1. Call to Order by Chair Randy Ognio

Chairman Ognio called the May 5, 2020 Transportation Committee Meeting to order at 2:00 pm.

2. Ascertainment of Quorum

Chairman Ognio acknowledged that a Quorum of the Transportation Committee was present.

3. Acceptance of Meeting Agenda

Mrs. Robinson moved to accept the meeting agenda. Mayor Laggis seconded the motion. The motioned passed unanimously.

4. Review and Approval of the March Transportation Committee Meeting Minutes

Mrs. Robinson moved to accept the March meeting minutes. Mayor Laggis seconded the motion. The motioned passed unanimously. There was no April meeting due to the coronavirus pandemic.

5. Report of Committee Members

a. 2017 County SPLOST update

Mr. Mallon provided a three-page status table (see attached) of transportation SPLOST projects. The projects are grouped by the following types: bridge, intersection, new

capacity, maintenance, operations / safety, path and study. The table also shows the status of each phase of the project (concept, design, right-of-way, procurement, and construction) using a simple graphic. A filled-in circle indicates complete, a half circle indicates underway, and a circle outline indicates a phase about to begin. No symbol indicates no activity.

Mrs. Robinson said the Peachtree parkway at Crosstown Drive intersection in Peachtree City is on hold, but the City anticipates making some improvement at this location.

The Committee agreed that Fayette County should proceed with ICE analysis at SR 85 and Hwy 85C to determine if a signal is warranted (Project SR 85 south of Bernhard).

The Committee requested this report be updated quarterly. Mrs. Robinson asked that the table include completed projects.

- 8. New Business

a. Hampton Road and SR 92 Intersection Project - Concept

Mr. Mallon provided a project update to the Committee. Croy Engineering prepared an Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) analysis from GDOT review and comment. The analysis recommends a RCUT control at the north Hampton Road intersection and a roundabout at the southern Hampton Road intersection. The concept is shown in the attached meeting notes (Alternate 4B). The latest and most substantial comment from GDOT (the District 3 office) was to remove the signal at the RCUT. The traffic volumes do not meet warrants.

The Committee noted that is appears to be the only viable improvement for these intersections. Mayor Laggis said the Town of Woolsey has several concerns about the roundabout (downstream drainage, noise, impacts to adjacent properties, etc.) but supports the project because of the anticipated safety and operational improvements, as well as being a physical means to reduce speed.

The Committee expressed concerns about the closing of the side frontage road, near the Antique Store. A suggestion was to make it one-way with a right-turn only onto Hampton Road. Phil will relay these concerns to the Engineer. The Committee also supported inclusion of a crosswalk across Hampton Road and inclusion of sidewalks between Town Hall and the Antique Store. Phil noted that details on grading, elevations and drainage are not available at the concept stage.

Action items for the project are for Fayette County and Croy to get ICE approval from GDOT. County staff will then present the approved concept to the Transportation Committee along with a draft community information package. The intent of the community engagement is to inform citizens on the project (who, what, where, when, why, etc.). The concept will require BOC approval prior to starting full design.

b. Redwine Road, Bernhard Road and Peachtree Parkway Roundabout - Layout

Mr. Mallon used the draft Signing and Marking Plans (see attachment) to give an update on the project's footprint and proposed path infrastructure. Mr. Robinson will provide a copy to Peachtree City. The project's right-of-way plans and construction plans are being finalized in May and June.

c. ARC TIP 2nd Quarter Update

Mr. Mallon reminded the Committee that federally funded projects in the planning, design or ROW phase are listed in the Atlanta Regional Commission's (ARC's) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and updated quarterly. A copy of the most recent TIP update (Fayette projects only) was provided (see attachment).

d. COVID-19 and Transportation

Mr. Mallon presented information from ARC's April 17, 2020 Transportation Coordinating Committee Meeting. He noted there is uncertainty on the short and long-term impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on state and federal funding for transportation projects. ARC has not provided award recommendations for the TIP solicitation last fall (Fayette County submitted applications for: 1) SR 279 and Corinth Road alignment; 2) Resurfacing; and 3) Banks Road widening). The group discussed possible need to reprioritize County/City projects and possible new projects that could be submitted for consideration under a federal transportation stimulus package, if one were developed.

9. Adjournment – The meeting adjourned at approximately 3:15 PM with a motion by Chairman Ognio and second by Shayne Robinson.


RE: SR 92 and Hampton Road, Woolsey, Fayette County, Georgia Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) Analysis and Concept Design

For the Town of Woolsey, one of their top tier transportation projects identified is the offset Hampton Road intersection at State Route 92 (SR 92), Fayette County SPLOST Project #R-21. There are complaints of excessive queues on both SR 92 and Hampton Road N and Hampton Road S during the morning and afternoon peak hours due to vehicles having to traverse SR 92 for a short section before continuing on Hampton Road. Currently, the intersection geometry of Hampton Road at SR 92 is not designed to accommodate increasing traffic volumes safely; moreover, surrounding properties (potentially historic) impact improvements at the existing intersection location.





Figure 1: SR 92 and Hampton Road Intersection

The Georgia Department of Transportation's (GDOT) Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) Tool was used to identify the most effective intersection control for the two offset intersections. A review of the existing conditions was conducted to quantify existing parameters at the location including traffic operations, crash records, and a high-level environmental screening. Figure 1 shows the respective intersections and their existing traffic control.





Redwine Road, Bernhard Road and Peachtree Parkway Roundabout (2017 SPLOST 17TAL)








Key Points from Early Travel Data Analysis

- Declines in travel associated with certain trip types (retail, workplace) indicate that major economic disruptions have occurred.
- Economic disruptions historically have a major impact on VMT, with reductions in VMT lowering revenues to both state motor fuel excise tax receipts and the national Highway Trust Fund.
- The national Highway Trust Fund is the primary source of federal funding for all transportation project types — including transit.
- ARC will monitor both motor fuel and sales tax receipts and provide updates as data is released over the next month.
