1. Call to Order by Committee Chair Ognio

Committee Chair Ognio called the May 4, 2021 meeting to order at 2:03 PM.

2. Ascertainment of Quorum

Committee Chair Ognio acknowledged that a quorum of the Transportation Committee was present.

3. Acceptance of Meeting Agenda

Mayor Johnson made a motion to accept the meeting agenda. Mr. Ungaro seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

6. New Business

a. GDOT District 3 Preconstruction Engineer, Adam Smith

- i. Project Updates (See attachments for more information)
 Program Projects
 - West Fayetteville Bypass (SR 54 to Lester Road) On schedule for letting in April
 - Ebenezer Church Road Bridge Replacement at Whitewater Creek Holding their FY21 construction date
 - SR 85 at Whitewater Creek Behind schedule for construction; Construction proposed for FY24 (subject to change due to funding)
 - Coastline Road at CSX Railroad slightly behind schedule; if GDOT can recover ROW, they will be back on their FY21 schedule
 - SR 85 (from Bernhard Rd to Old Hwy 92) Let date set for April 24th but is subject to change due to funding; Construction date is still undetermined
 - SR 85 & SR 279, Roberts Road On schedule
 - Interstate 85 & SR 74 Interchange (Fulton County) Let and construction scheduled for FY 22; Proposed let date is at risk due to ROW funding
 - SR 92 at Flint River (Bridge Replacement Project) About to kick-off bridge design process; Construction is proposed for FY26
 - McDonough Road Bridge Replacement GDOT has sent a request to the State Office to review the weight restrictions for the bridge
 - Displaced Left Turn Project at SR 54/ Floy Farr Pkwy & SR 74/Joel Cowan Pkwy – Environmental documents are under review by Federal Highway Administration; Just began their final design task order
 - o Anticipated Schedule:
 - May/June 2021 Environmental Document Approval
 - June 2021 ROW Authorization (ROW Acquisition would take place June 2021 May 2022)
 - November 2021 Final Field Plan Review
 - March/April 2022 Completed Final Plans
 - May 2022 Advertise to Contractors
 - June 2022 Let to construction

ii. Q&A

Suggestions for making projects "shovel ready"

From Mr. Smith's understanding, a project is "shovel ready" when the ROW is certified and purchased, design is done, environmental studies are completed, permitting is in place, and the entire PDP process has been followed per GDOT's requirements. Essentially, the project is awaiting funding to go to construction.

- **Dip in the road on Hwy 74 at Rockaway Road** GDOT has not received any reports but will look into it.
- Citizen letter about SR 138 at Old Hwy 138 Mr. Smith confirmed that the portion of SR 138 that lies within Fayette County is in District 3's jurisdiction.

- Mr. Smith informed us that he will reach out to the District 7 Office since both offices had previous discussions about this portion of SR 138.
- **SR 54 at Carriage Ln** Mr. Smith stated that the Board of Education will need to receive a permit from District 3's Traffic Operations department, if they will need direct access onto 54.

7. Report of Committee Members

a. Brooks

Mr. Ungaro stated that there was a recent car accident where a speeding driver hit the railroad tracks and then crashed into a building.

- b. Fayette County
 - i. GDOT McDonough Road Bridge Detour Impact PI 0016579 Mr. Mallon presented GDOT's proposed detour map for the Committee's feedback. After review, it was determined that the County will request that the detour be routed along McDonough Road and SR 54 instead of McElroy. McDonough and SR 54 are more capable of handling the traffic volume and we already get complaints of cutthru traffic on McElroy.
 - ii. Reallocation of 2004 Transportation SPLOST Funds Veterans Pkwy (Antioch and Goza Roads)

Mr. Mallon stated that he will be asking for the BOC to consider reallocating funds from the Antioch/Goza Road intersection to the Veterans Pkwy project for the installation of a waterline between SR 54 and South Sandy Creek Road.

