



## SANDY CREEK ROAD

### **Summary of Comments**

The public meeting open house for the Sandy Creek Road corridor study was held on March 18, 2019 from 4 pm to 7 pm at the Fayette County Public Library. The presentation of information was in conjunction with the other three corridors also being studied by Fayette County. Approximately a total of 200 people attended. Citizens were afforded different opportunities to share their input. Close to 350 individual comments were received.


From the compilation of the citizen feedback, the five most identified concern categories are:


- 1. Roadway Improvements
- 2. Traffic Calming
- 3. Speeding & Congestion
- 4. Sight Distance & 18 Wheelers
- 5. Bike Ped Infrastructure

Some of the comments are listed below:

- 1. Straighten the intersection at Ellison and Sandy Creek Road
- 2. Signal at Sandy Creek Road and SR 74
- 3. Add turn lanes without widening Sandy Creek Road
- 4. 4 way stop at Lees Mill
- 5. To get traffic to studio off of Sandy Creek, develop a corridor from 185 down Veterans Parkway encouraging traffic away from residential areas






## What Are The Current Challenges Faced By The Corridor?
