military College (GMC) concerning a new driveway cut on Veteran's Parkway. The high school students are being dropped off at the GMC Fayetteville location and causing an overflow onto Veteran's Parkway. Chairman Ognio motioned to deny the request for a second curb cut. Vice-Chair Robinson second the motion. The motion passed 10:0:1 with Mr. Hindman sustaining from the vote.

Mr. Christian shared with the Committee that since the West Fayette Bypass last intersection has been completed he is receiving requests for installation of a traffic light and a right turn lane. He stated from a safety standpoint the right turn lane was omitted in the construction of SR 92 and Westbridge Parkway intersection. Also, the intersection did not qualify for a traffic light in the past but is currently being reconsidered.

Mr. Mallon informed the Committee that the Environmental Assessment for the SR 74 & I85 Interchange project has been approved.

#### 6. Public Comment

A local citizen stopped by to inquire on the status of the Brogdon Road and New Hope Road intersection. He was content with the update Mr. Mallon provided before the meeting. He then excused himself from the meeting.

#### 7. Unfinished Business

#### a. Transportation Committee Priority Projects – continued discussion

Mr. Mallon shared with the Committee is a rough draft from July's meeting of priority projects throughout the County. He suggested that the Committee streamline the list into one that consist of projects that the County is seeking Federal assistance. Attached is the original list with revisions. *Page 5-6* 

#### 8. New Business

#### a. The ATL – staff report from July 25 information session

Chairman Ognio shared information regarding the ATL Transit District Board Member election process (see handout) *Page 7-8* 

#### b. Sandy Creek and SR 74 - Request to signalize the RCUT intersection

Mr. Mallon shared information from GDOT stating traffic at Sandy Creek and SR 74 has grown and District 3 is recommending signalization of the RCUT intersection. The Committee expressed a concern if the signalized intersection would result in more back up on Sandy Creek Rd. Mrs. Tapp motioned to approve GDOT request to signalize Sandy Creek and SR 74. Mrs. Robinson second the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### c. Transportation Plan

i. Public Meeting

The second round of public meetings has been completed. Meetings were held at: Peachtree City, the Fayette County Library, and the City of Fairburn.

#### ii. Survey #2

The results from Survey #2 were shared with the Committee. The survey gathered input from the County residents concerning their opinions of traffic growth and how the County should respond to the growth.

#### iii. Schedule and Milestones for Completion

The Transportation Plan Public Meetings have concluded. Plan recommendations are expected in October 2018. Mr. Mallon will like to schedule a review meeting with the elected officials in the County and the surrounding cities.

#### d. 2017 SPLOST Update

Mr. Mallon gave a status update on the following SPLOST projects:

#### i. Kenwood Road School Zone

There has not been a meeting with the BOE to date. A meeting will be scheduled.

#### ii. Planning Studies (Sandy Creek, Tyrone, Banks & SR 279)

The three studies are on hold pending approval of a contract between GDOT and the ARC.

#### iii. Redwine, Bernhard & Peachtree Parkway Intersection

The design recommendation for the roundabout will be presented to the County's BOC for permission to proceed. The Committee asked the consultant to consider Federal funds for this project. With the consideration of the Federal funding the project will increase from 8 months to 2.5 - 3 years and the fee for design increases from \$90,000 to over \$200,000. Mr. Mallon will share this information with the BOC but will suggest the Commissioners to proceed with SPLOST funds. (I.e. not Federal Aid)

#### iv. Brogdon & New Hope Intersection

The design recommendation for the roundabout will be presented to the County's BOC for permission to proceed. The contractor revised the cost estimates.

#### v. Ebenezer Church Road / Spear Road

The consultant is in the process of identifying the cemeteries and the results will be brought back to the Transportation Committee for review.

#### vi. Redwine Road Multi-Use Path Project

The project has officially been moved to the Office of Program Delivery. It will be locally let as a design-bid-build.

#### vii. Starrs Mill Path Project

The BOC asked staff to reconsider if a bridge or tunnel can be located north or Panther Path.

#### viii. Paving Project

The County Road Department is asking for an approval of 2017 SPLOST funds for the following four projects; a full depth restoration of the roads in the Dix-Lee-On Subdivision, resurfacing of Antioch Road in conjunction with the round-a-bout, gravel road maintenance on Buckeye Road, and bridge maintenance. Mrs. Robinson motioned to approve the Road Department's request to spend \$1.3M on the projects mentioned. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 9. Adjournment

Chairman Ognio asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mrs. Robinson motioned to adjourn the meeting, Mrs. Wall seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 4:01pm.

# Transit District Board Member Election Process District 10

Clayton, Coweta, Fayette, Fulton and Henry Counties

### HB 930 SNAPSHOT

HB 930 creates a process for electing 10 Board Members for the new ATL (Atlanta-region Transit Link Authority), which involves multiple elected officials throughout 10 different "Transit Districts" that intentionally cross county boundaries. ATL Board members, according to HB 930, must be elected no later than December 1, 2018. District 10 includes parts of Clayton, Fulton and Henry and all of Coweta and Fayette Counties.

## Step 1: Mayoral Representation in District Election

HB 930 states that "one mayor from the municipalities located within" each authority district will be chosen from "a caucus of all mayors from the municipalities located within" each authority district, for the purpose of participating in the election of that district's ATL board member. For District 10, the following mayors must convene to select one mayor from among this list of 27 mayors, who will serve as the mayors' representative in the election for the Transit District 10 board member election, which occurs in step 2.

# Step 2: Election of Board Member Involving Legislators and Local Elected Officials

HB 930 provides that for each District, "a resident" of that district who "possesses significant experience or expertise in a field that would be beneficial to the accomplishment of the function and purpose of" the ATL is to be elected by a caucus of elected officials. The chair of the board of commissioners from the county with the largest population represented in the Transit District ("Chair") shall call a meeting of the caucus.

# For Transit District 10, Chair Al Smith of Coweta County would call for the meeting. This caucus includes:

- a) All state Senate and House members whose legislative districts are included in whole or in part within ATL Transit District 10;
- b) All county commission chairs whose counties are included in whole or in part within ATL Transit District 10; and
- c) A mayor who has been selected from a caucus of mayors outlined above in Step 1.

For District 10, the slate of participants in the Transit District election is composed of the following 31 elected officials:

**Certification:** The Chair must provide notice to the ATL, certifying the attendance of those who participated in the Step 2 vote, the person who was elected by the caucus, and the tally of votes.

Once the caucus in Step 2 elects an ATL Board Member for District 10, this member will join 9 other similarly-elected Board members from the other 9 ATL Transit Districts, as well as 2 appointees from the Lt. Governor, 2 appointees from the Speaker of the House, one appointee by the Governor (who will serve as the Chair of the Board), and the non-voting Commissioner of Transportation, to comprise the entire 16-member ATL Board of Directors.