Committee Chair Ognio asked if transportation fund should be reallocated to water infrastructure. Mr. Mallon stated the funds are not allocated for specific purposes and the waterline would be very beneficial, and it would be entirely within the project's right-of-way.

iii. Citizen Letter – The Shenandoah Estates' HOA contacted Representative Bazemore and Commissioner Rousseau about their safety concerns with the intersection of Highway 138/Jonesboro Road and Old Highway 138. Three subdivision use a center turn lane to access Highway 138. Their problem is that the length of this lane between Old Hwy 138 and Embassy Trace is short and poses a serious road safety hazard, especially when drivers from both locations enter the lane at the same time.

c. Fayetteville

Mayor Johnson introduced the City of Fayetteville's new assistant director of Public Works, Cajen Rhodes. They are happy to have him on their team working alongside Chris Hindman.

- d. Peachtree City No report
- e. Tyrone –

The Palmetto Road project is set to go to design.

f. Woolsey

Mayor Laggis expressed that there is continued concern about the increase in truck traffic by the residents of Woolsey. He would like steps taken to move forward on a proposed truck route map for the County.

8. Public Comment - none

9. Unfinished Business

a. Committee Bylaws

Committee Chair Ognio addressed the amendments to the Committee's Bylaws per the redlined bylaws received for the BOC following the April 20th BOC meeting.

- Change the meeting time to 2:00 pm
- Remove the requirement for two commissioners to be appointed to the Committee by the Board.

He asked to Committee for their feedback on corrections that need to be made or changes that they would like to see. Since several members were unaware changes, the document will be sent for all to review and submit comments.

b. County Truck Routes

Mr. Merantus presented the truck traffic data, which was gained on Thursday, April 15th, 2021, for Hampton Road between SR 92 and Antioch Road, for the Committee's feedback.

Committee Chair Ognio expressed the need for the Committee to prioritize creating a county-wide truck route solution.

On April 15th, there was a little over 40 tractor trailers were counted to have traveled on Hampton Road. Mayor Laggis stated that 40 tractor trailers out of the road's 5,000 vehicles per day may seem like a small percentage but are noticed by the property owners.

He believes that the increase is due to large trucks not wanting to navigate the roundabout at Antioch Road. The trucks seems to be heading towards State Route 92 and the Atlanta Motor Speedway.

Committee Chair Ognio stated that the proposed truck route ordinance would need to have very specific language such as prohibited roads for trucks, no trucks vs. no thru trucks, and which roads will allow trucks for local service only. The only issue that is in question is the County's ability to enforce it. The Sheriff's Office does not have enough resources to assist in enforcing.

Peachtree City Council Member Terry Ernst said that in his experience as a police officer with Peachtree City, truck drivers are aware of which roads that they can travel on based on depth of the road. A few officers are also specially trained to look at the road and identify if it is suitable for tractor trailer travel.

Both Mayor Laggis and Committee Chair Ognio both suggested that once a truck route is approved, the County should contact mapping apps and systems to update their maps to reflect the route.

c. Crash Data

Mr. Merantus presented the crash data for the following three intersections of interest:

- i. Banks & Ellis Roads
 - 22 collisions between 1/01/17 4/12/21
 - 9 were not a collision with another motor vehicle, 8 angle collisions, 3 head on collisions, and 2 rear end collisions
 - 12,000 vehicles per day on Banks Road and 4,00 vehicles per day on Ellis Road
- ii. Hwy 85 Connector & State Route 85
 - 31 collisions between 1/01/17 4/12/21
 - 22 rear end collisions, 8 angle collisions, and 1 not a collision with a motor vehicle
 - 12,000 vehicles per day on SR 85 and 3,500 vehicles per day on Hwy 85 Connector
- iii. Morgan Mill Road & Hwy 85 Connector
 - 12 collisions between 1/01/17 4/12/21
 - 8 angle collisions, 2 not a collision with a motor vehicle, 1 right turn collisions, and 1 rear end collisions
 - 4,000 vehicles per day on Hwy 85 Connector

10. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 3:38 PM. Mayor Laggis made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Mr. Ungaro and it passed unanimously.










